#### REORGANIZATION MEETING

PLACE: Municipal Building DATE: January 2, 1996 TIME: 7:00 PM

Oaths of Office were administered by the Mayor, Edward Ketusky, to all newly and reelected Council members before the meeting.

#### **OPEN MEETING**

The meeting was opened by Mayor Ketusky with the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### ROLL CALL

Members present: M.B. Dougherty, R. Krick, E. Labie, T. Shearn, J. Tinari, J. Yackera, C. Marquardt. Mayor E. Ketusky and Solicitor J. Kilker.

Mayor Ketusky opened the floor for nominations for Council President. J. Yackera nominated Charles Marquardt, seconded by T. Shearn. No other nominations.

At this point R. Krick made a point of order. He told Council that according to information sent to the borough dealing with reorganization from PSAB you cannot vote for yourself for the office of Council President. The Solicitor said that he had done some research in the matter after a phone call with R. Krick concerning this matter and the case law cited concerned a Council member voting for himself to fill a vacancy created by the resignation of the Mayor. Resulting from the law suit was a ruling that an elected official cannot vote for himself to fill another elected position. R. Krick thanked the solicitor for his opinion and than asked the Chair, in this case Mayor Ketusky, to make a decision in the matter. Mayor Ketusky said he felt he has no choice but to abide by the information

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given by PSAB. The Solicitor stated that he has control over any legal advice given to Council as stated in the Borough Code Section 1117 - duties of the solicitor and the Chair should not make a decision based on some vague opinion. R. Krick argued the point that any advice given is just that advice and Council or in this case the Chair can act as they see fit. He asked the solicitor if his advice was binding? Mr. Kilker continued to say he was acting in his capacity as borough solicitor. M.B. Dougherty asked who was then controlling the meeting? Technically we are not organized and the Mayor runs the meeting. Who makes the decision on which advice to take and which to ignore? She asked if the Solicitor is under control than does he have the power to make the decision in this matter and not Council? J. Yackera said that it should be Council and not just the Chair. At this point debate insued over the entire matter. Who received what answers from PSAB, who has the right to make the decision, how should this matter be handled by Council, why this information comes out now and no two years ago and where does the solicitor fit in concerning any decisions made. M.B. Dougherty said she had been told that this information, which was just recently brought to PSAB's attention, was sent out to make officials aware of the possibility of problems and they will not recommend any course of action because they cannot give advice. Shelly Barkus told her Council should ask their Solicitor's opinion in the matter. J. Kilker said that the case PSAB cites has nothing to do with reorganization and that there are differing legal opinions. Also, he was told that this is an open question. Questions of case law and ethics were raised. He went on to say that if not reorganized this matter would have to go to court and he could not imagine that the borough code was written to force councils to end up in court over reorganization. R. Krick said he thought the Mayor controls the meeting until reorganization has taken place and any decisions made can be appealed. Asked what his decision is Mayor Ketusky said he felt it necessary to agree with the information PSAB sent and that no member could vote for himself for the President's seat. J. Yackera made a motion to ask for an appeal of the chair's decision. Motion seconded by J. Tinari. Roll call vote follows:

At this point R. Krick pointed out that according to Robert's Rules of Order you need a super majority to overrule the chair. These rules have always been used for order at meetings. J. Yackera asked where it says we use Robert's Rules? R. Krick replied he was sure you could check minutes as he recalls J. Wayne bringing up the matter. If we are not using Robert's Rules what are we using? There have to be some rules to keep order at meetings. J. Kilker asked what the original point of order was? Krick replied voting for yourself for president. J. Kilker asked the Mayor if he chose not to follow the solicitor's advice? Mayor Ketusky replied he would follow the PSAB recommendations until proven otherwise. J. Kilker than asked, it is your decision to disregard the solicitor's opinion? At this time he asked for a 10 minute recess that was granted.

An executive session was then called and Council retired to the Municipal office.

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Council resumed the meeting. At this time is recognition of the members of the public present the Mayor opened the floor to the public for comment.

From the floor the question of whether a court decision is law J. Kilker said yes it is law. He added that what the Mayor is reading is a court decision and has nothing to do with Council President it has to do with replacing a vacant Mayoral seat. The decision does not mention reorganization. Again, the Mayor stated he would accept the document from PSAB until he felt comfortable doing otherwise. Mr. Kilker then stated for the record that first it was stated a super majority was required is a matter of legal question not procedural question. You cannot try to decide a case here and now. I am advising the Mayor is making a ruling on substantive law. My legal opinion is that everyone has the right to vote as the wish. PSAB will not even take a position. The council is not fulfilling their obligation to reorganize. R. Krick said to wait one minute because the meeting is not over yet. J. Kilker went on to say now I am being criticized for preparing. R. Krick asked again if the solicitor's legal opinions were binding on council? The question of ramifications and liability over this were raised. R. Krick criticized the solicitor for unasked for opinions and taking sides. The solicitor said that the Mayor could not deprive any one of their right to vote. R. Krick asked again if Council could either take the solicitor's opinion or not. J. Kilker said yes. When asked again if the Chair has the right to run the meeting J. Kilker replied he does not have the right to deny the right to vote. Mayor Ketusky said again that the notice from PSAB will stand until proven otherwise to his satisfaction. R. Krick added that is the chair rules you cannot vote for yourself than the chair is in the position of breaking the tie resulting from any vote.

The next question raised was when to make a point of order. J. Yackera asked if the vote is official? R. Krick argued you cannot make a point of order until the vote was taken and J. Kilker stated that any questions should be noted immediately after the person in question votes.

The Mayor opened the floor for nominations for Council President. R. Krick nominated E. Labie seconded by M.B. Dougherty. There were no other nominations.

E. Labie made a motion to adjourn until Thursday that would give time to get a written opinion. Motion seconded by J. Yackera. M. B. Dougherty said that she did not think

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PSAB will give a written opinion. J. Yackera asked why they would send it if they are not willing to back it up? E. Labie said he thought it would be a good idea to get a copy of the legal opinion upon which the notice was based. He said he would call Shelly Barkus and see what he could find out. I am not saying the Mayor is right or that the Solicitor is right I am saying to take some time and find out as much information as we can. J. Kilker said he was supposed to be out of town Thursday, Friday and Saturday but he would change his plans if the meeting had to be held Thursday. Labie said it would probably take two days to get answers. J. Yackera asked why this question comes up now and not two years ago? M.B. Dougherty told him that they were not aware of this until now and this notice has been in the correspondence folder since it arrived. Everyone should be reading this information.

Vote on the motion to adjourn until Thursday, January 4, 1996 at 7:00 PM. All. Motion carried.

J. Kilker suggested that the motion should be to continue the meeting. Motion to amend the motion to read to continue the meeting until Thursday, January 4, 7:00 PM made by J. Tinari seconded by E. Labie. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

C. Marquardt introduced Resolution 96-l that is a listing of all appointed officers needed for the bank. This is necessary in order to have the signature cards changed. R. Krick asked the solicitor about having the checks signed tomorrow as it is a pay day. An inquiry at the bank revealed they had no problem but R. Krick said he did not think it was proper. J. Kilker said that the new officers would have to be approved immediately. J. Yackera made a motion to adopt Resolution 96-1. Seconded by J. Tinari. Vote. All. Motion carried.

The question of handling of the Borough's mail was raised. R. Krick made a motion that all Borough mail be directed to the Post Office box and that no mail be directed to anyone's residence. Motion seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Vote. All. Motion carried.

A list of bills was submitted for regular monthly, quarterly and yearly payment be accepted. These bills fall due before meetings and the list was compiled to keep the borough from having late charges levied. Motion to allow the treasurer to pay these bills as they come due made by J. Yackera seconded by T. Shearn. Vote. All. Motion carried.

C. Marquardt said due to Mrs. Flannery's resignation we will have to hire a Summer Lunch coordinator.

M.B. Dougherty made a motion that all borough positions be advertised subsequent to being filled. Seconded by R. Krick. Vote. All. Motion carried.

The Secretary requests permission to have the books for 1995 audited. It was asked who would be doing the audit and council was informed if it were acceptable Dennis Mensch from Ashland would do the review again this year. The cost is usually \$550.00 Motion to allow the audit made by J. Yackera seconded by R. Krick. Vote. All. Motion carried.

C. Marquardt asked Mayor Ketusky if he would contact the water company and find out if they are willing to mulch the Christmas trees and when this could be done. The Mayor said he would call. Marquardt was asked about the shredder that the borough had applied for via a DER grant. He said it would be 4-6 months before we heard anything and the trees should not sit around that long. He suggested collecting the trees on January

- 8,9,10th weather permitting and that people could drop the trees off on the island. The road has to be plowed open and he will speak to J. Hinkle about having this done.
- R. Krick made a motion to require the tax assessor to submit quarterly reports and that any information in borough hall she may require be turned over to her. Motion seconded by J. Yackera. Vote. All. Motion carried.
- C. Marquardt reminded all the committee chairs that reports can be made at each monthly meeting.

The recycling is going to be done with drop off only. C. Marquardt reported he hopes this works well.

- M.B. Dougherty made a motion that due to the difficulties with the DCA grant that all paper work be kept in the borough hall. Motion seconded by J. Yackera. Vote. All. Motion carried.
- M.B. Dougherty asked C. Marquardt if he as the new council president planned to keep all mail available as was the previous practice. C. Marquardt replied that correspondence would only be filed when completed.

Mayor Ketusky turned in a letter of resignation from his position as Emergency Management Coordinator. Motion to accept the resignation made by J. Yackera seconded by R. Krick. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Council decided to put finding a replacement in the hands of the Public Safety committee. J. Yackera was appointed by C. Marquardt to fill the position in the interim. Yackera asked where all the paper work should be kept? The Mayor said everything is currently in the police office and it can remain. Mayor Ketusky said to keep in mind when making the appointment there are a lot of meetings and a lot school required of the person filling the job.

