Nominations opened for Borough Solicitor. Motion made by R. Todd to nominate J. Kilker Esq. Seconded by E. Labie. No other nominations. Vote called. Unanimous.

Nominations opened for Chiarman of the Vancancy Board. Motion made by M.B. Dlugherty to nominate T. Sachleben. Seconded by E. Labie. No other nominations. Vote called. Unanimous.

Nomination for <u>BANK DEPOSITORY</u>. Motion made by M.B. Dougherty to use the Pennsylvania Nation Bank - Girardville Branch. Seconded by J. Yackera No other motions. Vote called. Unanimous.

Nominations opened for NSLA Rep. J. Yackera nominated - turned down. C. Marquardt nominated. He said he would be Alternate. Motion made by M.B.Dougherty to nominate R. Krick. Seconded by J. Yackera. No other nominations. Vote Called. Unanimous.

Nominations for NSLA Rep. Alternate. Motion made by M.B. Dougherty to nominate C. Marquardt. Seconded by E. Labie. No other nominations. \mathbf{V} ote called. Unanimous.

Nominations for Health/Permit Officer. Motion made by M.B. Dougherty to nominate JoAnn Clayton. Seconded by R. Todd. No other nominations. Vote called. Unanimous.

Nominations opened for Sewage Enforcement Officer/ Engineer. Motion made by R. Todd to nominate Don Cuff/Entech Engineering. Seconded by M.B. Dougherty. No other nominations. Vote called. Unanimous.

Motion made by M.B. Dougherty to set council meetings for the Second Thursday of each month. Time change requested from 6:30 P.M. to 7:00 P.M. Seconded by J. Yackera. No other suggestions. Vote called. Unanimous.

QUESTION:

Handling the mail. Pres. R. Krick suggested getting a Post Office Box for all Borough mail to avoid the confusion of having mail delivered to several different people. Acess would be limited to several people. Mail could then be distributed atthe Borough Hall. Getting a locked box at the Bldg. was suggested. Inquires at the Post Office reveled it would have to be a Rural Route delivery at curbside leaving open the possibility of vandalism. The Postmaster suggested a P.O. Box would be the best alternative. This would allow the Secretary to pick-up the mail each day. At this time M.B. Dougherty brought up the subject of combining the Secretary and Treasurers positions into one. it a part-timeposition where the person holding the job would be in the borough bldg. about 20 Hours weekly to allow public access to conduct Borough business. Another advantage would be to free up more time for J. Hinkle as opposed to having to stay waiting for deliveries or calls. Pres. R. Krick called for a motion to secure a P.O. Box. A question was asked concerning price. Comments from the floor were that the proce was \$17.50 for six months. Discussion ensued over w size would be required. Motion made by J. Yackera to secure a Box. Discussion ensued over what Seconded by R. Todd. Votw called. Unanimous.

Request for a motion for an ordinance to combine the Secretary and Treasurers positions. Pres. R, Krick said the position would be advertised when a job description was worked up. Hiring a qualified person is important because Councilwants to look into purchasing a computersystem easing the paper work load on whomever was hired. J. Yackera asked if the Solicitor rendered an opinion. There were several minutes of discussion. Motion requested by R. Krick and objected to by C. Marquardt. The matter was tabled for future work session.

Question from floor concerning purchase of computer by D. Bittner of the Sewer Auth. It had been suggested they may be interested in sharing the cost and usage with the Borough. After several minutes of discussion the matter was tabled for future discussion which could include the Sewer Authority.

Motion made by M.B. Dougherty to set and advertise Work Sessions on the Second Tuesday and Council Meetings on the Second Thursday of each month. Seconded by J. Yackera. No other motions. Vote called. Unanimous.

Question from floor:

When would Christmas trees be picked up? R. Krick said that would be discussed with J. Hinckle and advertised.

J. Yackera brought up the need to fill a spot on the Municipal Board Motion made by M.B. Dougherty to advertise the opening. Seconded by R. Todd. Applications on file will be considered.

Regular meeting will be Thursday January 13, 1994. Pres. R. Krick suggested the floor be opened before and after meetings and before votes. There were no objections. Commitees will be set at the work session. C. Marquardt had keys returned to him.

Motion made by M.B. Dougherty to File paper work on low interest loan for possibility of purchasing a computer. Seconded by R. Todd. No other motions. Vote Called. Unanimous.

Motion to adjourn made by M.B. Dougherty. Seconded by J. Yakcers. Meeting adjourned by Pres. Krick.

OPEN MEETING:

President R. Krick called the meeting to order and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

BUSINESS

President R. Krick said the reason for the special meeting is to pass Resolution 94-1. The reason for the resolution is to verify for banking purposes the names of Council President, Vice-President, Secretary and Treasurer.

President Krick then read the resolution. (copy on file) After reading it he called for a motion to pass the resolution. Motion made by M.B. Dougherty to pass Resolution 94-1. Seconded by R. Todd. No Question. Vote called. Resolution carried.

President Krick then spoke about the next resolution concerning the Capital Project Loan Program. He said it is a 50% loan not 100% as previously believed. The Balance has to come from the Borough. The problem is a filing deadline of 1/15/94. The resolution needs to be passed before the regular meeting. We will have to discuss what we want to do because if cannot be passed without a dollar amount. Since all we have are estimatesit is not fair to ask someone to vote without knowing what they are voting on. We had thought about using this to purchase a computer at 0% interest. Computer systems have about a six year payback and even using the original bid the Borough's share will be app. \$4,000 which is up in the air because we have to talk to the Sewer Authority. If the Sewer Authority is willing to go in for half on the system then their share will cover us. All we will have to pay is the loan. R. Todd said he thought we should pass the resolution right now. Then get more bids in and if we have to call a Special Meeting to get it through to do that, Krick agreed saying he thought that was the way to go. E. Labie said the numbers we have are in line with other municipalities that are involved in doing this. Some of the things quoted may not be necessary so it could be less money. R. Krick asked if the bidder said that. E. Labie replied no but just from speaking to different people. Some of the things he offers very cheap like a figure \$2,000 for training, management and consulting for 40 hours. That is . \$50 per hour rate. Most training rates are about \$100 per hour. R. Krick then said since we are tolking in this area we should make the resolution for \$4,000 and if it changes it changes. This is a loan and there is no quarantee we will get it. There would be a better chance if it is a joint purchase with another entity as a shared piece of equipment. C. Marquardt asked if the resolution could be passed without advertising. M.B. Dougherty checked the Borough Code. Ordinances need to be advertised but not resolutions. Pres. Krick read the resolution. (copy on file) Motion made by R. Todd to pass Resolut in 94-2. Seconded by M.B. Dougherty. No Questions. Vote called. Resolution carried.

R Krick then told the audience there was to be a work meeting following and it is open to the public. He also said the Borough will purchase a computer with or without the Sewer Authority ut it makes more sense to purchase one instead of two. We will get quotes on a smaller system in case the Sewer Authority is not interested. This in response to a question from the floor.

No other business.

Motion to adjourn by M.B. Dougherty. Seconded by C. Marguardt.

Motion to bond treasurer made by R. todd. Seconded by E. Labie. Question? Vote called. Unanimous. Motion passed.

Recycling Report

C. Marquardt reported he recieved Grant forms from DER and the County to fill out. Money back for our efforts is app. \$400-500 from the county and more from DER. Mr. Tracy Snyder from Pittman will take our newspaper. He will pay transfer costs. We will work with him.

The dates for February recycling have to be set up. Any changes can be discussed at next months meeting.

Now Pusiness

President R. Krick called for a motion to combine the Secretary and Treasurer Positions. The solicitor need authorization to draw up the ordinance. A question was concerning the pay schedule. It was decided that if it were to be hourly or a flat rate would be negotiable and would have to be decided after the change was made. J. Kilker, solicitor, drew up a proposed ordinance which makes it Nonmandatory and it could be changed if it did not work out. R. Krick asked if at reorganization majority council could split the position if decided. Motion to empower the solicitor to draw up the ordinance made by E. Labie. Seconded by R. Todd. Question? Solicitor suggested adding "at any other time as majority council sees fit." R. Krick opened the floor for comments. No comments or questions. Vote called. Unanimous. Motion passed.

Application for a Tax Anticipation Note needs to be approved. There will be no additional tax revenue until mid March. C. Marquardt said the Girard Towers deal for \$10,000 papers were signed but who knows when the money will come in. R. Krick noted that those monies were already figured into the budget. We will need \$20,000 to make payroll and pay bills. I prefer to pay bills and not leave anyone hanging. Krick asked who to empower to negotiate this. M.B. Dougherty asked if sealed bids could be solicited. Krick said the banks would give figures over the phone. Motion called for the Treasurer to call (3) Three banks to get rates on a \$20,000/6 month note. The numbers can be submitted at the next meeting. Motion made by J. Yackera. Seconded by R. Todd. Question? J. Kilker said Council should review the note at the next meeting. Vote Called. Unanimous. Motion carried.

Discuss these with the Mayor and Solicitor. C. Marquardt asked if a minority should serve with a majority on the committees? The Solicitor stated there is no law it is just a matter of common practice when practical.

The solicitor also noted there are DCA manuals available and he will provide a list of addresses and publications to anyone who is interested. M.B. Dougherty asked if everyone has a copy of the Borough Code? The Solicitor will request copies for all new council members.

COPRESPONDENCE

R.Krick read letter on the Second Street Project. It was inspected and there are still some complaints on water.

Letter from Entech/Don Cuff on the Sewer Project. If there is an agreement between Gilberton Borough and Girardville Borough. The revision information must be supplied to FmHA. An implimintation schedule and how it will be handled nust be discussed. Facilities operations June '95. An inter-municipal agreement must be reached if they are going to join in on the project.

letter from AT&T to monitor telephone usage and forward information on possible services. Turned down.

