No public comment.

APPROVAL OF REPORTS

Minutes: Motion to accept the minutes as submitted made by J. Yackera, seconded by T. Shearn. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report: Report read by C. Marquardt. Motion to accept the report as read made by T. Shearn, seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Mayor/Health Officer reports: Read by Mayor Ketusky. Motion to accept both reports as read made by R. Krick, seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

M. Ello property matter. Council received through the Solicitor's office a copy of the Court order requiring the properties be repaired or torn down. Mrs. Ello has thirty (30) days to respond with action.

Council received a copy of the Court order allowing the reduction of Council from seven (7) members to five (5). This will take effect beginning this election.

NEW BUSINESS

Second bid received from Throop Contracting for replacement of sewer box on East Mahanoy Avenue. This bid was less than M&W Contracting. Motion to accept bid from Troop made by T. Shearn, seconded by J. Yackera. Question? J. Yackera asked what was budgeted? E. Labie said that \$3500 was budgeted in Liquid fuels with this project in mind. There will also be the \$1375 County liquid fuels money.

Motion to allocate County Liquid Fuel Funds for this project made by J. Yackera, seconded by M. B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Mr. Kilker arrived, 7:05.

C. Marquardt noted that Council has to fill the Permit officer vacancy. Previously, Council discussed giving a letter to the permit officer requiring anyone requesting a permit for new construction to have confirmation from the Borough's Sewer Enforcement Officer. A draft of such a letter was shown to Council and approved. Motion to give the permit officer this letter for use made by R. Krick, seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Motion to nominate Theresa Niedzwiecki for the position of permit officer made by M.B. Dougherty, seconded by J. Yackera. There were no other nominations. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. She is to be notified by mail of her appointment.

Due to Susan Bobarsky's lack of interest in the Summer Lunch program it will be necessary to find someone to coordinate the program for 1997. Motion to advertise the SFSP opening made by R. Krick, seconded by T. Shearn. The ad deadline should be January 23rd or 24th. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

The schedule of regular Council meetings was advertised with out permission due to ommission at the December. The secretary asked for a motion so that will action would be official. Motion to advertise the schedule of regular Council meetings made by R. Krick, seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

BILLS

List of bills for pre-approval presented to Council and read by C. Marquardt. Motion to adopt the list of bills for pre-approval as submitted made by R. Krick, seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

List of bills to be paid read by C. Marquardt. Motion to pay the bills as submitted made by R. Krick, seconded by T. Shearn. Question? M.B. Dougherty questioned the gas bills. She noted a discrepancy in the price per gallon. J. Yackera told her this was due to high test being put in the police cars. M.B. Dougherty wanted to know why high test is used in these vehicles? There does not seem to be any purpose. It is not as if we have a lot of territory to cover and need the gas mileage. She suggested that price per gallon and type of gas be listed on the receipt. The second question M.B. Dougherty raised concerned the \$89.00 worth of gas put into J. Hinkle's truck. Why, and where did he go? J. Yackera said this has been done for years. M.B. Dougherty said she thought that the gas was purchased only when the vehicle was used for official business and this seemed excessive. Maybe it is time to change the policy.

J. Tinari arrived, 7:25 PM.

Dougherty noted that Hinkle should use Borough vehicles for Borough business. R. Krick said we should have a policy to that effect. There should also be policy concerning the type of gas purchased for Borough vehicles. Vote on motion to pay the bills. All. Motion carried.

Motion made by M.B. Dougherty, seconded by R. Krick that no personal vehicles be used by any Borough employee for Borough business. Question? R. Krick asked the solicitor if there is a liability when private vehicles are used. Mr. Kilker said yes there is a liability. T. Shearn asked about the police using the cars to attend classes. He was told that Council already has a policy allowing that use with permission. Vote. All. Motion carried.

M.B. Dougherty asked if mileage records were kept on the vehicles. C. Marquardt told her they are kept. There are logs in all the vehicles and longer trips are also noted on the time sheets.

Motion to purchase only regular gas for the Borough vehicles made by J. Yackera, seconded by R. Krick. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

C. Marquardt said that Roaring Creek contacted us about chipping the Christmas trees. They can come on, Saturday, January 18th. He will make the arrangements with the Borough workers and volunteers.

OTHER BUSINESS

M. Ambrose asked for permission to submit the 1996 financial records to D. Mensch for the annual review. Motion to send the records to D. Mensch made by M.B. Dougherty, seconded by R. Krick. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Due to the necessity of having an audit performed estimates were being requested from Steve Slatton, Mt. Carmel and Patton & Lettich, St. Clair. Should have this information by next meeting.

J. Kilker said he wanted to go over the proposed changes for the SEO ordinance and the Handicap Parking ordinance.

There were changes in the sewerage facility ordinance suggested by GAMA attorney, Mr. Fanelli. Motion to advertise the SEO ordinance made by R. Krick, seconded by J. Tinari. Ouestion? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Mr. Kilker then went over the possible changes in the Handicap Parking ordinance. Council had asked it be made clearer. There were questions concerning the use of ambulatory and nonambulatory. Any changes in the fee schedule could be done by resolution. It was also noted, by Sgt. Hummel, that it will be necessary to add signs stating the fines and possible towing costs. J. Hinkle is to find out the additional costs of these signs. Motion to advertise changes to Handicap Parking ordinance made by J. Tinari, seconded by E. Labie. Question? R. Krick asked if the entire ordinance would be advertised or just the amendments? J. Kilker said he would advertise only the amendments. Vote. All. Motion carried.