E. Dougherty, the tax collector, asked if it was possible for her to be allowed to burn certain old records. She was reminded that the borough has a no burn ordinance. C. Marquardt said that perhaps council could allow this. E. Labie said that the financial records could be taken directly to the landfill and watched being buried. This can be complicated to arrange but can be done. E. Dougherty was not comfortable with this idea. J. Tinari volunteered to take care of having the records burned.

It was asked from the floor if the new regime would continue to open the floor at council meetings? C. Marquardt said that meetings would continue as previously.

The solicitor, J. Kilker, asked if council would pay one half the cost of membership in the PA Borough Solicitor's Association? The amount would be \$35.00 the balance being paid

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by Mount Carbon. Motion to pay one half share, \$35.00, member PBSA made by J. Yackera seconded by T. Shearn. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Committee chairs were reminded that meetings have to be posted. Give dates and times to the Secretary. It was suggested that monthly meetings be scheduled.

- J. Kilker suggested that if the council is going to follow Robert's Rules that members purchase a copy. There are several different copies available in local bookstores.
- R. Krick made a motion that every reorganization it be stated what rules council will conduct meetings under. J. Kilker said that rules are very helpful, it can keep a meeting from getting out of hand. He said that he wished to thank council for voting to appoint him as borough solicitor.

Terri Krick, as a representative of the Girardville Area Recreation Cmte. wanted to know if they decide on an event would it be allowable to present the idea to council and get approval with a specific date. There are times when dates have to be decided either before or after a scheduled meeting. This question was raised because in order to be covered by the insurance all activities have to be approved by council and reflected in the minutes. J. Yackera said he did not think this should be a problem. The committee should go through M.B. Dougherty as she is their liaison. Motion to allow M.B. Dougherty to be the contact person for setting activities made by J. Yackera seconded by E. Labie. Vote. All. Motion carried.

#### REGULAR MEETING

#### **OPEN MEETING**

The meeting was opened by President C. Marquardt with the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### ROLL CALL

Members present: J. Yackera, C. Marquardt, R. Krick, M.B. Dougherty, J. Tinari, E. Labie, Mayor Ketusky.

Members absent: T. Shearn (work)

#### PUBLIC COMMENT

There were a group of residents from West Mahanoy Avenue complaining about the fact that the entire town has snow removal and they are always ignored. The area has elderly residents as well as children and even though most park on the opposite side of the street they would like the snow removed from in front of their homes. C. Marquardt asked J. Tinari to get together with Ed Burns and go down to see what if anything could be done in this situation. He told the residents that the problem is that PaDOT plows the Avenue and they get as close to curb to curb as they can. The homes on one section in question are set down off road level and maybe Pa DOT does not want to get too close to the end of the road. The residents replied that is fine but does not explain why East Mahanoy Avenue has snow removal. The other problem is a fire hydrant that was covered. C. Marquardt said that was caused by one of the neighbors with a snow blower and has since been taken cleared. They also mentioned that Julia Street is poorly cleared for visibility. Council informed them that Butler Twp. is responsible for the snow on the top of Julia Street. C. Marquardt told the residents that J. Tinari will get in touch with Burn's tonight and it will be looked into first thing tomorrow morning.

A question was raised from the floor concerning recycling. C. Marquardt informed the people that recycling will go on according to schedule but with drop-off only.

#### APPROVAL OF REPORTS

Motion to accept the minutes as submitted made by J. Yackera seconded by J. Tinari. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report read by C. Marquardt. Motion to accept as read made by J. Tinari seconded by J. Yackera. R. Krick had a question about check #10710 in the general fund. The explanation was a typographical error. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Police report and Health Officer's report read by Mayor Ketusky. Motion to accept both reports as read made by J. Yackera seconded by J. Tinari. R. Krick asked if there were any hearings missed? The Mayor said no hearings were missed. Vote. All. Motion carried.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

J. Yackera brought up correspondence from the SPCA concerning the possibility of entering into a contract for removal of stray dogs and cats. He asked what had been done concerning this matter. E. Labie told him that this had been looked into and tabled. The contract meant a commitment on the Borough's behalf of a specific amount of money, payable in advance. The one problem was there was no removal of the animals. The borough would have to transport. J. Yackera asked where the letters were concerning this and E. Labie said he thought he still had them. He would look and give them to Yackera. J. Yackera said he would look into this for next meeting.

The proposed addition to the building permit ordinance that was originally tabled in December was tabled again waiting information from Ashland.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

J. Yackera asked to discuss policy on uniforms for the police department. We have one full time and one part time officer and each has only one uniform. There should be at least 2 or 3 uniforms and the borough should have a set policy on purchase of equipment. He had asked for a price quote for 3 complete uniforms and was told it would cost approximately \$250.00. He wanted council's opinion on the possibility of ordering uniforms. R. Krick said he has no problem with uniforms for the police but the problem is the cops come and go. We have a closet full of "useless" uniforms because they do not fit anyone. Will fitting the uniforms on hand become a requirement of being hired? The previous policy for our full time officer was \$150 per year. There was no policy for part time employees. Maybe we should stipulate a pro-rating of costs the policy being that if you leave within 6 months you owe us one-half the cost. The other problem is that these uniforms. J. Yackera said a uniform should last at least one year. The Mayor suggested that one half of the cost be returned if the officer leaves within one year.. J. Yackera made a motion to purchase three uniforms with the condition of reimbursement of on-half the

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cost if the officer leaves within 1 year. Motion seconded by J. Tinari. M.B. Dougherty asked if we are going to look for the best price or is there one place to make the purchase. J. Yackera told her that the best place is usually the Gall's catalog. Vote. All. Motion carried.

E. Labie said he thought this would be a good time to get together with several other communities and look into regional police. Of 40 calls listed on the report 8 were assists to other departments. There has been talk that the State Police are going to charge for coming into communities. The biggest option is Butler Twp. We are set up perfectly for this if Gilberton is interested. It does not have to be on a large scale to start. We are looking at communities with little or no protection and all of the expenses. Within the next year or two we will be looking at purchasing a new police car. This can work. It has worked in other areas. The major stumbling block is politics and that can be overcome. I hope the police committee makes a commitment to seriously look into this possibility. I know that Sharon Mullins from Butler was interested and so was Joe O'Neil from Gordon. That is the place to start. C. Marquardt instructed the police committee to look into this possibility.

E. Labie asked council if they were aware that the housing project on Second Street is out for bids? It is to be hoped that this will be started in the spring. C. Marquardt told him that his information put the beginning of the project in 90 days.

J. Yackera asked if there had been any answer from Butler concerning the opening of the sewer authority. The Secretary said there had been no answer yet and she would contact them by phone. There was a question of an opening from the borough. T. Yesalavage is checking into this. R.Krick said he thought the slots became available one each year. J. Yackera said he would check with T. Yesalavge. Motion to advertise any open position for GAMA for the borough made by R. Krick seconded by J. Yackera. Vote. All. Motion carried.

#### **BILLS**

List of bills to be paid read by C. Marquardt. J. Yackera pointed out the bill for Teds BP should read \$475.78. Motion to pay the bills as read made by J. Tinari seconded by J. Yackera. Vote. All. Motion carried. Treasurer asked for permission to transfer \$800 from the General Fund MMA to the School building fund. Motion to allow transfer of \$800 from General Fund MMA to School fund made by R. Krick seconded by J. Tinari. Vote. All. Motion carried.

The Secretary asked for permission to add the Pottsville Republican to the list of bills payable when due. These bills sometimes have to sit for a month before a council meeting. Motion to add the Republican to the list of bills approved for payment made by J. Tinari seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Vote. All. Motion carried.

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#### CORRESPONDENCE

PSAB - request for a contact person and an alternate for the drug and alcohol testing policy. Council appointed J. Tinari contact and J. Yackera alternate.

Fax received for J. Kilker explaining his absence at tonights meeting. Due to the serious weather he had to pick up his daughter in Philadelphia and did not believe he would make it back in time to attend. He reminded council that the EMA plan needs to be revised and followed in order to qualify for any federal money that may be released as a result of the snow emergency. He advised the plan be revised and forwarded as soon as possible.

There was also a notice of the dog hearings scheduled for January 24, 1996.

R. Krick requested information on the status of the injunctions that were to be filed in December. He said these questions will have to wait until the solicitor is available. This work was paid for in advance and to date to his knowledge nothing had been done. This needs to be checked with the solicitor and if nothing was done yet see about getting back the advanced moneys. C. Marquardt told the secretary to contact the solicitor's office and find out what is going on with the injunctions.

There was a question raised from a citizen concerning J. Yackera driving the dump truck without a CDL. J. Yackera said that inquiry to A. Kaplan yielded that the permission should have been given by the Mayor under the Governor's proclamation of the emergency. The insurance carrier informed the secretary that the policy would cover and physical damage resulting from an accident but personal liability would be the responsibility of the driver. R. Krick wanted everyone to be aware that driving borough vehicles lets you open to being sued and being responsible for your own personal liability. M.B. Dougherty said an inquiry to PA DOT revealed that no one should drive a vehicle requiring a CDL unless they are qualified. J. Yackera said that fire trucks are driven without CDL's with PA DOT's approval. They are comparable to vehicles that require the license. He drove the truck to help in the emergency and did not do so with malice. He apologized for any problems he may have caused as a result of doing so. M.B. Dougherty suggested that due to the fact that Hinkle is having problems with his knees and maybe we should consider that any future employee have a CDL. Motion to make having a CDL a requirement for future hiring of borough workers made by M.B. Dougherty seconded by R. Krick. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Letter from Mr. & Mrs. Vincent Catizone of West Main Street complimenting the borough's snow removal effort.

Letter from W. Bowen informing the borough Waste Management Inc. will be the recycling hauler for 1996-97.

#### **OPEN MEETING**

The meeting was opened by President C. Marquardt with the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **ROLL CALL**

Member present: M.B. Dougherty, R. Krick, E. Labie, C. Marquardt, T. Shearn, J. Tinari, J. Yackera. Mayor E. Ketusky, Solicitor J. Kilker.

#### **PUBLIC COMMENT**

M. Ritro of West Preston Avenue brought to Council's attention that the ground seems to be caving in and it is not going into the sewer. J. Yackera and T. Shearn will stop up and look at it after the meeting.