Letter from Schuylkill County Demolition Program. Borough must send a letter accepting bid of \$1312.50 as our cost. Marquardt reported the building is owned by the county and it fell in on the Devaney property. Joe Wayne contacted the county and it was deemed a diaster. The Bids were solicited and this is the result. J. Yackera suggested stipulating a completion date. C. Marquardt said to stipulate and R. Krick suggested 60 days completion. Motion to send a letter of intent made by J. Salukas. Seconded by C. Marquardt. Question? Krick asked when this came up? C. Marquardt said this came up the end of December. It is not a budgeted item. Vote called. Unanimous. motion Passes.

Handicap space request. Decided to allow the Street Cmte. to han dle this. They are to come up with guide lines and bring it up before council by the next meeting.

R. Krick noted that he sent out loan application for the Computer system. We will wait to have results.

Pecieved copies of the Police Pension Fund. There will be a copy on file in the Borough Hall available for review.

The secretary is to send a letter to Mr. George Canavan requesting the return of Borough equipment, specifically an answering machine and scanner. Motion made by P. Todd. Seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? Vote called. Unanimous. Motion passes. NOTE: Send copy to solicitor it wil be handled through his office if there is no response in two weeks time.

Sewer Authority Appointment.

R. Krick asked if everyone feels ready to act on the appointment now or wants to wait. We recieved one additional resume from Mr. T. Dougherty. Floor opened for nominations. R. Todd nominated Vince Gomosky. Seconded by E. Labie. Question? No other nominations. Roll call vote. R. Todd-Yes, E. Labie - Yes, J. Yackera - NO, C. Marguardt - No, J. Salukas - Yes, R. Krick - Yes, M.B. Dougherty - Yes. Memination carried 5 - 2 in favor. R. Krick told secretary to send a letter to Mr. Gomosky to inform him of his appointment and of the meeting scheluded for January 18, 1994.

Question raised on the ordance to set pay of \$50 monthly for Sewer Authority. The solicitor said to deal with it now would be improper. It would have to be advertised. Discussion ensued over the merits and drawbacks of the ordinance. Input from both Council and public. It was decided this is a dead issue.

P. Krick noted the Borough Hall is open during the day from 9 A.M. - 2 P.M. if anyone wants to examine the plans for the sewer pipes before the meeting.

Question from the floor: Has a Borough Police officer been brought up on charges as rumored? R. Krick informed her that as of now the answer is no. No discussion on this subject until there are charges and or an investigation. This would be an Exeuctive matter.

There will be recycling and pickup of Christmas trees as the weather permits.

Ed Labie wanted it noted that the Borough workers are taking a lot of heat concerning snow removal. Last 10 days have seen 4 snow storms. Not to critise because they are doing the best they can.

P. Krick said we are taking a conservative approach because of Liquid Fuels allocations. Liquid Fuels are for: Street Lights at \$1800 per month, Ogden St. Bridge Project at \$12,000 atleast. We paid \$4,000 to Entech, a total bill of \$90,000 we cwe still a minimum of \$11,000. Last years snow was at the end of the season. We still have a long way to go and only so much money to spend.

Council was informed an Executive Session would be held after this meeting.

Motion was made by J. Yackera to adjourn. Seconded by C. Marquardt. Meeting was adjourned by President R. Krick

The fire company is also interested in holding the State Convention in 1995. Sharp asked if Council would offer approval and support. This would involve use of facilities and police protection. Committees with members of both Council and the Fire Company would be set up to work out the details. There is a need to get the whole town behind this to make it a success. Girardville last hosted the Convention in 1968.

A motion was made to approve the blocking of Oak St. For June 3,4,5 by Mary Beth Dougherty and seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote called. Unanimous. Motion carried.

President Krick asked M. Sharp to keep Council appraised of the progress involving the hosting of Convention and dates. Keeping the lines of communication open is important. The Borough offers any help it can give.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

POLCIE REPORT

The Police report was read by Mayor Ketusky (copy on file). Motion to accept as read by C. Marquardt seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote called. Unanimous. Motion carried. Report accepted.

Mayor Ketusky then stated Officer B. Russell had requested a meeting with the

Mayor Ketusky then stated Officer B. Russell had requested a meeting with the Police Committee. Ketusky thought it necessary that the three (3) officers involved should be there and asked a meeting be scheduled that would include everyone.

HEALTH OFFICE REPORT

Health officer not present. R. Krick read the report. Motion to accept as read made by E. Labie seconded by R. Todd. Question? None. Vote called. Unanimous. Motion carried. Report accepted.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasures's report read by R. Krick (copy on file). Motion to accept as read by M.B. Dougherty seconded by J. Salukas. Question?

There were some questions concerning monies for which Council has no information. e.g. An account in the Citizens Bank for the Community Block Grant Program. There was money that had to be sent back because it was never used. The account has a balance of \$1500.00 which according to a letter received is to be used to audit and close out the account. R. Krick said Council needs to discuss this with the solicitor and has to get more information on this and other activities.

Vote called. Unanimous. Motion carried. Report accepted.

RECYCLING REPORT

C. Marquardt gave his recycling report and stated he completed and sent in the paperwork on two (2) Grant applications. One is from the County and the other from D.E.R. A copy of this report is on file.

There was a question about bins. Marquardt said the monies were frozen last October when the Borough had submitted it's application and were again becoming available. We should hear from them.

Recycling pickups were cancelled for February due to weather conditions. People should watch the paper for a schedule for March.

Christmas trees are being picked up as they thaw out. Most trees are stuck in the snow banks. It was asked that people bear with this due to circumstances.

Motion to accept the Recycling report made by R. Todd seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote called. Unanimous. Report accepted.

Question from the floor concerning snow covered sidewalks. It was asked what could be done about people who own property but don't live there or in the borough. E. Labie stated most towns have a 24" path requirement and council is checking to see if Girardville has a sidewalk snow removal ordinance.

TAX COLLECTORS REPORT

R. Krick said the report is in hand but Council did not have chance to go over it. He asked if holding off on approval was a problem. E. Dougherty, Tax collector, said the Borough could forward the information when ready. The per capita list went from 1210 names to 1185 names. E. Dougherty asked if anyone is aware of anyone moved into the Borough and wants to check if their name is on the list to please call her. It is important to collect all taxes the Borough is entitled to. R. Krick asked about the Assessor and if he is doing his job. E. Dougherty stated she has a meeting scheduled with him at the end of June. Krick then requested a letter be sent to the Assessor requesting a meeting with the Finance Committee within the next couple of weeks. Approval of Tax Collector's report tabled until next meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

The solicitor asked if Council was going to go ahead with the tax anticipation note? He had a resolution made up that needs to be filled in with the amount/length and rate of the loan. There are three (3) banks interested in providing loan services. A request for a motion was made to pass the resolution for a \$20,000.00/6 month tax anticipation loan from the institution that



Motion to pass said resolution made by M.B. Dougherty seconded by R. Todd. Question? None. Vote called. Unanimous. Resolution passed.

M.B. Dougherty brought up the need for an audit of Borough books. It was decided to advertise for bids for a full and complete audit of all Borough funds for the year 1993. It will cost more than the general audit usually done but Council feels it is necessary. If an audit turns up any problem then looking into previous years could be considered.

Motion was made to advertise for bids for audit to be sent to the Borough Secretary. Decision on bids to be made next meeting. Motion made by M.B. Dougherty seconded E. Labie. Question? None. Vote called. Unanimious. Motion carried.

CORRESPONDENCE

- C. Marquardt said he recieved a letter from Kreitzer Sanitation explaining the lack of trash pickup on Upper & Lower Railroad Sts. and Preston Ave. This was due to icy conditions. Letter is on file.
- C. Marquardt had a letter from D.C.A. The grant application for fencing for the playgrounds was turned down.

A letter for a Handicap parking space for Bernice Stanton arrived.

Motion made by R. Todd to give the space seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question?

The solicitor suggested making the granting of the space subject to on going ordinance review. This allows the Streets Committee to draw up guidelines and allows the Borough to change existing parking privileges.

M.B. Dougherty questioned who has the responsibility of putting up signs and painting the road. C. Marquardt said the Borough had done this because it is our property. Unless this is changed if you do it for one you must do it for all Vote called. Unanimious. Motion carried.

Mail concerning the Summer Lunch Program has begun to arrive. To date no paper work has been turned in. A request was made to the person responsible to comply. We received a check which will not be deposited until council is appraised of what is going on in this program. No one seems to know if this was a contract - if there were bids or any other information. R. Krick added he is going to call Harrisburg to see what he can find out.

A check arrived from FEMA for snow costs for the Blizzard of '93 in the amount of \$6293.00 to be deposited in the Motor Fund Account.

The 1994 CDBG applications are available. There will be a special work session on Tuesday, February 15 at 7:00 P.M. to discuss possible projects and to fill out the applications. Anyone interested is invited to attend. Motion to advertise the meeting made by M.B. Dougherty seconded by R. Todd. Question? Vote called. Unanimious. Motion Carried.

Letter from BC/BS. Pamphlets and flyers explaning the State's Health Plan for low-income childern are available for distribution. It was decided to order and place them in the gym and Borough Hall.

A notice was received from BC/BS stating any claims that had been rejected were to be refiled. There are no outstanding claims from the Borough.

ACT 205 Police Pension Plan reports to be filed. This needs to be sent to the bank acting as trustee to file and pay the costs. We have one (1) retired officer collecting under the plan.

The solocitor received a letter from Mrs. Conway on West Main Street concerning the neighbors shimney dispute. According to E. Labie this will be resolved. Kilker had no other details at this time.

BILLS

The list of regular monthly bills to be paid and others submitted for the month was read by R. Krick. Motion made to pay the bills by J. Salukas seconded by R. Todd. Question?

R. Todd questioned bill from Paul's. one is for a new dash flasher and the second was for repair on the old flasher. There was also a question on the bill for a book purchased by the Police Dept last year. The book was returned but the company sent if back. This bill was pulled pending further investigation. Vote called. Unanimious. Motion to pay bills carried.