At this time, Father Horan asked to be able to address Council on the matter of being turned down for his requested handicapped space last meeting. Council gave him the floor. He stated that now that the Girard Hose Co. Social rooms are upstairs and the Burns apartment building is open it becomes increasingly difficult for him to park. Due to his difficulty walking, having to park up by the monument is a hardship. R. Krick asked if he had not been able to park frequently? Father Horan said that lately he has been lucky but this has been a problem. At this time the other spaces were discussed. It was noted that they needed to be renewed and notices should be sent. Motion to grant a handicap parking space in front of 125 East Main Street made by M.B. Dougherty, seconded by J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Mr. Kilker informed Council that the decision on M. Ello had been received. She was ordered to remedy the situation and respond within thirty (30) days. He had no response as of yet. He is looking into possible funding sources. He did not know whether the buildings could be salvaged by Habitat for Humanity or would need to be demolished.

Council also received notice of the approval of the reduction of Council. This will take effect beginning with this upcoming election. R. Krick noted we should send a copy of this order to the Election Bureau.

There was a question raised by the Ranger's Fire Company about the easement. Apparently, Mr. Rench signed this as a trustee without asking permission first. The members have requested a meeting with Entech to go over exactly what the easement grants. There were questions over who owns the building and the land. R. Krick asked whether Girard Estate actually owns the property. We do know that the building was given by the Borough for use as a fire house and if the Rangers cease to exist the building reverts to the Borough. C. Marquardt instructed the solicitor to check into this question.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance: E. Labie noted that he and the secretary will meet next Tuesday, at 7:00 PM, to gather the information needed to complete the report for the Regional police study. The regional police meeting will be next Thursday as scheduled.

Streets: J. Tinari noted that the sewer on East Main Street is blocked again. C. Marquardt said that we had dropped chemicals down and were waiting to see if they had any effect. If we have to dig we need permits and E. Burns will be available. E. Labie suggested that if this seems to be a major problem a special meeting should be called before any expenditure of funds. There was nothing budgeted for this project and has to be discussed before hiring outside help.

J. Yackera excused himself to attend a viewing, 8:40 PM.

There was a request by Linda and Joseph Catizone for a stop sign at the north east corner where Ogden Streets rounds to Richard Street. C. Marquardt said he will check this with J. Hinkle. Motion to install this stop sign where Ogden meets Richard going west made by R. Krick, seconded by J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Recreation: No report.

School Building: R. Krick reported that so far this year rental income has increased. This time last year the figures showed \$1085 and to date we have collected \$1290.

J. Catizone said that someone keeps turning up the heat in the gym to 70 - 75 degrees.

C. Marquardt said that he would look into changing the thermostat cover. R. Krick said he noticed that people are smoking in the building. There are butts on the stage and in where the office used to be. T. Shearn noted it is a public building and smoking is prohibited. R. Krick said there are No Smoking signs posted. This needs to be enforced.

Police: T. Shearn noted that Alan Shinkus has a court hearing concerning an arrest made while still employed. He asked if he would be paid for his time? Council okayed paying A. Shinkus the time allowed for court hearings at his former rate of \$7.58 per hour.

Recycling: C. Marquardt noted that there would be no curbside recycling until April but the containers would be here each month as scheduled. He encouraged people to drop off their recycling.

Sgt Hummel submitted a letter of complaint to the Council about C. Marquardt giving two of the Borough Workers and the Secretary Christmas Eve off. He was not scheduled to work that day but felt it unfair. He is asking for compensation. R. Krick said there should be policy on this matter. What happens to Dean Hess, who was on vacation?

C. Marquardt said that the Christmas party was canceled, the workers had come out early and he saw no harm in giving the time. Last year a bonus of \$25.00 was given. R. Krick noted that was voted on by Council and given to all employees After discussion, Sgt. Hummel agreed he would accept four (4) hours comp time. Motion to offer four (4) hours comp time to Sgt. Hummel and D. Hess made by J. Tinari, seconded by T. Shearn. Question? None. Voice vote. R. Krick NO. Motion carried by majority vote.

Meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by President C. Marquardt.

ROLL CALL

PURPOSE OF MEETING

C. Marquardt stated the advertised purpose of the meeting as Personnel matters and general purposes.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Mr. Robert Wise came to show Council a letter his daughter received from Spring Crest concerning the fuel oil spill on West Main Street. Spring Crest is blaming the homeowner and Mr. Wise wanted to know what to do in this matter. C. Marquardt said he would contact DEP and they would probably have someone come down to investigate. R. Wise said that according to the letter Spring Crest is coming tomorrow morning to clean up and there is no time to contact DEP. R. Krick said to call the person who signed the letter and do whatever he tells you to do. You can call the offices as early as 8:00 AM. C. Marquardt said he would call first thing in the morning and contact R. Wise. In the meantime DEP may contact him directly. Have Spring Crest do whatever DEP recommends. Mr. Wise was asked to keep Council informed about the cleanup.