E. Dougherty asked if anything could be done to help with the drainage. The water gushes down passed the drain on Carey's corner at John Street. We had water every and basements were flooded. J. Yackera told her to understand that there was water every where because the system was overloaded. Both he and T. Shearn will also look at the drain on John Street.

The ladies on East Main Street extended their thanks to all the men who worked on the sewer problem and repaired the line. They said thank you for a job well done.

- J. Clayton asked if Council would consider making a donation to the Veterans Memorial in Pottsville? She thought it would be a good idea because of the number of veterans who live in town.
- T. Bobarsky addressed questions to the Solicitor and Council concerning the Arcade. He had asked the Solicitor for an answer on ordinance 90-3 concerning loitering. J. Kilker told him he would try to have his answer within one (1) week and it is now two (2) months. He does not understand why it should take so long. He also asked if the Borough is bothering to enforce ordinances and are they on the Police report? J. Yackera said the report is not that specific. They do not get broken down by ordinance and crime

code. He has shown the tapes of what goes on in front. When he calls for the officers concerning trucks parked on the sidewalk by the time they arrive it is gone. They claim to have paperwork to do and will answer when they have time. C. Marquardt said he would have the Mayor look into this claim. J. Yackera said that at the Public Safety meeting this was addressed. The officers said that this is a legitimate complaint and should be taken care of immediately. If they have another call that is an excuse not paperwork. Mr. Bobarsky then asked when the Borough is going to regulate the "Pool Hall"? Would this Council vote to regulate their hours? They are illegal as they have no occupancy permit and no zoning permit. He asked if anyone from Council had gone inside the building? E. Labie said that he stopped in this evening before coming to the meeting. J. Yackera said that as far as zoning if concerned that is the County. We cannot enforce County zoning violations and have no authority to shut them down. They are backlogged and you will have to wait for the County to get to you. As to regulating hours, J. Yackera told Mr. Bobarsky that he would not vote to do so. I run a business in this town and would not want Council to tell me what hours I could be open. He then suggested that Mr. Bobarsky consult a private attorney. Mr. Bobarsky said that answers could be gotten from the Attorney General or the Inspector General. It is ridiculous to be making the same complaint for eight (8) months and have no answers. How would any of you like 30 kids hanging out by your homes every night? C. Marquardt said that we do not always know what calls the officers answer. We do not ask about every investigation or arrest. Everything done in that office is not our business. We will act on any complaints received. The general public does not and should not have access to the daily logs. Mr. Bobarsky went back to regulating the pool hall at this point. He said that Council is saying they will not regulate the operating times and he is saying they have the right to do so as there are six (6) tables which legally make is a pool hall. J. Yackera told him that he was not answering for all of Council. Not voting for regulating hours is his stand on the matter. E. Labie told him that the section of Borough Code that pertains to this allows Council to regulate if they so choose. It does not state that they have to regulate. Asked what hours he thought suitable Mr. Bobarsky said in the winter, October to May they should close at 9:00 PM. June to September they should close at 6:00 PM. E. Labie told him that the current curfew ordinance is 10:00 PM on weekdays and 11:00 PM on weekends. How can you justify those hours? If your reaction was to say close at 10:00 PM weeknights and 11:00 PM on weekends that would be reasonable. C. Marquardt said that he would appoint a committee to look into this matter with the owner and have a work session type of meeting. He appointed E. Labie, R. Krick, and J. Yackera to this committee. E. Labie said that the parks are closed at dusk and the arcade is the only place for the kids in town. Mr. Bobarsky said that he would bring the tapes and shown council exactly what goes on there. E. Labie answered that you cannot tell people not to let their children out after 6:00 PM.

Mrs. Catizone then asked about a letter she understood was sent by one of her neighbors with complaints about her. She wanted to know exactly what the letter was about. After some discussion the Solicitor said that he and the Mayor would speak with her after the meeting if that were acceptable. She asked for a copy of the letter. R. Krick asked if the letter is considered correspondence and a public document or police business as it went to

the Mayor? If it is police business it cannot be discussed in an open forum. Mrs. Catizone asked if everyone is afraid of him? J. Yackera told her that if this is discussed now it might cause a problem with any investigation. He thought that she should be allowed to atleast read the letter. After several minutes of discussion C. Marquardt told Mrs. Catizone that the Mayor and Solicitor would see her after the meeting.

E. Burns asked to speak as a representative of the Sewer Authority. GAMA has not been able to hold a meeting because of lack of quorum. They have heard rumors about resignations being handed but have nothing definite. They are asking if Council could put into effect a policy stating if you miss 2 or 3 meetings you are out? The Solicitor told him that should be in the Authority by-laws. R. Krick said the attorney for the Authority told him the only way to remove someone would be to have a private citizen petition the court. He asked the solicitor to tell him what to do and he would be willing to file the necessary papers. This is ridiculous. The borough is \$300,00 in debt over this plan. There are members who simply do not attend meetings and council is told they cannot remove them. Letters were sent asking for resignations. The letters were sent to Daniel Heiser, David Bittner and Thomas Downey. D. Heiser answered that he would not resign and the others simply ignored the letter. There are over 300 right of ways to be signed and only 2 or 3 people actively working on the project. C. Marquardt said he spoke to the board members recently and T. Downey's term is up and he will not be coming back. D. Bittner has handed in his letter of resignation which Council will deal with during the meeting. J. Yackera said he spoke to D. Heiser who said he will resign and that leaves only V. Gomosky. E. Burns said he would speak with Vince. E. Burns then asked that the general public attend these meetings. This is happening and will be happening soon. The first thing will be the billing and then the hollering will start. If you want to have some input now is the time. The Sewer Authority meets on the Fourth (4th) Thursday at 7:00 PM.

The Recreation Committee asked to use the Borough Hall for a Kite Flying project on March 16th with a rain date of March 23rd. Council approved the use.

Yackera said he pulled the transmission on the Plymouth. The question was to rebuild or get a used one. We could go to Recla for \$250.00. Motion to send the Plymouth to Recla made by J. Tinari seconded by J. Yackera. Vote. All. Motion carried.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

J. Yackera asked J. Kilker if he had any answers on the dogs and Marty Ello. He said that he reinstated the complaint because if it goes over thirty days you have to reinstate. It will be served tomorrow. They have twenty days to answer.

On the dogs. The action was split between the preliminary injunction and the permanent injunction. We are supposed to meet on Saturday and it is not as immediate now. You have to wait a month or two to get a standard hearing. The rewritten complaints are here to get signatures of the Secretary, Mayor and President. The problem is that the windows are closed and therefor the problem is not immediate. When the weather changes that changes but we would already be on the docket. - C. Marquardt noted that he received information concerning the chipper-shredded grant application. Due to the large response for grant funds our application has been put into the second round that will be opened 4/18/96. They have asked for additional information concerning the disposal of the mulch. We have to submit a list of local landscapers who are willing to use the mulch.

# PUBLIC COMMENT

L. Catizone said she would donate programs for the Biddy league. She will design the flyers and supply the paper. C. Marquardt asked if it is agreeable to Council to allow use the Borough's copy machine? Council agreed. He told her to contact him to arrange a time to make the copies.

Mr. Bobarsky asked if he could read a short statement and that it be included in the minutes? Council agreed. Copy of statement is attached. He then asked why the ordinance against loitering is not being enforced. There was some debate over whether or not this particular ordinance is enforceable. In the past the magistrate has refused to prosecute. Mr. Kilker informed him that an unrepealed ordinance is enforceable. Everyone here sympathizes with the youngsters hanging out and making noise. We operate on a part-time basis and it takes time to handle complaints. We are small and do not have the resources and time to answer questions as quickly as we would like. This is a problem which we are still working to solve. C. Marquardt suggested that Mr. Bobarsky speak with the Mayor. Mr. Kilker said that if the officer feels the wording of this ordinance is being violated it should be brought before the magistrate. Mr. Kilker said he would go to the first hearing and maybe this would be a way to find out what the magistrate thinks is wrong.

C. Marquardt informed Mr. Bobarsky that he had spoken to Mr. Hester, the borough SEO, and the letter is on its way. The information he requires will be requested from the water company. Once all the information is gathered it goes back to zoning to decided if they will get their permit.

D. Heiser asked about the broken backboard in the gym. R. Krick informed him it will be replaced.

A resident had questions concerning replacing existing sewer lines and not being allowed to have a drain in the cellar. E. Burns, who sits on the Authority, started to answer the question. C. Marquardt instructed the resident to address this problem to GAMA directly at their meeting that is held the fourth Thursday of the month.

No further comment.

#### APPROVAL OF REPORTS

Motion to accept the minutes as submitted made by R. Krick seconded by E. Labie. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report read by C. Marquardt. Motion to accept as read made by J. Yackera seconded by R. Krick. Question? M.B. Dougherty said she wanted to bring to Council's attention the fact that since January there have been at least twenty (20) calls to Mr. Kilker's office and only four (4) listed on the log. Also, the police department has not been turning in their logs on a monthly basis. She wanted to remind everyone that all calls must be logged. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Mayor and Health Officers reports read by Mayor Ketusky. Motion to accept both reports as read made by E. Labie seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

E. Labie said he had a request from the Good Time Club to find a place to store the flags and Christmas decorations. They need a new place due to the work being done in the basement at St. Joseph's Church. Council discussed this and had no objections to storing the things in the A Street school. E. Labie was told to get in touch with them and find a place that has easy access.

Mayor Ketusky said he had a request to allow the Geisinger HMO to use the Borough Hall to hold a public meeting to inform local residents about their new health plan. After some discussion Council had no objection to this use of the building. Motion made by J. Yackera to allow Geisinger to hold a public meeting in the Municipal building. Seconded by R. Krick. Question? None. Vote. All. The question was raised from the floor if this would seem that the Borough was supporting the HMO? R. Krick noted that they have already had meetings at the Mall. Does this mean the Schuylkill Mall endorses the HMO?