ENTECH

Ogden st. bridge engineering is 25% complete. The borough's part of the bill is app. \$4200.00 which will come out of the Motor Fund (liquid fuels) This bill needs to be paid because Entech has not received any payment and work is stopped. If the bill is paid engineering can be done in the spring and get on the bridge list for the next fiscal year. Motion to pay this bill made by E. Labie seconded by R. Todd. Question? The solicitor asked if everyone was satisfied. Vote called. Unanimious. Motion carried.

Ouestion from the floor:

Frank Smith asked did Entech stop all work? R. Krick explained that all engineering work on the bridge had stopped due to non-payment. We also have outstanding General Engineering invoices and have worked out a payment schedule of \$650.00 per month. Included in this are monies that the borough will get back from the Sewer Authority.

LEGAL

Questions were directed to the Solicitor concerning the ordinance to combine th Secretary and Treasurer positions. In an oversight Mr. Kilker did not get the ordinance published and asked if things could stay as they are until the March meeting. It was agreed to leave things as they are for now. The letter to the former Mayor asking for the return of Borough property received no answer. This matter has been turned over to the solicitor to handle. A motion was made by M.B. Dougherty to send a letter to former Borough employees and office holders to request the return of any Borough records still in their possession within two (2) weeks time. Seconded by R. Todd. Question?

J. Yackers noted this request had been advertised in December 1993. Council agreed this was done but there are stillthings unaccounted for. Vote called. Unanimious. Motion carried.

The solicitor suggested the same letter be sent to all concerned explaining that anyone still holding paperwork on a on going program could incur liability and that it is necessary to send any explaination needed to continue the program.

SCHOOL BUILDING

President Krick said he wanted the solicitor to be aware that the North Schuylkill school district has removed a range hood from the "A" St. School building. This was after the transfer to the Borough was complete. Council wants the solicitor to look into getting it back with whatever means are at our disposal. There is the possibility of tresspass. C. Marquardt stated the

School District requested access to get the numbers off the tank. J. Hinkle let them into the building and left to take care of other business. The range hood must have been removed at this time.

Ownership of the scoreboard that was in the gym was also questioned by several people. It was removed before the building became borough property but some people believe it was purchased by Mr. Travis given to the school for the use of the children of Girardville or purchased by the Girardville P.T.A. There are no records of proof of purchase or ownership available. Before this can be pursued this proof is needed.

B. Marquardt asked if the Commercial refrigerator that is in the building is in working order and available for sale. The solicitor said that it would have to be appraised because anything valued at more than \$200.00 must be put up to bid. R Krick then said any monies raised from the sale of property from the school building would go into the School Fund to help keep the gym open. J. Salukas asked if snow on the roof was a safety problem? R. Krick said people had been on the roof and the only problem is ice covered drains and those had been cleared. J. Yackera explained a contractor has been contacted for bids on a new roof. B. Marquardt noted that the floor should be cleaned. R. Krick said no at this time as the gym is being used. It was suggested that a price be investigated to hire a professional to do it initally making it easier to maintain. There was a debate over the gym being an asset or a liability and the possibility of splitting the deed to sell the building or sell the whole thing. There is no current offer on the table and the borough has a grant to be spent to renovate the roof, heating system, handicap access and bathroom facilities. E. Labie said we are seeking estimates from contractors to check what the oney willcover. It was asked if the renovations would be done with or without an offer to buy the building? R. Krick said the work will be done. The School Cmte will investigate all possibilities concerning the bldg.

C. Marquardt noted the demolition on 311 "A" St. has been started. That led to a debate as to how this demolition was arranged so quickly when other properties have been problems for years and nothing gets done. The answer was that this property in county owned and the county decided it was a hazard. Other properties are still privately owned and as long as the taxes are being paid it involves legal action.

Motion to adjourn the meeting made by R. Todd seconded by M.B. Dougherty. President adjourned the meeting at 9:00 P.M.

CALL MEETING TO ORDER

President R. Krick called the meeting to order and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Council members in attendance: E. Labie, R. Krick, C. Marquardt, J. Salukas, R. Todd, J. Yackera. M.B. Dougherty Absent. (Trip to D.C.) Solicitor: Present.

MEETING OPENED FOR PUBLIC COMMENTS

The first question from the floor was why M&M Contracting was not considered for snow removal. R. Krick explained that initially we needed two (2) machines and in the second storm two (2) machines were needed again and that is what was used. The borough cannot be expected to call every person living in the town to ask for use of trucks for snow removal. Request was made for two (2) trucks. Lally was called because he has two (2) trucks. E. Labie suggested that M&M send a letter stating what the trucks are available for, times and rates. This council had very little time to make decisions as to snow removal. Better plans can be formulated for next season. It was asked why does the Borough forget about East Main Street when it comes to snow removal? E. Burns answered from the floor that if the cars are moved the snow is removed. R. Krick said he told the snow removal crews to move the most snow they could in the least amount of time. B. Marquardt wanted to know why some cars were towed and other were not? Again E. Burns asked to answer. He said the cars have to be moved if they are sticking out. If the machines can get around the car then no one asks for it to be towed. J. Yackera asked who is paying the towing bills. R. Krick stated not the Borough. J. Yackera again asked if it is legal to bill residents for towed vehicles? You aren't in a snow emergency or do we have an ordinance in place? R. Krick told Yackera we were under a snow emergency. It was declared by the Mayor as is proper. Mayor Ketucky said the only person who cna have cars towed is the officer on duty. If he is called away then cars cannot be towed. Officer O'Donnell said if one car on a block is towed all are towed. E. Labie then brought up the subject of Snow Emergency Routes. This will be discussed later in the meeting. J. Salukas injected this could not possibly be settled tonight. This council has to sit down and work out rules for snow emergencies. R. Todd wanted it on the record that we would be stuck if it weren't for the Burns brothers. Also asked to be put on the record is the fact that M&M Contracting has a triaxle and a backhoe available. R. FLOOR OPENED FOR PUBLIC COMMENTS

V. Bernotas wanted to make sure Council was aware of the flooding problems on N. 2nd Street. The people involved have tried to get a meeting with D.E.R. to no avail. Council was aware of the problem and C. Marquardt has the names of the people to contact. If D.E.R. does not answer their last request for a meeting Council will send a letter on the people's behalf.

K. Malloy wanted to thank Council and the Police Dept. for all their cooperation with the Doodah parade. She asked if it could be an annual event. R. Krick told her to apply each year.

S. Chuba from Butler Twp. asked if there had been any decision on the Rapp Road. R. Krick told him that the matter was to be taken care of tonight.

J. Catizone asked about fencing the playgrounds. M.B. Dougherty told him it had been looked into previously but was too expensive. Grants had been applied for but were turned down. Catizone was concerned because cars were just pulling into the playground without concern for children playing there. The cost of the fencing would be about \$16,000. Mayor Ketusky is looking into getting funds from D.E.R. He requested the footage information be given to him. J.Salukas suggested placing tlelphone poles to stop the cars. R. Krick will check into that possibility. If anyone has information on a better price they are asked to let Council know.

Snow removal was brought up again. There were complaints about fines, towing charges and lack of actual plowing. R. Krick, after several minutes of discussion informed the public that Council is working on a snow policy. They hope to have answers to these and other questions before the next snow season.

No further comments.

R. Krick then introduced Mr. Mickelonis from Pa DOT. He is here to go over the details of both the construction dates and detour route pertaining to the E. Main St. Bridge Project.

Mr. Mickelonis told everyone that the bridge will be a one (1) span bridge of 80 feet. The actual bridge will be two (2) twelve (12) foot lanes with six (6) foot shoulders when completed. be simialr to the existing bridge but will not have sidewalks.

Also, as part of the project, some of the rock cut on the East side will be removed and the approach from Mahanoy Ave. will be brought level with the Main Street. This will greatly improve visibility in both directions. Actual work is scheduled to begin on July 5, 1994 and proceed through December 16, 1994. During this time a detour will be in effect. Traffic will go across Mahanoy Ave. to route 54 out through Homesville. The project will be done in two phases. The bridge will be constructed and hopefully the road open to traffic by December 16th. PA DOT will come back in March of 1995 and under traffic with no detour the road work will be finished and part of the rock face will be removed and that will take approximately from March into June. J. Salukas questioned the visability toward the west. Mr. Mickalonis explained the wall will be lower than the one currently standing. Visability will be improved. It will be better but it cannot be guaranteed to be perfect. The price of construction was asked and estimated at .\$lmillion dollars. Council will be notified when the detour is to take effect. Fire Companies and Ambulance Service will need to be notified as well. Parking on East Mahanoy Avenue needs to be addressed. J. Catizone asked if anything could be done about the shoulder dropoffs on West Mahanoy Avenue. Several cars have been hit and more traffic will only make the problem worse. The maintenance office in Schuylkill Haven should be contacted. The Borough should request help with this problem.

Second Street is not officially part of the detour. C. Marquardt asked about speed posting on the detour. The construction area will be reduced but Mahanoy Avenue will stay at 35 M.P.H. Mr. Mickalonis will see about getting a copy of the map for the Borough Hall. Dougherty said balancing the budget is the only problem. R. Todd asked what happened to the tax note we were supposed to get. R. Krick told hom taxes started to come in so it was dropped. The motion was amended to include the 1/9th payment to Entech and table Dietrick. Motion made again by R. Todd seconded by J. Salukas. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

We received a check for \$14,788.17 as 80% on an invoice for the



Letter from D.E.R. about the tank at the A Street School Building. We do not have to meet guidelines until 1998. Letter from Toole and Brezenick addressed to J. Wayne. Bills never submitted. R. Krick read the letter. J. Salukas asked for the dates of the bills. They are from 1989 thru 1992. Motion to give these to the Solicitor to review made by C. Marquardt seconded by MB. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. Letter from Entech. They completed the forms D.E.R. returned to them as incomplete. Enclosed were copies of the completed forms. Letter from STS asking for input from the public comcerning bus There is to be a public meeting on April 29th. Letter from County stating that reassessment of the County is under way. Each Borough will be notified before it begins locally. Letter from Schuylkill County Council of the Arts. The Recreation committee has to approve the shows they want performed this summer. Letter from DeAngelo Brothers about street sweeping. M.B. Dougherty asked for public input. C. Marquardt said it was suggested that people sweep in front of their homes and the Borough would pick up the dirt. J. Salukas said the last time there were numerous complaints of dust and dirt left behind. Krick and Dougherty were concerned about funds because it comes out of liquid fuels. Street committee will have to reach a decision in this matter. The April edition of "Pennsylvanian" had a question about advertising committee meetings. These meetings should be advertised. Even with only three (3) members a quorum is two (2). It was previously thought because it was not a quorum of council these meetings could be private. This needs to be investigated further as to the type of ads necessary. These meetings have to be opened to the public.