C. Marquardt brought up the question of allowing use of the Borough copy machine. He suggested that Council set a policy concerning the cost and time factor. There was



discussion about how much is charged in other places. Also, he was concerned about the time involved if the Borough secretary was the one who had to make the copies. M.B. Dougherty said she did not think residents should be charged. R. Krick suggested setting criteria. The Solicitor suggested \$.25 per copy for official documents. R. Krick objected saying this could limit someone's access to public documents. C. Marquardt said he thought this was something Council check.

Mr. Kilker reported that a hearing on the Yagaleinksi case scheduled for today was continued without notice. A permanent injunction will be requested because he has cut down on the number of dogs right now. To get a preliminary injunction you have to show immediate problems. My understanding is that it has been quieter and not as bad lately. It is not a good idea to ask for special consideration without major cause such as a situation which would endanger your health. Doing so might jeopardize a permanent injunction.

In the matter of the Martha Ello property Mr. Kilker told Council Northumberland County Sheriff's Department informed him there was a problem serving the papers because she was not answering her door They are preparing an affidavit which will be sent to me. It will be a motion to have her served by substitute service. This means having it posted on the building. He also asked about the billing for the work done on the property. C. Marquardt said the bill had been forwarded to his office. Officer Shinkus cited the property for health violations and would speak with the Solicitor on this matter.

Concerning the Summer Lunch Program. Mr. Kilker said he spoke with an insurance adjuster concerning the problem with the claim. They believe it is a contractual problem between the borough and the provider, Mr. Gill. I explained to him it is an error in the paperwork submitted and should be covered under errors and omissions. He wants me to get the funding documents together and send them to him along with a letter supporting the information and they will consider the claim.

In the matter of Mr. Zangari's complaint about Officer Hummel and Mayor Ketusky an Executive session was requested by his attorney. Mr. Kilker assured Mr. Zangari that any and all complaints are taken seriously and investigated. This particular complaint will be checked The procedure is to approach the Mayor, who has the authority to check into any complaint and may refer it to either the Police Committee or the Council as he sees fit. We, of course, do not want any ethnic slurs or any insulting conduct by our employees especially the police. This is a serious allegation and is being taken very seriously.

In the workers' compensation matter and the employee demanding his job back after coming off compensation the Solicitor had the following to report. An opinion was rendered by the Mayors Association and I agree with this opinion. A part-time police officer is not guaranteed his job and does not have the same rights as a full-time officer. Also, we should insist that he is fully released and capable of fulfilling the required duties. Once he is released by his doctors from compensation the Borough stops paying. The Mayor informed Mr. Kilker that no note had been received as of today.

R. Krick asked the Solicitor how the bill for work done on the Ello property should be handled. Are we going to put a lien on the property. Kilker said that the process is the same. If we get the substitute service it will be posted. R. Krick asked if she gave the authority to go on the property and board the windows? J. Kilker said he received a letter from Mrs. Ello which gave permission to enter the property and that she would pay for the work done.

R. Krick said he has another question concerning the summer lunch program. It was mentioned that funding documents? J. Kilker said any documents that would support our argument of not receiving proper funding because of incorrect submission for funding. We are saying the error or omission is that we did not fulfill the state's requirement to get the money. I spoke with Mr. Gill and he is willing to work out an installment payment program. M.B. Dougherty asked why after two years does the insurance adjuster suddenly see things clearly? Why was this approach not taken sooner? J. Kilker said this is a difficult case. R. Krick asked why after these difficulties the new summer lunch coordinator was hired without an interview? C. Marquardt said he spoke with Susan Bobarsky before putting her application before Council. R. Krick noted there were three other applicants and he did not feel capable of voting for any of them as there were no interviews conducted. Motion made by R. Krick that any position to be filled Council be given the opportunity to interview before the position is brought to a vote. Seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

R. Krick went on to say that the amount owed on the outstanding bill is over \$7100.00. This would be sufficient funds to pave the basketball court at B Street even without any grant money.

#### **BILLS**

List of bills to be paid for the month read by C. Marquardt. Motion to pay the bills as read made by J. Yackera seconded by J. Tinari. Question? R. Krick asked if the problem with the Deitrick bill has been settle. C. Marquardt told him that we have not heard back from Deitrick. R. Krick then asked about the bill from Rick Lorady for the work done on the sewer job on East Main Street. He wanted to know when the borough hired Lorady? He was told that there were three separate lines in the ground and Rick was asked to help. There was chaos with water lines on top of water lines on top of sewer lines. When the flushing was being done everyone was in the hole at one time or another. R. Krick asked about the billing for reconnecting laterals? Are we going to pay to reconnect everyone's laterals?

R. Krick questioned the bill from Entech for engineering work done concerning the Girard Towers project. He wanted to know if Susquehanna Development was going to pay the bill? C. Marquardt said he would contact them.



J. Yackera amended his motion to pay the bills by exempting the bill from Entech for Second Street project. Seconded by J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion to amend carried. C. Marquardt then called for a vote on the motion to pay the bills. Vote. Ayes: Six (6) Nayes: one (1). R. Krick dissented. He stated he objected to the Borough paying the R. Lorady bill for \$445.00 which contains billing for reconnecting laterals.

Secretary requested permission to publish the audit results. Motion to allow publication of the audit made by R. Krick seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. C. Marquardt noted that the entire audit is available in the Municipal offices during business hours.

Secretary asked for permission to transfer funds from the General Fund to the School Building fund. Motion to allow the transfer of necessary funds made by J. Yackera seconded by E. Labie. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Finance: E. Labie said there was only the snow removal application to review and there is to be a special meeting on Monday, March 18, 1996, for this purpose. M.B. Dougherty

asked if this paperwork is going to be in Borough hall. J. Yackera said E. Labie has it now to go over what was done. E. Labie told M. B. Dougherty it would be here. She asked where it was all this time. All Borough documents were to be kept in Borough hall. I came to look at it and there was nothing available. This was always part of the previous problems with missing paperwork. J. Yackera objected saying I had the documents to work on them. I do not have the time to sit in borough hall for 2 - 3 hours. R. Krick said that at least a copy of the qualifications should have been here or even just a copy of the documents. There was policy set concerning this in January and everyone on this Council agreed. If policy is set then everyone has to abide by the rules. Each council member has the right to try to keep up with what is going on. J. Yackera apologized saying he thought the rule applied only to completed paperwork.

**Streets**: J. Tinari said the borough workers would be patching pot holes. He asked for permission for J. Hinkle to go to Harrisburg to Federal Surplus Supply. There is a bid for repairs on the dump truck which was tabled. He also asked for permission to replace the window in the pickup truck which has been broken for a long time. He had bids from three different places the lowest from Action Glass. It was suggested that even if Action Glass was the cheapest they may not be the best and was instructed to check into this further. This matter was tabled pending further investigation. Tinari informed Council that D. Hess was injured on the job and is on light duty for three days.

Parks: Nothing to report.

Police: Nothing to report.

R. Krick asked if anyone on Council was aware of one of our officers having two parking tickets thrown back at him? Do we or do we not have a policy of not fixing tickets in this town or are we going back to playing games? He said my understanding is that two council members witnessed this altercation and did nothing. J. Yackera told council that this happened at his service station. The officer and gentleman had words but the officer told the resident to give him the tickets. During this time there was an eruption from the floor. The residents were very angry over the concept of anyone being able to avoid paying parking violations. When President C. Marquardt finally got the meeting back to order the debate continued. After much debate the Mayor said he has informed the officers that no tickets issued would be fixed. R. Krick said that it should be made certain that all of Council agrees. C. Marquardt suggested that this matter be handled by the Police Committee.

C. Marquardt said he would have T. Shearn speak with the officer involved and get to the bottom of the story. R. Krick said that if these tickets were squashed we may as well burn all the ticket books because no one will pay in the future. There should not have to be an investigation. The tickets were issued and should be paid no matter who received them.

R. Krick made a motion to authorize the Solicitor, at Council's expense, to prepare the necessary petition in order to petition the Court to decrease our Council from seven

members to five members. The motion was seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? It was asked that this motion be a roll call vote.

The vote count is tied at YES, three (3) NO, three(3). R. Krick made a point of order stating that in the event of a tie vote the Mayor has the tie breaking vote. M.B. If a city the size of Pottsville can get along with only three council members we should be able to operate with five members.

Asked for his vote on the motion Mayor Ketusky replied YES. The motion carried. The Solicitor was instructed to prepare the necessary documents as soon as possible.

The Solicitor asked if Council would go into Executive Session now. Motion to go to Executive session made by R. Krick seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Meeting reopened after the Executive session that was held to discuss personnel matters.

Motion to have the Solicitor send a letter to Mr. Quinn, Mr. Zangari's attorney, asking for the complaint to be clarified. Council felt there was insufficient information to make a fair decision. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Motion to adjourn made by J. Yackera seconded by J. Tinari. Vote. All. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned.

In the matter of the replacement window for the pick up truck J. Tinari resubmitted the original three price quotes. The least expensive is Action Auto for \$130.00. Motion to have Action Auto install the window made by J. Tinari seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

J. Tinari said that the some of the work needed on the dump truck in being done by J. Hinkle.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

Resolution 96-5 that is for the sewer module to be submitted by Girard Towers was read by C. Marquardt. Motion to adopt resolution 96-5 made by R. Krick seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

At this time Council gave the floor to Mr. Greg Patryna from Susquehanna Development. This is the firm that is converting the school building on Second Street into elderly housing. Mr. Patryna explained, page by page, the revised module which Council has to consider approving. He also explained how the sewer system, which will be in use until our system goes on line, works. This system will be used in the interim and the building will be hooked up to the Borough's sewerage as soon as that project is completed.

The following narrative is read for the record.

Girardville Towers Associates has proposed the development of approximately .31 acres of land to be called Girardville Towers. This project consists of 16 units of residential elderly housing. The site is located at the intersection of Second and A Streets within the Borough of Girardville. A single unit elderly housing has been determined to provide a sewage flow of 55 gallons per day. This was determined by metering several existing elderly housing units estabilished. The combined flow for the entire complex is projected to be 880 gallons per day or 2.51 equivalent dwelling units. An equivalent dwelling unit would be a single family house. The proposed building already exists as an abandoned school and is at present connected to the existing sewer system. The treatment method of

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choice is to tap into the existing Borough collector with a single tap. Flows will be treated at the proposed Borough treatment facility.

Mr. Patryna went over the check list for the project. Everything is in order to date.

There is also a letter from the Historical and Museum Commission. This took two years to get. They thought this should be put on the register and they did not want to make any changes. We made them understand there were some changes that had to be made and they finally agreed. In the second paragraph it states the Bureau of Historic Preservation has reviewed the revised plans and specifications for the above referenced project. In our opinion the project will have no adverse effect upon the National Register listed or eligible resource listed below. That is our clearance stated Mr.Partyna.

Motion made by R. Krick to give the Municipal Secretary authorization to complete the necessary signatures and seals on the module. Seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

C. Marquardt read Resolution 96-6 eliminating employee contributions to the police pension fund for the year 1996. This resolution is to be passed on the advice of the Auditor General's office advice. It is something that should be done on a yearly basis as long as the Borough's Police Pension Fund is self supporting. Motion to adopt Resolution 96-6 made by J. Tinari seconded by T. Shearn. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

C. Marquardt informed J. Tinari that he received a certificate of training for the Drug and Alcohol/CDL program from PSAB.

Ultimate Home Health Care has requested permission to rent the Municipal building for their chicken dinner fund raiser. They would need the building on May 15th from 1:30 - 6:30 PM. Motion to allow Ultimate to use the building for a fee of \$75.00 made by J. Yackera seconded by J. Tinari. Question? R. Krick asked about the price and C. Marquardt said that is what they paid last year. Vote. All. Motion carried.

J. Yackera asked Council for funding for both the Little League and the Teener League. He was approached by both but more for the Teener League. He said the Teener League field is in very poor condition especially due to the bad weather. I feel these are organizations that do a lot for our children. There are no dugouts or a backstop. He wants Council to give \$500.00 to each organization. Motion to make a donation of \$500.00 to both the Girardville Little League and the Girardville Teener League made by J. Yackera. C. Marquardt asked is this to be used for repairs? J. Yackera said no, this is to spend as the organizations please. Motion seconded by J. Tinari. Question? M.B. Dougherty asked why these requests were not submitted at the time the budget was made? I have no problem giving the money but why didn't they ask at budget time? J. Yackera said that we should send them a letter stating that. M.B. Doughtery said they were told



about this last year. R. Krick said that last year it was asked that any organization seeking a donation send in a letter requesting a specific amount and stating exactly what would be purchased. The Teener league specifically was informed on this need. R. Krick said he has a problem with giving out \$500.00 to be spent any way. In expending borough funds there should be some control over how the money is used. J. Yackera asked why? R. Krick asked if we could have access to the books? This is tax payer money and we should have a bill to know where it is spent. J. Yackera said of course, they have to keep records. They, the Teener League, should keep minutes keep minutes of meetings and financial records which are available. R. Krick asked if they are registered as non-profit? J. Yackera told him they fall under the Little League charter. M.B. Dougherty then asked what about other groups in town? J. Yackera said to handle it case by case. M.B. Dougherty asked where the figure came from? Was is just pulled out of the air? J. Yackera said yes and he wished it was more. M.B. Dougherty suggested giving this to the recreation committee to review and offer it again to everyone? J. Yackera said that for the future that was fine but he would not rescind his motion. M.B. Dougherty asked did we give the Biddy League a donation? No. The Recreation committee got \$75.00 last year to rent the Moon Jump. Here is \$1,000.00 and what about the children who do not play? Council president C. Marquardt called for a vote on the motion. The vote was mixed so C. Marquardt called for a roll call vote.

The secretary asked Council for permission to get prices and order laser printer checks for both the Payroll and General funds. Motion to authorize the secretary to price and order laser printer checks for the Payroll and General Funds made by R. Krick seconded by E. Labie? Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

R. Krick said that he was going to suggest that Council look into hiring someone to run a morning recreation program for the children of the borough. This could give some structure and for four (4) hours at minimum wage would cost approximately \$100.00 per week. He made a motion to advertise the position and look further into this and decide at a later meeting. M.B. Dougherty asked why waste money on an advertisement when the funds will not be available? She suggested that this be planned for next year. It would be necessary to check of there are funds available. We just expended \$1,000 of unbudgeted funds. The finance committee could set up a recreation program for next year and let Council decide. R. Krick said it is clear in the minutes that if a group did not submit a request in advance of the budget then there would be no money available. R. Krick then withdrew his motion. Mr. Kilker suggested advertising for proposals and Mayor Ketusky suggested that Council donate part of their salaries to pay for a recreation director. It was

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brought up that some municipalities work with local colleges and arrange for an internship program. E. Labie said this is worth looking into for next year. The school could arrange for the student to earn credits. Mr. Crane told council that the paper work to set something like that up takes between 2 and 3 months. It is too late for this year but this is worth looking into for next year.

C. Marquardt told Council that the street sweeper will cost the same as last year and he wants to arrange this for Saturday, May 17th. It will be advertised that the borough workers will do the other streets starting on May 13th. He also asked for police assistance from the Mayor. R. Krick asked if anyone checked into the complaints received for people on East Mahanoy Avenue last time? There were residents up there who said they would rather not have the sweeper. C. Marquardt said that someone would check with those people and if there were enough then an alternate street would be done. J. Tinari asked if the State would come and do Main Street and Mahanoy Avenue because they are State Roads? C. Marquardt told him that PADOT has been asked previously and the answer is always no. Motion to contract for the street sweeper for Main Street, Second Street and Mahanoy Avenue with a possible alternate for Mahanoy Avenue made by R. Krick seconded by J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Bowen and faxed this to him. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Entech -- Both contractors have submitted the required documents for the work on the School building. R. Krick said he thinks there has to be a pre-construction meeting.

Blue Mountain Environmental Services has informed us that there has been no increase water usage at the Arcade building. This is in response to questions raised at the last meeting concerning the legality of the Arcade's use of the present sewer system.

Notices from PP&L, Bell Atlantic and Service Electric concerning the movement of the poles for the Ogden Street Bridge project. Bell will put their poles back after construction but PP&L may leave the poles in the new locations.

Notice from Northeast Waste Management that our grant paperwork has not been filed. C. Marquardt said the W. Bowen is taking care of this and he will check the status.

Service Electric sent a notice of the upcoming rate increase. There will be four (4) new channels added and basic cable rates will be \$25.00

## COMMITTEE REPORTS

R. Krick said he has something but it is not committee reports. There was a question raised about the replacement of a pavement at a corner property. The question was if it is required to place a handicap ramp. This is something needed to comply with ADA. He asked council to consider having the solicitor look into drawing up an ordinance requiring anyone replacing a sidewalk on a corner property to install handicap ramps. It would be necessary to obtain any specifications the Federal Government might have and make them available to the homeowner. This would be to our advantage in showing attempts at



compliance with ADA. Motion to authorize the solicitor to draw up an ordinance to require owners of corner properties to comply with ADA when replacing sidewalks made by R. Krick seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Finance Committee -- E. Labie noted they will schedule a meeting to go over the first quarters figures. This will be posted. He also said that at the DCA meeting there was a lot of interest in pursuing a regional police force and he suggested appointing two people to get this rolling. Perhaps one from the finance committee and one from the police committee. He made a map of the interested communities and this works without Ashland or Frackville if neither is interested. It would take nine (9) officers to supply coverage seven days a week, 365 days a year. Using the localities currently interested we could have a five minute response time. C. Marquardt said T. Shearn received some information and will set up this meeting. Labie noted there was interest in this before but nothing happened. Now is the time to get this going. We need to look at reasonable budgets, salaries, equipment, phones and benefits. J. Kilker suggested that council pass a resolution stating our intent to pursue this matter. Suggested content below.

Resolution 96-7 Borough of Girardville in interested in pursuing a regional police department. We will host the initial meeting and invite all other interested municipalities to participate. We are willing to commit resources to see the formation of a regional department through. We invite other communities to do the same.

Motion to adopt resolution 96-7 made by E. Labie seconded by T. Shearn. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Street committee -- J. Tinari reported the only business was concerning the street sweeper and this has been taken care of by council.

**Recreation committee** -- M.B. Dougherty said she spoke to M. Breslin concerning the grant application and it would be 2 weeks before any final decisions were made.

School Building committee -- R. Krick reported there is nothing being done at the school building currently. We are waiting for the scheduled work to be done. Some interest has been raised in doing the floor. There is the possibility of applying for a grant for that purpose. C. Marquardt said that the Good Times Club was given space in the basement and they have requested keys. E. Labie said that should not be necessary as both he and Charlie are involved and any time Jeanette needs access she can call either of us.

**Police committee** -- Nothing to report at this time.

**Recycling committee** -- C. Marquardt reported that the curbside recycling will begin again this month. He was contacted with a request for more information on the

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application for the shredder. The additional information has been forwarded. We are now waiting for an answer from Harrisburg.

C. Marquardt asked if there were any other matters to be discussed?

R. Krick asked if we were giving the donation of \$500.00 to each the Little League and the Teener League is this in excess of the money we agreed to give the Little League for the sand? J. Yackera said no.

R. Krick also noted that at the last meeting the solicitor was authorized to draw up a petition reduce the size of council from seven to five. You must be a registered voter of the borough to sign the petition. He asked the solicitor if a copy of the petition could be in the borough hall? J. Kilker said yes it could. He also asked if the circulator of the petition could sign and could it be anyone. The solicitor said yes to both questions. J. Kilker noted that the Borough Council can not take an official position on this and can not push the petition. Only individual registered voters could circulate the petition.

Mayor Ketusky said he had been approached about a white goods pick up which would not cost the borough anything. The individual would do it free of charge but only if he was the only person with permission to make the collection. There were some questions about liability in the event the goods were not disposed of properly. C. Marquardt gave this to the Street committee to look into and possibly set up.