SUMMER LUNCH PROGRAM

- R. Krick said he spoke to Mr. Masey last Thursday. He wants to do a review so it can go to the Federal level and maybe get reimbursed. We still need to get some paperwork back from last year. Without the necessary paperwork there will be no review. If there is no review there can be no Federal investigation. There is no guarantee of getting the money. Council and Mr. Gill must decide the status of his payment. The bill owed is about \$7000.00. It was asked from the floor if Mr. Gill had inquired about the late payment. R. Krick said he has no idea what happened last year. He only became aware of this when Mary Oliveri contacted Mr. Gill in January about any outstanding bills. Mr. Masey said he knew where were problems but could get no response.
- E. Labie siad the forms from PEMA for snow removal reimbursement are in and being worked on. Pictures of the snow are needed if anyone has any please drop them off at Borough Hall. These have to be filed by May 9th.
- C. Marquardt asked if the gates could be opened to allow the kids to play hockey in the school lot. R. Krick said he didn't think it was a problem for now. When cars are being parked there then they cannot play there. C. Marquardt said he would open and lock the gates. Marquardt was also approached by the Little League about sand. Council always sand and they will need it by April 23rd. They need permission to go and order. Krick asked about the cost. Marquardt told him about \$160. Motion made to authorize the Little League to order the sand and bill the Borough made by C. Marquardt

seconded by C. Marquardt. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Marquardt was also in contact with Warrior Run Development Corp. There was a conflict with the attorneys. He got back to them today and our check will be here within 30 days for the lot lease for \$10,000. They will be attending the Sewer Authority meeting to get the start dates. Their project will finish when the sewer project is completed.

He was also approached about the trailer in the school yard. There is a person interested in purchasing it. The question is to turn it over to the solicior to find out if we can just sell it or if it has to be bid. M.B. Dougherty asked if there was a problem because she thinks it was purchased with grant money. Both R. Krick and C. Marquardt said that they did not think it was purchased with grant money. R. Krick said it would be turned over to the solicitor to see what he wants to do. We should have an answer by next meeting.

Rules and regulations for the Police Dept. were brought up. Marquardt asked if as soon as they were completed by J. Yackera they could be given to the solicitor for review. Debate insued over if these rules could be drawn up without the Mayor's input. were questions over bi-weekly hours and lack of input from the Officers themselves. These questions need to be addressed by the solicitor. This matter was tabled pending the solicitor's opinion. From the floor V. Bernotas stated he thought the Borough should have a full time Police Chief. He said to let them have benifits and insurance. He believed most taxpayers would agree with him. There was a question of paperwork review brought up. The Mayor should not review any paperwork. Officer O'Donnell informed Council the Mayor was aware of the fact his paperwork from the drug arrest was going to be done the next day. The Mayor gave his permission for At no time has the Mayor asked to review any Police Officer's paperwork. Council will require an opinion from DCA, in writing, stating who is in charge. If the Mayor has a problem with this opinion he cancome before Council and tell them he is going to another lawyer and Council must pay for it.

R. Krick asked if Council would forgo pay atleast for this quarter and maybe next quarter. J. Salukas stated Council pay could not be changed until next December. M.B. Dougherty asked the solicitor if members could simply not take a salary or if a check must be accepted and turned back to the Borough. She is waiting for an answer. Motion to hold the checks for Council and The Mayor until the third quarter made by M.B. Dougherty seconded by E. Labie. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

M.B. Dougherty read from the Borough Code that pay can be changed by ordinance at any time. Your budget must then be amended within 30 days

Council could hold a special meeting to hire a Secretary/Treasurer and accept her resignation at that time. M. Oliveri agreed to this provided it is done in a reasonable amount of time. M.B. Dougherty asked if two weeks was reasonable. E. Labie made a motion to set interviews based on the applications already in. Seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

D. Heiser asked why the Liquid Fuels balances are not given. He was tole that is the Morot Fund Account

Question to reimburse Officer Hummel his expense for qualifying for VASCAR is tabled until a written Police Dept. policy is in place. Mayor Ketusky requested the purchase of PA Law Updates for the Police Dept. They are a necessary expenditure. Motion made by C. Marquardt and seconded by J. Salukas to allow the purchase. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

No further business.

The meeting was opened at 7:00 pm by President R. Krick with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Council members present: M.B. Dougherty, R. Krick, E. Labie, C. Marquardt, J. Salukas, R. Todd, and J. Yackera. Solicitor: Present.

OPEN FLOOR TO PUBLIC COMMENT

There were several complaints brought forward about difficulties with the Borough Police Dept. President Krick suggested the people deal directly with Mayor Ketusky or any members of the Police Cmte. to discuss specifics. There was a complaint stating there was no action taken on a call about high grass and weeds. Officer O'Donnell stated that he spoke directly to the party involved. The next step would be a letter giving him so many days to get the property cleaned up. When that time period has elasped then you can start issuing citations. M.B. Dougherty asked if that is the law. Officer O'Donnell answered that is according to Borough Ordinance. The complaints did not only concern weeds but other things as well. Complaints about other problems were just made today, May 12th, to Officer O'Donnell, The Mayor and the Health Officer. Two weeks ago she said she complained to the persons mother. R. Krick told her to make future complaints directly to Borough Officials. J. Clayton, Health officer, said she cannot do anything until directly notified. The procedure will be if within five (5) days from today nothing is done he will receive a Certified letter. After fifteen (15) days if nothing is done he can be cited. J. Salukas suggested doing any complaints in writing.

J. Clayton asked it be noted that when she receives a complaint she will act on it. Nothing can be done until she is aware of the problem. Clayton then asked if the weeds were not taken care of would the Borough do it. R. Krick said there was talk of the Borough doing it and getting reimbursed. R. Todd added the property owner would have to pay. Question was raised about grass at the Ello property. J. Yackera said J. Hinkle told him it was cut and everything was to be logged. The Solicitor added about the violations being discussed it depends on which ordinances are violated. It could also be state law or even nusiances. Hew you procede depends exactly on which ordinance or statute you are citing. The Solicitor suggested a Public Notice saying to the effect: Clean up or hear from us. It was asked if there would be a Clean-up Week. The answer was no.

It was asked if the Borough would spray for bees? C. Marquardt stated we used to put out poison but it killed everything and this is no longer permitted. No further comments.



MINUTES: Council received copies of the minutes of the previous meeting. Motion to accept the minutes as presented made by M.B. Dougherty seconded by J. Yackera. Ouestion? None. Vote. All. Minutes accepted. (copy on file)

TREAUSRER"s REPORT

Motion to accept this report as presented made by C. Marquardt seconded by R. Todd. R. Krick had a comment on Liquid fuels money. Checking documents the contract for the Ogden St. bridge, he assumed the Borough's liability was 20% of the engineering which worked out to \$18,000. \$15,000 was to be reimubrsed once \$15,000 had been spent. The contract entered into by this Borough was for \$22,000 not \$18,000 for easements and a few other things so rather than \$3,000 we will have \$7,000 tied into this project.

J. Yackera questioned the bill for the ammo. He wanted to know if this were bid or did we just buy this. R. Krick told him those were the numbers put before us last meeting. For next time it would be a good idea to check prices. Vote. All. Report accepted. (copy on file)

MAYOR'S REPORT

Read by Mayor Ketusky. Motion to accept M.B. Doughertyseconded by J. Salukas. Question? J. Yackera questioned the difference in the mileage on the two Police vehicles. He suggested the Mayor balance out the use of the two cars. C. Marquardt said the total mileage is supposed to be on the report for recording in the minutes. There are times when the Plymouth won't start. The Officers try to use the white car 3 days a week and the unmarked car 4 days. There was a debate overthe use of the police car by an officer to attend school that the Borough did not pay for. J. Yackera wanted to know why the Mayor allowed this use. The procedure has always been that it is the Mayor's right to authorize use of the Police vehicles. You cannot come in and just verbally change rules without a written policy. Debate then insued over whether or not the Borough is responsible to pay for Certification of the Police Officers. J. Yackera said the Borough is not responsible to pay for schooling, certification or ammo. R. Krick stated it has been policy to qualify the officers. If you want policy changes bring them to the floor. Officer O'Donnell told Council that because of attending this school he is a Certified Fire Instructor. He would be willing to put it into writting that hewill not charge the Borough to certify our officers. J. Clayton wanted it recorded that Officer O'Donnell is a competent officer and the Borough cannot afford to lose him. No further debate on this matter. Continue motion to accept Mayor's report. Vote. All. Report accepted.

HEALTH/PERMIT OFFICER'S REPORT

Read by R. Krick. Motion made to accept by E. Labie seconded by MB Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Report accepted. (copy on file)

TAX COLLECTOR REPORT

Read by R. Krick. Motion to accept made by J. Yackera seconded by R. Todd. Question? None. Vote. All. Report accepted. (copy on file)

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Audit. In order to receive our liquid fuel allocation we need an audit. We talked about a single source audit which would take to long. A review would satisfy Harrisburg. D. Mensch from Ashland gave a quote for \$550 for a review. It would take about two (2) weeks then needs to be submitted to Harrisburg. Motion to obtain a review made by M.B. Doughertyseconded by E. Labie.

Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. Secretary is to Call and make

In the matter of the bills received form Toole and Breznick it is the Solicitor's opinion that these bills must be paid. He needs to check further to make sure there is no controversy between the two firms over this. The Solicitor went on to say he didn't think they were over charged and that the firm is in no hurry for the funds. R. Todd asked why they took so long to bill? R. Krick read the attached letter which stated it was an oversight. M.B. Dougherty questioned documentation on these matters. R. Krick said this needed to be looked into. This matter was tabled until next meeting.

Summer Lunch. As of Tuesday we have all the documentation needed for a review by the State. We will have to wait and see if we will be reimbursed the \$7,000 we owe Mr. Gill. Mr. Gill is willing to supply lunches so that we will have a lunch program this summer. The Borough is financially responsible for this program. Letters to this effect have to be written. Mrs. Flannery was hired to be the co-ordinator. Motion to file application for this year made by J. Yackera seconded by C. Marquardt. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Action is to be taken to hire someone to fill the combined position of Secretary/ Treasurer. M.B. Dougherty gave the following specifics. The salary would be \$500 per month with Blue Cross if the person hired wants it. Hours would be about 20 Hours weekly in the Municipal bldg. Three people were interviewed for the position. Although the interview process was open to all of Council the only ones attending were R. Krick, M.B. Dougherty and E. Labie. R. Krick then opened the floor to nominations. C. Marquardt nominated Mary Alice (Richards) Smith. E. Labie nominated Mary Ambrose. There were no further nominations. Roll call vote followed.

Mary Ambrose hired to fill position of Secretary/Treasurer.

RECYCLING

R. Krick asked C. Marquardt if he spoke to anyone about the bills for the dumpsters. Marquardt said he spoke to Alan Deitrick about this. A salesman was to call but there has been no action. We received bills with charges for use of the dumpsters and hauling fees. R. Krick questioned when okaying the bills to pay only the hauling fees. Marquardt said to pay the hauling fee and leave the container fee because they are trying to get back to him about that.

R. Krick then asked for a motion to accept the resignation of Mary Oliveri as Treasurer. Motion made by M.B. Dougherty seconded by E. Labie. M.B. Dougherty thanked Mary for all her help and making sense out of a lot of things. R. Krick seconded that and also mentioned Mary worked for nothing. Vote was called. All in favor. Motion carried.

It was requested that Council send a letter to the Jiffy Mart stating who is authorized to sign for purchases for the Borough. The following were okayed: Mayor Ed Ketusky, John Hinkle and Dean Hess. It was also requested, to avoid confusion, that the Jiffy Mart be allowed to hold all the bills and send them in on a monthly basis. Council agreed this is a good idea. The purchase of film for the Police Dept. was questioned. It was suggested to check around about film prices and maybe stocking up instead of buying just one or two rolls at a time.

The trailer in the schoolyard must be put out to bid. Motion to get specs and advertise the trailer made by C. Marquardt seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Note: Ad to give bid dates and bids will be opened at the next Council meeting.

There is a problem on E. Mahanoy Ave. with sewage. R. Krick spoke to the property owner. It the Borough digs and it is our problem then we will pay but if it turns out to be the property owners problem he will have to pay incurred expenses. R. Krick asked if anyone agreed that this should be Borough policy? C. Marquardt made a motion that this would be policy. It is to be a matter of public record if you have a sewer problem and there is a question of it being the property owner or the Borough's problem then do not dig first and then submit the bill to the Borough. There are alternatives available to be tried first. Contact the Borough, if it is necessary to dig and the problem is the property owners then the property owner will be responsible for all costs incurred with the exception of Borough worker's wages. Motion seconded by R. Todd. Ouestion? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

There has been a request for a street light on the corner of Main and Julia Sts. It is dark and a woman was hit while crossing the street. C. Marquardt asked if a survey could be done. R. Krick asked the Officers when out on patrol to make note of places where street lights might be needed. E. Labie said the Street Cmte. should handle this and that it could be discussed further at the next Council meeting.

At the Butler Twp. joint venture meeting the purchase of a sign making machine with grant money was discussed. R. Krick told Council that the person co-ordinating this wants to know which municipalities are interested in doing this. If we become involved we would then apply for grant money to purchase the needed materials. Our borough workers labor to make the signs would be our part of the matching funds for that section of the grant. It shouldn't cost us anything but we won't know for sure until seeing the final documents. They want to know by June if we are interested. Poles would be purchased in bulk and they are trying to get 6 - 8 municipalities involved. Motion to notify Butler Twp. we are interested in this project made by C. Marquardt seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Request to authorize paying the Tax Collector her commission on taxes collected. E. Dougherty then stated she had been tax collector since 1978. Anytime she asked for a raise she is told the millage goes up your commission goes up, but when the millage goes down there is no compensation. She purchases all her own supplies and pays her own rent. R. Krick suggested comming up with a proposal and put it before the Finance cmte. Motion to pay the tax collector made by J. Yackera seconded by C. Marquardt. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

BILLS

List of bills to be paid read by R. Krick. Motion to pay the bills as read made by C. Marquardt seconded by E. Labie. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

COMMUNICATIONS

Letter from Entech concerning a price increase.

R. Krick read a letter from D.C.A. We got the low interest loan to purchase a computer for the Borough. There is a resolution it is necessary to pass. It needs to be filled in. We will meet in one week to pass this resolution.

Letter from D.E.R. stating the necessary forms that were not complete are now complete. There will be a technical review done on the Ogden St. bridge.

Letter from Schuylkill County Demolition asking if the Borough wants to be put on the list of communities eligible to receive help with any demolitions in the Borough. Council decided it would be a good idea to answer yes even if we do not

plan to demolish any buildings.

R. Krick read a letter from Senator Rhoades office congratulating the Borough on its receipt of a low interest loan.

A letter from Hartford concerning our present insurance is to be turned over to the Finance cmt. They are currently reviewing all of our Borough insurance.

R. Krick stated he filled out a flood plain report for the Federal Government. He requested someone contact the Borough to help with flood plain policy. No one seems to know what that is. What restrictions would be on building or expanding on a flood plain.

The County informed the Borough it cannot go forward with the survey for the grant for the School Building because the deed is incorrect. R. Krick said he was in touch with M. Semanchick, the solicitor who drew up the deed, but he has not gotten back to him yet. Mr. Gallagher told us this needs to be straightened out.

Report by E. Labie on the meetings with Butler Twp concerning joint ventures. There were two meetings attended by R. Krick, Mayor Ketusky and himself. The main topic of discussion was the possibility of a regional police force. DCA came to explain this. This has been an option since 1972. York County is their main example because it has been in operation since then. They cover 8 municipalities over 168 square miles. Pop. 50,000 residents and an additional 30,000 people who work in the area. They have 37 full time officers. This allows for specialization in many fields i.e. drug task force. They have assisted the State Police on a regular basis. Locally the municipalities interested are Frackville, Ashland, Butler Twp. Gordon, Gilberton and Girardville. There is talk of possibly adding Mahanoy City and West Mahanoy Twp to this list. It takes at least one year for DCA to complete its investigation into whether this is an option for an area. E. Labie suggested sending a letter to Butler Twp. to let them know we are interested in pursuing this. A committee would need to be set up to investigate any joint ventures. There are currently several under consideration. Representatvies from the finance cmte, the police comt, the Council President and the Mayor were suggestions for people to serve on this committee. The object of this is to pull the big ticket items out of local budgets allowing for continued local government but also savings on operating costs. Motion to form a committee of E. Labie, R. Krick and E. Ketusky made by M.B. Dougherty seconded by C. Marquardt. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Meeting of the Street comt. is set for Thursday, May 19th. Items to be discussed are: the possible addition of street lights, patching potholes and the possibility of allowing parking on only one side of E. Mahanoy Avenue and Second Street during the detour for the Main St. Bridge project. Ideas on reducing the speed limits during this time and enforcement of this polciy. The public is invited to attend.

R. Krick noted we did receive the loan so we will need a committee to set the specs for the computer and maybe the fax machine. He invited any one from the G.A.M.A. to attend. Since the sewer Authority is meeting this Wednesday a date could be set up then.

M.B. Dougherty asked if everyone had a chance to look over the papers concerning changing from the State to P.S.A.B. for our workman's compensation insurance. The savings to the Borough would be roughly \$1,000. Motion to allow the Finance Cmte. to proceed and fill out forms to switch to P.S.A.B. made by R. Todd seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Recreation cmte. report by M.B. Dougherty and C. Marquardt. There will be a Youth dance on May 2, 1994 at the School Bldg. Admission will be \$1.00. It is for children from ages 7 - 15. The D.J service is being donated and the admission will fund any future events if this is a success. Dougherty asked if any Council would who could to attend to act as chaperones.

There was a question if we had enough sand for the parks. J. Hinkle felt there is enough for this year. Mostly it needs to be reshovled and weeded. The Recreation cmte was talking about the possibility of forming a Board. This would involve anyone from town who would be interested. R. Krick suggested placing an ad asking for letters of interest. This would give the committe a better

idea on how to proceed, whether it is worth pursuing. If there is enough interest then there is the possibility of getting a representative for the Board in Frackville to tell us how they run theirs. R. Krick brought up the basketball courts. He found two rims in the school building. C. Marquardt asked about keeping four (4) courts open and putting the hockey team on the other side. They have asked about freezing the court in the winter. Krick asked for a motion to purchase two new rims and chain nets. They cost about \$9.00 each. Motion made to authorize purchase of two rims and up to four chain nets if needed made by C. Marquardt seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Recycling

C. Marquardt noted the schedule for June is set up and will be posted. He received a letter for W. Bowen about the possibility of sending glass up to Lehigh Asphalt. The NSLA is paying us for our glass so a decision wil have to be made where to take the glass. Marquardt wants to set a committee meeting to look into the possibility of collecting plastic. It could be collected on the off month from newspapers.

Marquardt has copies of the Rules and Regulations for the Police Dept. for everyone. He wants the Mayor and Solicitor to look them over. Krick asked if the officers had any objections or suggestions could they meet with the Police Cmte. to discuss them. J. Yackera asked if there was a need to publish these meetings. Krick told him that 24 hour notice could be posted on the Borough Hall front door.