The solicitor had the following:

Concerning ordinance 90-3 which involves loitering. The ordinance is not repealed but may not be enforceable by the Court. It can be unenforceable due to vagueness. There need to be very specific standards of conduct set out in the ordinance. I will rewrite the ordinance in accordance with the various court decisions to make a loitering ordinance enforceable. Our current ordinance would require the person to be given a warning first. You should also look into enforcing other ordinances such as littering at the same time. If you wish I can have a sample ready for the next meeting or Council can look over the information supplied and come up with some ideas of how you want to approach this ordinance.

The Yagilenskie matter had two hearings. He failed to appear and was found guilty. The amount of money to be paid monthly on the fines was increased. I understand he has stated that for every time we cite him he will increase the number of dogs. The petition for a preliminary injunction was filed today. The complaint to abate a nusinance will be assigned to a judge tomorrow morning and a hearing date will be scheduled.

In the Ello matter. Due to the fact that she will not come to the door so I will file asking for substitute service. This will involve posting the notice.



Summer Lunch. There should be some proposal concerning what to do with this. Part depends on the caterer and what he is willing to do and part depends on any answer received from Hartford. I should have some resolution to this matter by the next meeting.

C. Marquardt asked about the incident occurring the other concerning solicitation in the borough. Kilker said that this is also connected with the loitering problem. We have to set standards of conduct. This will also include the other incident which occurred with the tickets. A specific policy must be set. Some communities allow a citation to be withdrawn only at the magistrates' offices and some do not allow the withdrawal under any circumstances. This is something the police committee should investigate. Look over this and come up with a policy. The standards should be clearly set. C. Marquardt brought up a solicitation information sheet. He asked if this could be advertised and used in the mean time. J. Kilker said this should wait. It could cause problems. An ordinance should be enacted.

No further business or comments.

Motion to adjourn made by J. Tinari seconded by T. Shearn. Vote. All. Meeting adjourned.

#### **OPEN MEETING**

The meeting was opened by President Charles A. Marquardt leading the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### ROLL CALL

Members present: M.B. Dougherty, R. Krick, E. Labie, C. Marquardt, T. Shearn, J. Yackera. Mayor Ketusky. Solicitor J. Kilker. Councilman J. Tinàri arrived late.

## PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Crane asked the solicitor to give a report on the court order concerning the dogs. This report will be given later in the meeting.

There was a resident complaint about a man in town who is approaching children at the bus stop. She wanted to know if this person was a vagrant or resident. If he is a resident is he paying taxes? Also, he is going into businesses in the Borough and then calling the police saying people are beating him up. C. Marquardt asked the Mayor to have the police check into the allegations. The Solicitor said that vagrancy and loitering ordinances are suspect but he could be charged with making false reports. M.B. Dougherty said that anyone renting apartments is supposed to file reports with the Borough. It is the tax assessor's job to make certain all names are registered. If you are aware of anyone you think is not on the books contact the tax assessor and she can check her lists.

C. Marquardt said this is one of the things that will be taken care of soon. Judy Haluska, the tax assessor, is supposed to speak with Betty Dougherty, the tax collector, and get a listing of all landlords in the borough and notify them of the requirements of the ordinance.

**Minutes:** Motion to accept as submitted made by R. Krick seconded by J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report: Motion to accept as submitted made by T. Shearn seconded by J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. C. Marquardt noted the annual PADOT usage of funds report had been returned approved subject to audit.

**Tax Collector's Report:** 4/9-4/25 -- \$16,673.32 4/26-4/30 -- \$10,130.15

Motion to accept the reports as submitted and permission to pay the tax collector's commission made by J. Tinari seconded by J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Mayor's Report/Health Officer's Report: Read by Mayor Ketusky. Motion to accept as read made by R. Krick seconded by T. Shearn. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. M.B. Dougherty has been asked by residents why our police reports do not appear in the paper? The Mayor said that the reports are sent but the Republican/Herald does not always publish them. C. Marquardt told the Mayor to instruct the Officers to submit them monthly and maybe they will be printed.

## **UNFINISHED BUSINESS**

The Borough received another bill from Deitrick for hauling fees. J. Tinari said they are checking on it and he hopes to have an answer soon. They are apparently saying there was another bill for hauling which we never received.

The amendments to the building permit still have not been done. Copy of Ashland's ordinance were not received. The Solicitor said he could prepare this for the next meeting. The Solicitor reported on the results of the Yagielniskie hearing. Copies of the Court Order were distributed to each council member. This outlines the preliminary injunction and the steps to be taken. A final decision will be made at a future date. The Solicitor will have to prepare a response in a few months. J. Kilker said we can interpret this as a win but while winning a preliminary injunction does not necessarily translate into winning a permanent injunction it definitely helps. The expert witness retained seemed to be the fatal blow. He reported that it is cruel to expect the dogs not to bark in a town setting. Mr. Ritro said that Yagielniskie has started to clean up the mess but the dogs are still there. R. Krick asked if there is no reply does the injunction stand to which Mr. Kilker said no a hearing will still be held. The neighbors were instructed to contact Mr. Kilker directly if there are problems after Monday. We can still cite him for any barking and noise violations but can do nothing directly about violations of the court order. If the order is violated a petition for contempt of court must be filed.



Mr. Kilker noted that on the question of the possibility of amending he loitering ordinance the minutes reflect that Council was to go over the suggestions from last meeting and have a decision of how to approach this matter. Discussion about what changes Council wants made brought out addressing the criminal mischief, especially at the Bank and the littering that goes on as a result. J. Kilker said that some sections should be enforceable and he would do some further research in the matter. Motion to authorize the Solicitor to prepare amendments reflecting these changes made by J. Tinari seconded by R. Krick. Question? (discussion above) Vote. All. Motion carried.

J. Kilker submitted a short ordinance that pertains to sidewalk replacement and the Americans With Disabilities Act. It orders compliance with ADA and OSHA or permits will be denied. Motion to advertise this proposed ordinance made by R. Krick seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Mr. Kilker said that in the Ello matter he was asking for a special order of the Court to serve by regular mail. If Council verifies with the signatures of the President, Mayor and Secretary this can be done on Monday. Motion to authorize the Solicitor to serve Martha Ello by mail made by R. Krick seconded by T. Shearn. Question? R. Krick asked about the cost and was told only the cost of mailing. J. Tinari asked what happens if there is no answer? J. Kilker said if she does not answer there will be a hearing by default. Mrs. Ello will be subpoenaed. Vote. All. Motion carried.

In the matter of the 1993 Summer Lunch bills J. Kilker said the insurance will not pay. He spoke with Mr. Gill who will accept payment in installments on the original bill of \$7,156.15. J. Kilker suggested an initial payment of \$1,000 if possible and arrangements for regular monthly payments until completed. Motion to advertise for a part time police officer with Act 120 certification made by T. Shearn seconded by J. Yackera. The ad is to be placed for, Saturday, May 11, 1996, with a deadline of May 24, 1996. Interviews will be scheduled before the next Council meeting. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Motion made by E. Labie to schedule a meeting with the surrounding communities who might be interested in pursuing a regional police force. The date of the meeting to be, June 4, 1996, at 7:00 PM in the Borough Hall. Seconded by J. Yackera. Question? Is this a formal meeting? E. Labie said it should be treated as an informal work session to see just how much serious interest there is in this matter. Vote. All. Motion carried. Letters to be sent to Gilberton, West Mahanoy Twp, Gordon, Ashland, Frackville, and Butler Twp.

M.B. Dougherty suggested making a policy concerning absences. We do not want our officers calling in so they can work somewhere else. Most places have this type of policy and it is updated regularly. It becomes a case of abide by it or walk. If we are planning to hire another officer the policy should be in place ahead of time. T. Shearn said you cannot dictate to a part time officer as he has no vacation or sick days. R. Krick suggested it be if you miss so many shifts. M.B. Dougherty and T. Shearn will work on a policy.

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C. Marquardt received a letter from the Schuylkill Chamber of Commerce. There was a meeting over here at the East End park with Mr. Donlin and we are going to submit for funding for fencing the park. The program is run in conjunction with PP&L. The cost of the materials is covered and the Borough must cover the labor costs. The application was filled out using the numbers from Lok-Weld and we just have to wait to hear from them.

C. Marquardt asked is Mayor Ketusky had been in contact with Mr. Franks concerning prison laborers. E. Ketusky was told to contact the Sheriff's Department directly. A letter must be sent outling what job you want done and how many men you will require. The Borough must supply all the necessary tools to complete the job. They will not do skilled labor. The purpose is not to take jobs away from local contractors. C. Marquardt asked if anyone on council had suggestions for projects. He suggested cutting the brush along the creek. He then said that we would come up with a specific project and get the details together and have the secretary send the letter.

R. Krick noted that concerning the resident complaint about persons living in town and not paying taxes needs to be addressed to the tax collector. This is a problem with all the buildings which are rented in the entire borough. He said he thought the tax assessor was responsible for getting to the landlords to register their tenants and that Council by motion asked for monthly reports. Nothing has been heard from J. Haluska since January. C. Marquardt said that J. Haluska and E. Dougherty were to have a meeting and get the current list. R. Krick asked if policy in this matter would be to file in Borough Hall? M.B. Dougherty said the tax assessor should have all the papers and be on top of this matter.

R. Krick said it was brought to his attention that in filing for Federal Funding the Borough submitted damage to our sanitary sewer system. He thought this strange because we currently do not have one. J. Yackera told Council that during the meeting in Pottsville everyone was told to check all the boxes applicable to borugh property. There was to be a team come and check out exactly what type of damage occured. R. Krick noted that the forms had two boxes, one for storm drains and one for sanitary sewers. He just wanted everyone to be aware that he was asked if we had a sanitary sewer system which we do not.

In another matter R.Krick said that at last months meeting when the motion was passed to give both the Teener League and Little League \$500.00 he thought policy was that requests had to be in writting and that is why the NO vote. He had a copy of a letter sent to D. Mulligan in July 1995 stating that the Borough would expect a request for funds to list exactly what the money would be used for and that it be submitted in writting before the budget was set. He voted against the funding request because it did not comply with what he understood was policy. He asked what policy was going to be in this matter? Do we have policy? Other groups need to know how to apply to Council for funding. We have to have a set policy or you may as well throw the budget out the window. R. Krick said that passing a resolution stating policy in every matter is ridiculous. E. Labie said that the Teener League was a specific problem. They did not ask for money last year and



then submitted bills expecting them to be paid. They were politely asked to comply and still saw fit not to send a letter. J. Yackera said this is a case of the same person running the organization with different assistants. The Solicitor suggested that the finance committee be responsible for setting policy concerning budget items.