There are outstanding bills from the injury sustained by an ambulance attendant and R. Krick asked for permission to pay them. Motion to pay the bills made by C. Marquardt seconded by J. Yackera. Question? J. Yackera asked if the service would make sure their people know to ask before purchasing things on their own. Vote. All. Motion acrried.

Work on St. Joseph's Cemetary will begin on Saturday, May 22nd They are asking for volunteers. R. Krick brought this up because he wanted Council's okay to use the Borough truck if needed. If there were enough people J. Hinkle volunteered to shuttle them from the Borough Hall to the cemetary and back again. Also, to haul wood chips. The Catholic Daughters asked for permission to use the kitchen to prepare and serve lunch. He also noted that anyone interested in volunteering some time could either call him or come directly to the cemetary. Krick then asked the Mayor to see what he could arrange in the way of Police for traffic direction.

Summer Lunch

There is a balance of \$1301.97 in the checking account. R. Krick asked for a motion to send Gil's Catering a check for \$1300 as partial reimbursement for what we own him from 1993. Motion made by R. Todd seconded by C. Marquardt. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Complaints were again lodged by Mr. M. Ritro and Mr. J. Crane against Mr. J. Yagielniskie. These concern barking and odors from dogs kept in Mrs. M. Tobias's backyard. Questions were raised about the number of dogs, which varies, and if the structure is a kennell. Current ordinances do not control the number of dogs a person may keep. Council and the Solicitor will look into updating the ordinances. Questions were raised about the structure itself. There was a request for the Permit Officer to check into if the permit was violated. If this is the case the Solicitor can look into vacating the permit. Motion made by R. Todd and seconded by M.B. Pougherty to look into vacating the permit or variance if granted if beyond the intended use. J. Yagielniskie asked what this meant. It was explained if the permit were vacated then the structure would have to be torn down. It was suggested if the neighbors had problems with noise then calls to the Comm. Center should be made. The times of the complaints would be on record.

APPROVAL OF REPORTS

Minutes: Minutes of the previous regular meeting, motion made to accept made by C. Marquardt and seconded by R. Todd. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. Minutes of special meeting, motion made to accept made by R. Todd and seconded by C. Marquardt. Question? NOne. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Report read by R. Krick. Motion made to accept made by C. Marquardt seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Mayor's Report: Read by R. Krick. Motion made to accept made by M.B. Dougherty seconded by C. Marquardt. Question? NOne. Vote. All. Motion carried. C. Marquardt asked if Officer Russell will be sent for the same training the other officers received. Officer O'Donnell noted that he was off and has to make arrangements for himself.

It was also noted that we loaned Ashland the VASCAR. As of the meeting it was still out.

Health Officer's Report: Read by R. Krick. Motion made to accept made by C. Marguardt and seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Ouestion to J. Clayton from R. Krick. What requires a building permit and what does not. County will tell you what they cover and anything else is up to individual municipalities. Permits are needed for anything outsied that changes the face of the house and additions. J. Clayton suggested getting a permit for any work wspecially contracted work. This is one way of making sure the contractor has the necessary insurance. R. Krick suggested dealing with this as a work session to draw up more specific guidelines.

Recycling: Report by C. Marquardt. Schedule for collection for June set. This month we are trying P.E.T. #1 plastic. No newspaper will be collected this month. If this works we will alternate newspaper and plactic. W. Bowan is working with the guy with the dumpsters. This has to be put out on bids. We will get samples to know how to set up the bidding process. We got back ou progress report from the County. Copy on file. Received a check for \$352.00 for our efforts.

R. Krick noted he and the Mayor had a meeting with D.E.R. concering the ditch. They are supposed to get back to us. We are looking to get atleast part of it fenced. This depends on any monies being available.

Demolition project on A street was brought up. Letters are to be sent to both the County Commissioners and the County Demolition Office. Nothing has been done so far. J. Yackera asked if this could go to the next bidder. Note: send copies of the letters to W. Devaney and M Chase, Neighbors. The truck is parked in front of the building with expired tags and plate. The Mayor is to look into having them cited.

Vandalisim in the parks was brought up by R. Krick. He has asked the Recreation Omte. to look at backboards in the gym to see if there are any that are usable. Please report anyone you see doing damage. The possibility of a curfew was brought up. Parks currently have a 10:00 pm curfew. C. Marquardt suggested the idea of lifting the curfew in the future if the damage stops. J. Yackera asked if the police would be more visible. He said not to just drive passed the parks but to stop and roust the kids. Maybe their presence will deter the loitering and vandalism.

R. Krick noted that the school yard was opened to the hockey players but there are already five (5) broken windows. It will be too costly to have constantly replace them. C. Marquardt is going to check into getting them repaired. J. Yackera was approached by several parents who want to privately raise money to repair the courts and utilize part of that space for hickey. He told them if they could come to Council with details then Council can see about giving them some support.

Budget meetings should begin soon. E. Labie said it is suggested you begin this process after six months. R. Krick wants input from the various committees so we can set up a reasonable budget. J. Salukas asked about the potholes around town. Krick told him some have been filled but most would have to wait for the liquid fuels allocation. The review won't be done untill the end of June at the earliest and Harrisburg takes several weeks afterward. J. Hinkle is in the process of taking care of the ones that can be done.

E. Labie said the Street Cmte met on May 19th. The meeting concerned the Parking situation on E. Mahanoy Avenue and Second Street during the detour. Parking on the North side of F. Mahanoy Avenue could be eliminated for the 5 or 6 months of the detour. Give out warnings in July and then ticket. Second Street could also be restricted to one side parking. He is looking for input on this from anyone but decisions must be made soon. Officer O'Donnell asked about the possibility of reducing the speed limit on Second Street. E. Labie said that is also to be considered.

R. Krick asked again for any volunteers to help at the St. Joseph's Cemetary on the 18th. Anyone interested is welcome.

BILLS

List of bills read by R. Krick. Motion made to pay the bills as read made by C. Marquardt seconded by R. Todd. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

R. Todd asked if the solicitor had chance to review the Rules and Regulations for the Police Dept. Mr. Kilker did review them and has some suggestions but does not have his papers with him. He asked if this could be done next meeting. R. Krick asked him to forward these papers to the Police Cmte so they could look at them ahead of time. He also noted we need a pursuit and use of force policy. It was suggested we use the State Police Policies as they have been proven. These are needed for insurance purposes. The Mayor will see about getting a copy of these policies.

CORRESPONDENCE

R. Krick received a survey from Penn State which he will fill out and send in.

Letter form Citizen Clearing House looking for a donation. Turned down.

Letter of resignation from Mr. Sweeney of the Sewer Authority. Some one will have to be appointed to fill the vacancy. Motion to advertise the opening made by C. Marquardt seconded by R. Todd. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. Council directed the secretary to place an ad in the paper and the resumes currently on file will also be considered.

Letter from Butler Twp. concerning the sign machine. The cost has not yet been determined as it depends on how many municipalities will participate. This was tabled pending more details.

Letter from PEMA stating the snow removal forms have been forwarded to the Federal level.

Schuylkill County Zoning is holding the rezoning meeting on June 22 at 11:00 am at the Court House in Pottsville. The public is invited to attend.

Toole and Breznick sent us another friendly reminder.

M.B. Dougherty noted that the bill from Workman's comp. showed that the savings from the PSAB policy would not be great enough to pursue the change in carrier.

The trailer received one (1) bid. R. Krick did not bring it with him . J. Kilker said this has to be held until the next meeting. You cannot sell the trailer without opening any bids received.

Letter from Hartford Ins. with quotes. R. Krick suggested dealing with this at a work session. We are looking into upgrading our insurance and maybe saving some money.

MINUTES OF MEETING

CALL MEETING TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by President R. Krick and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Members present: Mary Beth Dougherty, Robert Krick, Ed Labie, Charles Marquardt, Mayor Ketusky. Not Present: J. Salukas, R. Todd, J. Yackera. Solicitor: Not Present.

BUSINESS

This meeting was called for general purposes. The first order of business was to pass the following Resolutions:

94-4 Resolution stating the Council officers so that the signature cards at the bank could be changed. Copy on file. Motion to pass the resolution made by E. Labie. Seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

94-5 Resolution allowing the Borough to assume debt. The purpose is the low interest loan to purchase computers. Motion to pass the resolution made by C. Marquardt. Seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

94-6 Resolution to apply for County liquid fuels allocation. Motion to pass the resolution made by M.B. Dougherty. Seconded by C. Marquardt. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

- C. Marquardt noted that starting next month the Borough would be recycling plastic. He is going to meet with the Senoir Citizens to explain exactly which type of plastic this involes. It is PET with the number 1 stamped on the bottom. All of this information will be made public. R. Krick asked if they pay where it will be taken. Marquardt said not right now, they are just taking it. When the grant money kicks in who knows what will be. We are also looking into taking glass to Lehigh Asphalt. They take clear, brown and green glass mixed. The cost involved would be gas, wages and time of travel. They don't pay for the glass. The problem is being a paving company they only work about half the year and we don't know if they stock pile all year or not. If they close down will the Landfill begin taking our glass again. Rich takes only clear and brown glass but he pays for it.
- R. Krick then brought up the mulch pile we have. It is getting out of hand and something needs to be done. C. Marquardt was told it should be seperated into piles and mulched each fall. The leaves could be composted. Policy needs to be set. Suggestions were limiting access and charge for dumping. No commercial operations should be allowed to dump without being aware there would be a charge and maybe have them come in with their machine and mulch.

These were just suggestions and this matter will have to be looked into further by Council.

R. Krick asked Mayor Ketusky if he had gotten any further along about fencing for the playground. Krick noted he was wondering who was responsible for digging the drainage ditch that runs behind the playground. It would be worth checking into this and maybe sending a letter from the Solicitor stating the danger it poses to our children. We have been very lucky so far that no one has fallen into it. The first step would be to find out who dug the ditch in the first place and when.

Officer B. Russell requested a public hearing over the incident with AprilMauer but because the Solicitor was not present this matter will have to wait until the regular meeting on June 9, 1994. Ron and Mary Zangari were present to speak at the hearing and were told they would be notified if it were necessary for them to appear.

No further business.

The meeting was opened at 7:00 pm by Presidnet R. Krick with the Pledge of Allegiance.

ROLL CALL

Council members present: M.B. Dougherty, R. Krick, E. Labie, J. Salukas, R. Todd.

Members arriving late (7:10): C. Marquardt, J. Yackera.

SOLICITOR: Present.

OPEN FLOOR TO PUBLIC COMMENT

The floor was given to Mr. B. Phillips, a representative of Higgins Assoc, for his presentation on requested insurance quotes. Mr. Phillips spoke at length. J. Salukas moved to table this for further discussion.

M.B. Dougherty suggested a Work Session be set up for Thursday, July 21st to allow Council to discuss this in more depth. It was also suggested contacting M. Hallowaty at Bane's, our current insurer, to allow them the opportunity to prepare a similar presentation. R. Krick thanked Mr. Phillips.

K. Malloy, as spokesperson for business and citizens on 2nd Street, noted that they were not happy with the concept of one side of the street parking during the bridge detour. R. Krick said it is going to be a problem wiht truck traffic. J. Salukas said to get the state to put up signs "Local Traffic Only" . R. Krick said that would be fine but trucks making deliveries on Main St. were not going to turn around and go back out, they would go down 2nd Street. Control of the truck traffic would be the major problem. Speed limits on Mahanoy Avenue were questioned. It is 35M.P.H. and cannot be changed except by PA DOT. E. Labie noted it can be requested but we cannot do it. The question of enforcing the local delivery amounts to whether or not there is a police officer on duty. You can enforce it but you need the manpower. The decision on making 2nd Street one side parking only will have to wait until the detour is in effect and traffic can be evaluated. The problem on Mahanoy Ave. also needs to be addressed. No parking on the North side but that is not decided upon yet. R. Krick noted the problem of Parking on the sidewalks. Those people will have no where to go. Mayor Ketusky said if you allow them to park illegally and someone is hit then who is liable. The Solicitor said he thinks the person who is illegally parked would be liable. J. Salukas said this should be established now. C. Marquardt asked about getting the signs ahead of time. That job is the contractor's responsibility. C. Marquardt also brought up the problem of aprking because of the Block Party at St. Vincent's. He suggested contacting the Pastor and making him aware of the possibility of parking problems.

M. Ritro asked the status of the dog ordinance. The Solicitor noted there is an ordinance , 79-1) that anyone's animals who disturbs the peace, quiet, peaceful enjoyment of their home and sleep of anyone in the Borough is in violation. If you have a considerate neighbor the problem can be taken care of easily. R. Krick told everyone if you have a noise complaint to call Comm. Cte. also to record and log the barking yourself if possible. If an officer is on duty he will come. The State Police do not like to answer these types of calls because if entails the enforcement of local ordinances. The question of the number of dogs you are allowed was asked. Kilker said this ordinance does not address that question but it does address the problem you are having. The Borough does have an ordinance that does not allow for kennels but it does not specify what number of dogs constitutes a kennel. The ordinance can be amended but R. Krick said you cannot enforce it on someone who already has dogs. M. Tobias said they have been to court over this matter and have been found innocent. J. Yagielniskie said complaints are being made when there is no noise and his dogs are being harrassed. He went on to say that the cops are going to get sick of coming and finding no dogs barking. R. Krick said that if called the officer has to respond. B. O'Donnell said that he does not have to see or hear the dogs that a citation can be issued on the information recieved but the person who complains must be willing to show up at all hearings and court dates. The fine is between \$20.00 and \$50.00 per time and failure can result in jail. J. Yackera asked J. Yagielniskie how many dogs he has. Yagielniskie told him he has dogs and puppies. J. Crane said the difference is 1 dog barking or 14 dogs barking. J. Yackera asked J. Yagielniskie, for the record, if he uses his dogs for sporting and recreation or if he sells them. Yagielniskie said he uses his dogs for sport and recreation and that occassionaly he sells them. Yackera asked how often is occassionally? is it two times a year, 10 times a year? Yagalieniskie did not respond. J. Yagalieniskie said to R. Krick, as long as I keep getting hasseled I am going to deep getting more dogs. R. Krick answered that he has to stay impartial in this and even though you say you don't have a kennell I would not want 14 dogs next to me. M. Ritro asked if that statement would be part of the minutes that it was a threat. M. Tobias replied no it is promise. He asked that these statements be recorded .

K. Malloy asked if when the Ranger's had their fire truck parade that they not park on both sides of 2nd Street. Kids like to walk around and look at the trucks and with the traffic she is afraid some one will be hurt. J. Yackera told her he wasn't sure where the line up or parade route would be but that he would look into this for her to see what could be done. Malloy also asked if anyone else had noticed all the strange people in town. Not just our regulars. B. O'Donnell took the opportunity to warn people about "Gypsy" activities in the area. There have been several related burglaries and he warned against allowing strangers access to your home. They will come to your front door and another will enter through an open back door and steal anything that is immediately available.

No further comments.

Motion to accept all reports as read by C. Marquardt seconded by R. Todd.
Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Mayor's Report: Read by E. Ketusky (copy on file). He read a letter from the Ashland Police Dept. thanking us for the loan of our Vascar unit when theirs was damaged. It has been returned in good working order. The Mayor also noted that the batteries in the hand held radios no longer hold their charges for an entire shift. He got price quotes of about \$150.00 for two batteries. Motion to purchase the batteries made by J. Yackera seconded by R. Todd. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

E. Ketusky went on to say B. O'Donnell needs 2 pair of uniform pants. Motion to purchase made by J. Yackera seconded by R. Todd. Question? C. Marquardt asked if this had to go out to bid? Ketusky said the cost is about \$100.00 and all other uniform purchases were made through the Police Safety League with no bidding and these purchases should be no different. J. Salukas asked if they are winter or summer weight pants and was told they are year round pants. R. Krick asked about a policy for clothing allownace for parttime officers. Prorate it on the amount of hours worked to how much money will be spent. R. Todd said the Police cmte will meet about this. Vote called. All. Motion carried. It was asked from the floor if a different color might be wanted for higher visibility. C. Marquardt said B. Russell did brign that to his attention. The need to be more visable. M.B. Dougherty suggested wearing orange safety vests on stops that need higher visblility. J. Yackers suggested asking the officers and J. Salukas said thecolor blue is accepted nationwide. Ofcr. O'Donnell said light shirts at night are not a good idea. He said if we are interested in purchasing something different might be lighter blue epaulets and a stripe down the leg. R. Krick said only if the changes are made as needed not just to change.

M.B. Dougherty asked that because charges are not being filed against the woman who hit B. Russell cna the borough file charges? She was told no by the Solicitor. R. Krick whats the police cmte. to review policy on stops. B. O'Donnell spoke to Sgt. Reed from the Frackville barracks and was told the woman did not know she hit him. There was no real evidence on the car and she would have been passed and not able to hear any noise that might have resulted from Russell hitting our car. Therefore she did not know she was leaving the scene of an accident.

Mayor Ketusky said his officers came to him to request reises they said were promised them after 1 year on the job. R. Krick said there is no record of this and no mention in the minutes. There cannot be raises in mid-year due to budgetary constraints. This matter was tabled.

Officer O'Donnell asked for another meeting about the Rules and Regulations before they are adopted. The Police Cmte. agreed to meet.

C. Marquardt gave his recycling report. (copy on file) R. Krick asked about the status of the dumpsters. According to C. Marquardt W. Bowan is doing the paperwork. J. Salukas asked how successful the plastic collection could be considered if more time was spent sorting then in picking it up. Also more of it went to the landfill then to be recycled. C. Marquardt said he wasn't aware of it being too much of a problem and

people have to be urged to put the correct type of plastic out.

M.B. Dougherty asked about the status of putting a street light on the corner of Main and Julia Sts. Additional light for the West End Park was requested. Motion to contact PP&L and check into getting two street lights put up made by M.D. Bougherty and seconded by R. Todd. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Bills: List of bills to be paid read by R. Krick. Motion to pay as read made by J. Salukas seconded by R. Todd. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Review of Books: Motion to accept and advertise as necessary the annual review of the Borough books made by M.B. Dougherty seconded by C. Marquardt. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Resolution to participate in the purchase of a sugn making machine with Butler Twp. not passed as result of no interest.

R. Krick read a letter concerning a grant application from the County for demolition. The Borough has to have \$5,000 to be used for this purpose if it decides to participate in the program. Krick noted it is only an application and this money will not be available probably till next year at least. Motion to fill in the application made by C. Marquardt seconded by J. Salukas. Question? NOne. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Bids were solicited from two contractors for filling in several really bad sections in the streets. We have County liquid fuel aid in the amount of \$2750.00 to spend for this purpose this year. The low estimate is from M&W from Ashland and thier price is \$3300.00. Several questions were raised concerning this project. J. Yackera asked the sense in patching areas that will be dug up during the sewer installation. Krick said that most of these are not in those lines and the holes are pretty bad right now. Is there much sense in waiting. C. Marquardt asked why we cannot just get a load of macadam and do it ourselves? Krick answered some of the holes are just to big to patch and they have to be dug out. We do not have the capability of doing this correctly. Motion to accept the bid made by J. Salukas seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. Roll call vote requested.

Yackera said D. heiser remembers talking about an emergency plan but not doing any actual paperwork. R. Krick read the letter from Schuylkill County Emergency Mamagement. (copy on file) Floor opened to nominations. J. Yackera nominated the Mayor, Ed Ketusky. Seconded by C. Marquardt. No other nominations. Question? None. Vote. All. E. Ketusky was elected to fill the slot.