### PUBLIC COMMENT

It was asked if the finance committee was consulted to see if there was enough money in the budget to cover those donations? C. Marquardt said the finance committee meeting was held the following week.

Concerning these M.B. Dougherty asked do not they have to provide proof of a handicap permit from PADOT? J. Kilker said yes that was part of the requirements.

C. Marquardt noted that the handicap parking sign was removed from in front of Heisers.

J. Kilker introduced Ordinance #96-1 that requires sidewalks being replaced meet ADA and OSHA requirements. This was duly advertised on, June 5, 1996, in the Evening Herald. Motion made by R. Krick to adopt Ordinance #96-1, seconded by E. Labie. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.



- J. Kilker said that concerning ordinance #90-3, vagrancy and loitering, most of the sections would be considered Constitutionally vague. You have to wait 45 days for the ordinance to be advertised and adopted. Anyone has the right to petition not to vacate. There must be a public hearing. Several reasons not to vacate the street would be a question of damages, loss of access or any other reason. R. Krick suggested that she check with Girard Estate. J. Kilker will tell her she should have it surveyed and a legal description drawn up. It would be her responsibility to make certain that the Borough could convey good title. The potential offer is \$800.00

Stermer of DEP is on vacation and the question of the sewer is in DEP hands. Until we have further information from DEP the Borough is not in a position to make a decision.

Notice from Kenneth McClain, PADOT engineer, Reading, Blue Mountain Northern is planning the needed repairs on the three (3) railroad crossings it owns in Butler Township.

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The crossing on the Flicker Hill is tentatively scheduled for August 19 - 23, 1996. The road will have to be closed for one (1) week during the repairs. The schedule is subject to PADOT approval of the repair plans.

The Recycling report for 1995 is in the office if anyone is interested.

## **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

**Finance:** E. Labie told Council we were not successful in our application for a Keystone grant for the basketball courts. There will be another round and we can reapply. It might be worth looking into how to fine tune our applications to make them more competitive.

There will be a Budget committee meeting on August 19th at 7:00 PM unless it needs to be rescheduled. There is another Regional Police meeting scheduled for July 18th at 7:00 PM. Ashland is planning to attend and seems very interested. The various communities will be filling out DCA forms which give a better handle on needs and feasibility.

R. Krick noted that Recreation was budgeted \$9,000.00 which is more than 1/2 the grant application of \$12,000.00. Council should think about taking the money out of general funds and just doing this project. M.B. Dougherty said that if we did not have a policy of giving away unbudgeted funds this would be possible. Again the question of applying to the Borough for donations was raised. The budget committee should come up with some way of dealing with this problem. It was suggested that a deadline of September 30th be set.

**Streets:** J. Tinari said that we received three price quotes on weed killer. R. Krick suggested asking for the HAZMAT information on toxicity before ordering any weed killer. This was tabled.

**Recreation:** M.B. Dougherty said there will be a band concert outside the Borough Hall on July 16th at 7:00 PM. The Third Brigade Band is being sponsored by Schuylkill County Council for the Arts and the Schuylkill County Commissioners. The shed is still standing but J. Hinkle is talking to E. Burns about knocking it down. Placing mulch under the swings should be okay. There are no regulations but rubber matting or shredded tires is what is recommended when information is requested. Porcupine Pat will be at the East End Park August 6, 7, & 8.

**School Building:** R. Krick said the roofs are done. The heating is scheduled for August but no word from the contractor as to when they will start. The inquires about rentals are starting and we will have to see how it goes. C. Marquardt said that we are still checking into the gym floor.

Police: T. Shearn said the only thing to report is the hiring of the new officers.

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**Recycling:** C. Marquardt said a request to submit more information on the chipper grant was received. Recycling in general is going well and Gilberton Borough is encouraging its' residents to participate in the drop off program in Girardville.

At this time the Solicitor took the floor. There are three (3) easements needed by Entech Engineering for the Ogden Street Bridge project. These must be signed in order for the replacement to proceed. J. Hinkle will take care of having them signed. The properties are the Ranger Hose Co., Shalamanda's and Kessler's.

Draft ordinance to allow Council to set fines and costs by resolution instead of having to readvertise ordinances submitted for Council review by the Solicitor.

Draft vagrancy ordinance for Council's consideration submitted for Council's review by the Solicitor.

During the Solicitor's report the floor was opened to the public for comment due to discussion of the Ello property.

Mr. Kilker informed both Council and the concerned residents that after trying repeatedly to serve papers through the U.S. Mail and the Martha Ello has been served by mail. He said that this process was granted after convincing Judge that she would not answer the door or accept certified mail. We had to prove that she has been playing games in this matter for a long period of time. She has previously not had official service. The letter was mailed to her address on Pear Street in Shamokin. There is a twenty (20) day period for notice of intent. After that elapses, in ten (10) more days a request can be made to the court to sign an order. The approximate date will be August 11, 1996, which is the next Council meeting. We can request a nuisance order directing her to correct the problem in thirty (30) days. After that time the Borough can take any actions necessary and place a lien on the property. The question is if we get what we want can we handle it. Council agreed with the residents that this problem has gone on too long. The buildings are a health and fire hazard. Recently children were found inside. J. Kilker said we are close to the end legally. M. Olivieri, a resident, raised a question concerning a newspaper article. M.B. Dougherty said the report was inaccurate. If you read the article it presumes she had already been served. At that time the Northumberland County Sheriff's office was attempting personal service. M. Oliveri wanted to know what would be done with the buildings? J. Kilker told her it depends on the Court. Hopefully, they could be torn down. S. Earll, a resident, said that the buildings would have to be cleaned out before being torn down. There are resident pigeons, rats and who knows what else. E. Labie noted this would be a major expense for the Borough. A lien could be placed against the property which is worthless and the Court can't force her to pay. J. Kilker said we could ask the Court for judgment against any properties she owns. He said there is no doubt that this matter should have been handled more aggressively. R. Krick said the bottom line in this is lack of money to pay a code enforcement officer. He said that like looking at combining local police departments an effort should be made to share an enforcement officer. When the matter of costs came up M. Oliveri asked what about all the donations made to private

organizations which do have fund raisers. She suggested the Borough stop making charitable contributions and put that money to use paying a code enforcement officer. R. Krick said she should attend meetings and voice her opinion when it comes to giving away money.

From the floor S. Earll asked what the \$1,000 for Gil's Catering was about? M.B. Dougherty explained the problems with the 1993 SFSP and the resulting debt that is just now being paid. The fact is that there were paper work problems and funds are not missing they simply were not applied for in a timely and proper fashion.

Motion to have the solicitor advertise draft of ordinance to modify fines and costs by resolution made by R. Krick seconded by E. Labie. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

J. Kilker read the draft of the vagrancy ordinance. Motion to have the solicitor advertise the draft vagrancy ordinance made by R. Krick seconded by J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

After this draft was read there was discussion from the floor concerning the loitering problems being experienced. E. Labie said that the Borough has to look at the policy of closing the parks. We have to give the kids someplace to go and closing the parks has not cut down on the littering or the vandalism. He also suggested Council look into changing our curfew ordinance. Perhaps lowering the age to 16 or advancing the hour to midnight. J. Kilker said that he did not recall any request to investigate the curfew ordinance.

C. Marquardt noted that Susquehanna Development has cut the grass and weeds on Second Street as requested. The sewer module which Council passed is in front of R. Stermer at DEP. G. Patina is waiting to hear from him.

No further business.

Motion to adjourn made by T. Shearn seconded by J. Tinari.

## COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance: Meeting scheduled Monday, August 19th at 7:00 PM for preliminary budget discussion. Plan insurance payments and talk about new COPS grants.

E. Labie noted there will be another Regional Police meeting on Thursday, August 15th. The other municipalities are bringing representatives from their police departments. Some members are going to visit Northern York to see how this works. The group is better organized and have elected a Chairperson, Vice-chairman & Secretary. There will be regular monthly meetings here at Borough Hall on the third Thursday of each month. Shenandoah is also interested in possibly participating.

Recreation: M.B. Dougherty reported currently swing seats are being replaced and the benches at the basketball court will be painted. Under consideration is replacing broken baby swings. Have gotten three (3) prices. C. Marquardt suggested looking into how many there are and waiting until next year. This could be part of the recreation budget. The borough workers will have to get one of the picnic tables out of the creek behind the East End Park.

Streets: J. Tinari reported a blocked sewer at the municipal building. If the acid does not work we might have to dig. M.B. Dougherty asked about the status of the shed removal. C. Marquardt said it has to be cleaned out first. C. Marquardt noted the article concerning parking during the renovations at St. Joseph's Church. There will be no parking at all on Main Street and Richard Street will be blocked off during the day.

Police: Problem with the Chevy. Officers keep being stranded. J. Yackera said they will have to go to one car. Mayor Ketusky asked what would cost be if the problem is with the computer. J. Yackera gave estimates of \$300 - \$350 and it is difficult to diagnose. He will take a look on Monday or Tuesday. It was noted there was a lot of positive feedback on the practice of E. Nesgoda walking around town. The new tires are on the Chevy and C. Marquardt asked that we pick up the old ones. If they are not salvageable they can be used to hold down the tarps.

Recycling: C. Marquardt reported that C. Fritz from DEP came down to go over the chipper application. Mahanoy City attended the meeting and is interested in going in on this with us. This makes four communities willing to participate in the joint venture. The application will go from Wilkes-Barre to Harrisburg. We cannot expect to get the chipper before early spring. Girardville will be the host municipality. Each of the participating communities must submit letters accepting responsibility for the chipper when it is in their possession.

### OTHER BUSINESS

E. Labie said he wanted to discuss the borough policy of closing the parks at dusk. Having them closed has not alleviated the vandalism. He suggested it might be a better course of action to open the parks until curfew and that might get some of the kids off the corners. It would be easier for the officers to patrol if they knew most of the teens were in the park and not all over town. The only way to solve some of the problems would be to have 24 hour police because most of the problems occur when they are off duty. The Mayor asked about getting more light in the parks. C. Marquardt said the Recreation committee could look at that but in the past lights were always smashed. Motion to open parks until curfew made by J. Yackera seconded by J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. Ayes: Five (5) members, M.B. Dougherty voted NO. Motion carried. It was asked from the floor about the fines for curfew violation? Some of them have received fines that amount to \$65.00 - \$90.00. Is there something that can be done? E. Labie said that with the confusion over curfew hours, 10.00 PM vs. 11:00 PM anyone receiving a fine could have requested a hearing at the magistrate's office. If the fine has already been paid there is nothing that can be done.

M.B. Dougherty asked the solicitor what needs to be done with the petitions to reduce council? J. Kilker told her that whoever circulated the petition has to present them at the Prothonatary's office. J. Kilker then told council they have a decision to make in this instance. Are we going to back or oppose this action? This needs to be decided because a

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vote must be taken the first meeting after this petition is filed. Many other communities function with a five member council.

Solicitor arrived. 7:05 PM

M.B. Dougherty asked the solicitor, in relation to the Police report what could be done about diapadated properties? What would be the best way to enforce our ordinances? J. Kilker said the best thing to do would be to review the ordinances and put them by subject. Council is looking into the cost of pursuing codification which would be the best thing to do in this case. It would let us see what we have and what we need in the way of ordinances. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Tax Collector's report: Read by C. Marquardt. Motion to accept the tax collector's report and to pay the tax collector made by T. Shearn, seconded by R. Krick. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

The solicitor presented two versions of a vagrancy ordinance for Council's consideration. He did not advertise the previous version because of the questions asked concerning time and noise levels. After some discussion R. Krick made a motion that the Solicitor be given permission to advertise version "B" with the changes discussed. Motion seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

The Solicitor informed the Council that the Borough had received a default judgement against Martha Ello. She did not respond to the court. He will contact the neighbors within the next five days and compile a list of witnesses. He also suggested having someone with a demolition background as a expert witness. This would allow for a reasonable response to questions about the actual cost of demolition of the properties. e could ask for a court order for her to do this or we could execute on any property she owns to recoup costs. We will be notified on the hearing date.

The petition to reduce Council from seven (7) members to five (5) will be heard before Judge Baldwin on October 16, 1996, Court room 4 at 9:30 AM. The court has ordered that notice of this hearing be published. Both M.B. Dougherty and R. Krick offered to pay the cost of the advertisement as it was not their intention for the Borough to incur any expense in this matter. The solicitor said that Council could decide next month of what position they wished to take. M.B. Dougherty asked if Council had to take a position and was told no. J. Kilker said, however, Council should come down on one side or the other. J. Kilker will place the ad as that is what the Court ordered. Costs, next meeting.

The residents of East Mahanoy Avenue asked what could be done with the residence of 227 F. Mahanoy Avenue. J. Kilker said he was informed of this and sent a letter to both the tenants and the property owner. He hoped this would help resolve the matter. The neighbors want this taken care of as soon as possible. The house next door to 227 has become infested with fleas as a result of the condition of the dogs. J. Kilker told the neighbors they could take legal action. The Borough would have to go through the same procedure as with the Eldo case. R. Krick asked if in addition to the requirement of registering the dogs couldn't the Borough cite them for other violations of the dog ordinance? We require 25 square feet per animal and they obviously do not comply. J. Kilker said they should be cited for any violations of the ordinance. Motion to authorise the Solicitor to send a letter to the landlord and tenants giving them seven (7) days to comply with ordinance #94-2 made by R. Krick, seconded by T. Shearn. Question? None. Information concerning participation in the State's Piggyback program was received. Inorder to participate the Borough must pass a resolution and make payment of \$50.00. M.B. Dougherty asked what the participation dates are and is it worth doing this so late in the year. E. Labie suggested that Council decide exactly what it was going to purchase before participation. There is talk of a new dump truck within the next two years and purchasing a new spreader for the pick up truck. The matter was tabled.

Therewere two proposals for codification received. These were given to the Finance Comte. for budget discussion.

Carole Cooney-Syzdek a representative from the Election Bureau attended the meeting to discuss the findings of the Election Advisory Committee. They are asking to reduce the number of polling places in the Borough from either three to one or three to two. Ms. Syzdek explained that this committee was not coming in and telling local communities what they had to do, rather asking what could be done. All polls must be handicap accessible and meet the required safety standards. They are anticipating having the changes in place for the primary election in 1997. If there are any repairs needed on the voting booths call Betty Dries at 628-1467. After some discussion Council decided that one polling place is not feasible but that the Borough could get by with two. This would require dividing the Middle Ward between the East and West Wards. Now Council must discuss where to draw the new lines and establish a polling place for the West Ward. Ms. Syzdek thanked everyone for their time and attention.

Request from L. Olson that Biddy Basketball be allowed to hold monthly meetings in the Borough Hall on the last Tuesday of each month at 7:30 PM. Motion to allow Biddy use of the Borough Hall made by E. Labie, seconded by T. Shearn. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.



Mrs. McDonald brought to Council's attention a problem with tree limbs and brush left on a property adjoining hers. The property belongs to Reverend N. Smith. Mayor Ketusky said that he would look into this and if necessary send a letter to Rev. Smith. He assured Mrs. McDonald that this would be taken care of promptly.

Mrs. Budritis asked whom she should call if R. Tyson comes to his property and C. Marquardt is not available? The Mayor informed her that the police could not handle this complaint as it is a civil matter and not criminal. C. Marquardt said that he is being cited on health violations and letters are sent. Whenever we request he cleans up the garbage he always complies. The reported car does not run but if the plates and sticker are good it cannot be towed. C. C. Marquardt introduced Resolution #96-12. This resolution allows Entech Engineering to submit and application for CDBG funds with the County on our behalf. We are applying for handicapped bathrooms, accessible front doors and outside lighting for the school building. Motion to adopt Resolution #96-12 made by J. Yackera, seconded by J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

SFSP - Required form asking if we will participate in the 1997 Summer Lunch Program. Motion to participate and send in the required form made by J. Tinari, seconded by T. Shearn. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Discussion of the Keystone Grant application raised a question. M.B. Dougherty thought that this had to be done by resolution but there was none in the packet. Council decided to err on the side of caution. Motion to adopt Resolution #96-13 to apply for Keystone Grant funding for the East End Park made by M.B. Dougherty, seconded by J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

C. Marquardt informed Council of a letter received from the Commissioner's officer stating the Borough would not be receiving our 1997 County Liquid Fuels allocation. He went on to say that there is a drain box replacement project on East Mahanoy Avenue that needs to be done. Current bids put the price at \$3480. He spoke with the County Administrator who said the Borough could have 1/2 of the allocation, \$1375.00. After some discussion a motion was made by M.B. Dougherty to send a letter to the Commissioners explaining that we had already planned this project expecting the 1997 funds. All the money in escrow is to be used to repave streets after our new sewer project is completed. Motion seconded by T. Shearn. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Bid from M&W Paving for the drain box project was tabled until a second bid could be obtained.

C. Marquardt introduced Ordinance #96-4, Tax Levy for 1997. This ordinance sets the new tax rate at 6.2 mils. Motion to adopt Ordinance #96-4 made by J. Tinari, seconded by E. Labie. Question? M.B. Dougherty asked to have the changes explained. R. Krick said he wanted to make sure that everyone knows that this is not a tax decrease. E. Labie

said that due to County wide reassessment the 6.2 mils brings us in line within the 5% allowable. This is an increase in property taxes. R. Krick asked again if this is a tax increase of 5% percent. E. Labie said yes it is a tax increase. Mayor Ketusky asked how much of an increase and E. Labie told him it would raise an additional \$2100. #### COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance: E. Labie reported that due to receiving federal funding over \$25,000 we will be required to have an audit performed. It is possible to have a single program audit for both the COPSFAST and the Summer Food Services Program reported as one. We will have to check into costs involved. A full audit could run between \$3,000 - \$5,000. Unfortunately for us the new legislation that raises the minimum to \$300,000 takes effect for 1997. The Secretary was instructed to check into costs of single program audits and finding a firm willing to take us as a client.

Regional Police: Next meeting scheduled for, December 19, 1996, at 7:00 PM.

Streets: J. Tinari said an application for a handicapped parking place was submitted by Reverend Horan. The application is all in order. He has suffered stroke and a heart attack. Motion to grant parking place made by J. Tinari. Mayor Ketusky asked if he was wheelchair bound? J. Tinari said not to his knowledge. J. Yackera said that the guideline for giving out these parking places has to be very strict. The question of ambulatory and nonambulatory was raised. R. Krick said he thought that policy was you had to be ambulatory in order to qualify. The solicitor was instructed to investigate if the requirements in the ordinance could be made tighter. J. Tinari withdrew his motion for

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lack of a second. M.B. Dougherty asked wasn't the subject of being ambulatory debated before adopting the ordinance? Solicitor J. Kilker informed Council that PADOT changed the wording on the easements for the Ogden Street Bridge and they will all have to be resigned.

The solicitor said he is still waiting for decisions in both the M. Ello case and the reduction of Council. He informed council that he has not billed in these matters and will not do so until they are finished.

Concerning the proposed ordinance requiring sewer hook ups R. Krick suggested it be given to GAMA for their input. Council agreed. A copy will be sent to D. Cuff and given to T. Yesalavage.

R. Krick suggested that due to the amount of the anticipated roll over the Finance committee should seriously consider setting up a Capitol Projects fund. This money could be used for emergencies and also as matching funds for grant applications. E. Labie said that he did not think unexpended funds in the amount of \$3,000 warranted such a decision. Roll over money is not excess funds. That is what pays the bills until tax receipts come in starting in March. Council will look at finances after the end of the first quarter.