- J. Clayton submitted her resignation as the Borough Health Officer. Motion to accept made by R. Todd seconded by J. Yackera. Vote. All. Motion carried. This now leaves the office open. It was asked if we sould appoint B. O'Donnell to act fo if it had to be adveritsed. The Solicitor said other Boroughs have a police officer acting in that job and thinks it is fine to appoint O'Donnell. Motion made by C. Marquardt that B. O'Donnell fill the position in the interim seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.
- M.B. DOugherty asked the Solicitor if he had chance to look into a ordinance concerning garbage that sits out for too long an amount of time. Krick asked if it could be geared to a resonable amount of time. The solicitor will look into this. The Mayor asked who is responsible for clean up on a property that is up for Sheriffs sale. The Solicitor said the property owner is responsible. It was suggested that the clean up aspect of the ordinance be aimed at the property owner rather than any tenant would give us a little more leverage in enforcement.
- J. Hinkle is requesting permission to get a new lock on the tool room door. He asks that only the three borough workers have access to keys R. Krick noted he thought a policy on to whom tools and borough property could be loaned would be a good idea. perhaps a sign in and out sheet to make sure things are returned and in good order. R. Todd said this something to discuss at the next work session.
- M.B. Dougherty brought up the idea of policy fro handicap parking spaces. This is another area we need to come up with spmething.

The meeting was opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by President R. Krick

ROLL CALL

All members of Council were present. The solicitor:

PUBLIC COMMENT

Question from the floor about the speeding on Mahanoy Avenue.

Mayor Ketusky answered we are doing the best we can with limited hours available. They have cited stop sign violators and have ticketed speeders. Speeding very early in the morning on West Mahanoy Avenue seems to be the most complained about item. All officers are VASCAR trained. The stop sign violators on East Mahanoy Avenue are also a big problem. People run that sign at 55M.P.H. Ofcr. Hummel explained that the lines need to be repainted. Questions were raised about having a full time cop. If no one is on duty the State Police have to come and by the time they get here the disturbance is over. R. Krick said no full time police this year. If the residents want one they will have to be willing to pay for one. Taxes will have to be increased. This Council has to live with this budget 'ecause of a lot of bills that were not known about previously. The engineer bill of \$8,000 from two years ago. There is also \$5,500 not budgeted for the sewerage plans. A mil is worth about 2500.00 for a full time cop you are talking a 10 mil increase. Budget meetings will start in Septmeber. Come and see the numbers. MB Dougherty said check the millage in other boroughs, It is 35-40 mils. She went on record saying she is in favor of more police protection. E. Labie ac in brought up the Regional Police force. If this is instituted a cop would have been available. Five full time officers are needed at app \$125,000 yearly fro 24 hours protection. Currently we have 64 hours weekly. One full time officer will give you only 40 hours weekly. Discussion ensued over the possible scheduling of police officers. There is no consensus of what are the most troublesome hours.

April Maurer made a formal complaint against Ofce. O'Donnell and Mayor Ketusky. R. Krick told her it was not a good ideato discuss this before her hearing. She invited all of Council to come to her hearing on Tuesday. All her complaints went unanswered. She wants this on public record. Both R. Krick and C. Marquardt stated it was not the place to discuss this. If there is anything

to talk about to do it after the hearing.

Complaints were lodged about 391-393 W. Mahanoy Avenue. garbage, smells and now rats. The person who resided in the building last claims the problem is her estranged husband. Building is owned by a woman from Brooklyn, NY. Ofcr. O'Donnell said the tenants are resopnsible for cleanup. R. Krick asked the solicitor if an ordinance that would give us recourse to go after the property owner. J. J. Clayton said the woman told her ot let the Borough clean it up and then bill her. C. Marquardt asked if it is possible to have the boroughworkers clean up the outside and cut the weeds then submit the bill to the owner. R. Krick said if she is willing to sign an agreement to pay to have the property cleaned up and reimburse the Borough for all expenses incurred. The neighbors want some action on this as quickly as possible. M.B. Dougherty asked about doing C. Marquardt thought that was a good idea. R. Krick said if Council wanted to do that now on the chance they would get paid it was okay. But then you have the problem of all the other properties in town. Motion to clean up yard and porch if owner is willing to reimburse the costs made by C. Marquardt seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. carried. Letter to be sent.

There were again complaints against Ofcr. O'Donnell. R. Krick told people to take this up with either the Mayor or the Police cmte. because coming direct to him does not help. He cannot do anything directly. If you think you have a criminal complaint then the magistrate is to be contacted. There were various statements both pro and con made about Ofcr. O'Donnell. R. Krick informed the public there can be no comments on anything that could be related to the suit that has been filed.

Ouestions again on the dog matter. R. Krick told them he called the SEO. DER has no regulations concerning dog waste only human waste. He is waiting for an answer from the SEO. Right now we are not sure what can be done. We are working on it and and will hopefully have answers soon.

A citizen statement to the effect that the Borough Attorney should not defend the Police Officerbeing sued. He should provide his own defense. Fees should only be paid if it is necessary. R. Krick told her no decision had been made as yet. On advice of our attorney we are not paying anything right now We will be enjoined in the suit eventually anyway.

R. Melendez had a request that Council look into the possibility of charging a yearly fee for any contractor who wants to work in the Borough. He has a form to be looked at that requires proof of insurnace. R. Krick asked him for a copy of it and Council woild look into it. J. Clayton, Permit officer, said it sounded like a good idea but the Borough already requires liability and workman's comp insurance due to State law.

There was a request that was made for a police report that was denied. The woman told council this is a violation of the "SUNSHINE LAW" R. Krick wanted the Solicitor to speak directly with her so she left her name and phone number.

At this point the Solicitor arrived.



Complaints about police officers either not being available, not coming, or not doing anything about the complaint were made.

C. Marquardt stated that if there are problems with scheduling then times have to be changed. Again E. Labie said this comes down to money. This is what makes a REgional Police Force look more and more the way to go.

Citizens on W. Mahanoy Avenue asked again about the bad shoulders down there. Seh said there were already several calls to PADOT with no reaction. R. Krick said hw would try to call them but we have no leverage either.

It was asked if it were possible to put a speed bump on the lower section of Ogden Street. The cars are using it as a race strip. E. Labie said this was looked into once before and is not feasible. The Borough would be responsible for any damage done to a car.

It was asked if it were possible to get a street light on E. Mahanoy Avenue. R. Krick told the woman that where these lights should is always a matter of opinion. He would go up one night and look. A cracked light pole was brought to Council's attention. The woman was told to inform PP&L as they are the responsible party.

No further comments.

Council is able to suspend but the Mayor is in the best position to make this decision. The Officer then can appeal to Council for a hearing. Specifics should not be brought to the attention of Council at an open meeting because it may jeopardise the Council impartiallity if they are putin the position of having a hearing. The bottom line according to the Solicitor is go to the Mayor with any complaints.

We have decided to take this thing seriously and We will not let an officer go down based on we mean business. rumors and innuendos. We are going to get to the facts. prupose of the hearings would be twofold. Number one: to decide on an ongoing basis our position regarding payment for legal council for Ofcr. O'Donnell who is now subject to one lawsuit. anticipate that we may be joined in that lawsuit. Second: look over the whole situation regarding the Police Dept. and what we can do to protect the Police, the Borough and the Borough Council. And especially the public. Poeple will be under oath and if they lie will be perjuring themselves. We will conduct ourselves accordingly if we discover that happens. Council further decided to look into the hearing process as provided by section 1014 of the Borough Code in which the Council or any committee there of can subpoena witnesses and require the production of documents regarding the issues before Council or the committee. The Solicitor was instructed to look into the financial arrangements for said hearing and to report by the next meeting, September 8, 1994. The solicitor further explained that the reasons for said actions are based purely on a legal strategy with the hopes that leaving some doors open may resolve the current situation.

PUBLIC COMMENT

K. Malloy submitted her receipts for \$62.73 for the paint for "Mural Day". The kids had a great time and the pictures turned out well. She wanted to bring up the Park. The East End park is deplorable. Donna St.Clair and she painted the shed and picnic tables. She was very upset about what was carved and written on the tables and walls. It is scary she said. Also, there was a girl sitting up on a joist in the pavailion and every time she moved the whole building shook. Malloy asked about getting rid of the picnic tables and greasing the poles from the top to keep the older kids from climbing. P. Krick told her the tables had to be out for summer lunches but could probably be moved now.

The neighbors of 391-393 W. Mahanoy Avenuue came to thank Council, M.B. Dougherty, Ofcr. O'Donell and the others. They realize there are channels but the swift movement is appreciated. R. Krick told them it isn't finished yet. M.B. Dougherty got the written permission to have the outside cleaned with verbal agreement to pay for this from the property owner. Mayor Ketusky organised the cleanup and all the bills are going to be itemized and given to the owner. We are going to try to get all the outside work done within the next week or so and the owner will have to make arrangements to have the inside cleaned out. It is her responsibility as the property owner.

The question was asked why the Borough Solicitor was not representing our Officer in the lawsuit. J. Kilker said the reason was a possible conflict of interest. Anyone representing O'Donnell would have to name the Borough as a third party in the suit and that the same person could not represent both parties. Council is considering holding hearings on the matter of whether or not Ofcr. O'Donnell was acting within the scope of his authority and after that they can decide whether to supply legal council. Second the Porough was named in the suit as a fedendant. We have been named now by Ofcr. O'Donnell's Attorney. R. Krick noted that the blane has to be placed on the previous Council for not having Police liablilty insurance. Legal Council would have been no problem. There were people who wanted this and C. Marquardt got proce quotes but it was voted down. We have now purchased this incurance but it does not help in this case. J. Kilker said Ofcr. O'Donnell does have Council but the same lawyer could not do both because of the Conflict of Interest. The question of paying for his defense will be answered as the case progresses. K. Kilker will send them the notice tamorrow.

- 3. This is the second petition presented to Borough Council. This matter should have been resolved years ago and not allowed to continue. The odors and the excessive dog banking have been a general nuisance and all past attempts to eliminate this problem have proved to be unsuccessful and the problem continues to exist.

Therefore, we, the undersigned, hereby request Council's support and consideration to use its authority in whatever manner is necessary to bring about an amicable solution to this very important problem, alleviate it and bring it to an end.