BUSINESS

T. Shearn informed Council present of the results of the Police Committee meeting. Scheduling E. Nesgoda has become a problem due to his supposedly having a job at the Lehigh Valley Mall The Mayor said he was told that E. Nesgoda told a "girlfriend" he

was the Chief of Police in Girardville. T. Shearn said it just seems to be one thing after another with E. Nesgoda. The police committee recommends letting him go.

Motion to dismiss E. Nesgoda made by T. Shearn, seconded by J. Tinari. Question? The Mayor said he would have a letter to send with a list of the Borough property to be returned. M.B. Dougherty asked if can file an unemployment claim against us? T. Shearn said that even if he did we have a file with all the problems and difficulties while he was in our employ. M.B. Dougherty asked if this would be effective immediately? It was the general consensus that if should be immediate. Vote. All. Motion carried. It was also decided to hold his last paychecks until Borough property was returned. Mayor Ketusky said he would contact Nesgoda and make arrangements.

T. Shearn asked if we would go through the applications on file or advertise? C. Marquardt said we should be able to get through with just Mike Hummel and Ted Buriak for a short time. Hummel is waiting to hear about a possible full time job with Rush Twp. The matter of filling the position can wait until we know exactly where we stand.

The question of who would fill the Health officer's position was raised. The police committee asked T. Buriak if he would be willing to take the job and he said yes. T. Shearn nominated T. Buriak for the position of health office, seconded by J. Tinari. Questions? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. Mayor Ketusky will inform T. Buriak of his appointment.

C. Marquardt informed those present of the recurring problems with the sewer line on East Main Street. He said the line is blocked again and the acid did not work. There were estimates to hire a drain cleaning service. If we have to dig, we need a permit from PADOT. The estimated figures for digging, having D. Hess and A. Beneshunas replace about 10 feet of pipe would run about \$1800. If the line is flushed we will have to winterize the hydrant. R. Krick asked if the blockage was found the last time? J. Tinari said that the last time the roto rooter cleaned out the blockage. After discussion of the pros and cons of digging the line up in the current weather the general consensus was to go ahead and do what needed to be done. Motion to dig and stay with the project until the problem is solved made by J. Tinari, seconded by T. Shearn. Question? Vote. All. Motion carried.

In the matter of filling the position of summer lunch coordinator, C. Marquardt suggested setting up interviews with the two people who applied on Tuesday at 7:00 PM and 7:30 PM. If there are any changes everyone will be notified.

Motion to adjourn made by T. Shearn, seconded by J. Tinari. Vote. All. Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENT

A. Krick reported that she had complained about the noise of the trucks being started on an adjoining property at 4:00 - 4:30 AM. She spoke with the owner and was told it would stop and that he would be moving them. It there are any problems she will come back to Council.

J. Catizone asked permission to use the gym on, Sunday, March 23, 1997, for an All Star game. Girardville will be playing Ashland. They do have insurance and a copy of the certificate will be forwarded to the Borough beforehand. Motion to allow the Girardville Biddy to use the gym for the All Star game made by R. Krick seconded by E. Labie. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. J. Catizone was told that in addition to a certificate of insurance our carrier required a rooster.

Mrs. Budraitis asked if there was any news concerning the Tyson place. Mayor Ketusky told her that Council has just appointed a new health officer and they have not yet had a chance to go back to the house. The magistrate's office told them not to be concerned about being arrested. Mrs. Budraitis said that R. Tyson is apparently taking the garbage from the front porch and she cannot see if there is a pile in the back. The Mayor told her

that he and the health officer would be going over to check out the garbage and the interior of the house soon.

APPROVAL OF REPORTS

Minutes: Motion to accept the previous minutes as submitted made by E. Labie, seconded by R. Krick. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report: Motion to accept the Treasurer's report as submitted made by M.B. Dougherty, seconded by E. Labie. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Mayor/Health Officer reports: Reports read by Mayor Ketusky. Motion to accept both reports as read made by R. Krick, seconded by M. B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Tax Collector's Report: Motion to accept the tax collector's report as submitted and to pay the tax collector made by R. Krick, seconded by E. Labie. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Snow emergency policy, this remains to be looked over by the Solicitor. C. Marquardt suggested that he and the Mayor may want to get together and discuss this matter.

The matter of M.C. O'Donnell using Borough hall for a day care remains open. There is a question of who has to approach Labor & Industry. R. Krick will notify Council if she contacts him.

NEW BUSINESS

Two bids received for the necessary program audit for 1996. The lowest estimate is from Patton & Lettich for \$800 - \$1,000. Motion to accept Patton & Lettich for the program audit made by R. Krick, seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Before reviewing the applications M.B. Dougherty asked if the amendments to the handicapped parking ordinance are retroactive. The solicitor said that they are not retroactive.

Mr. Kilker went over the changes and amendments Council requested for the handicapped parking ordinance. M.B. Dougherty asked that the ordinance read applications submitted to "Council" and not "Borough Secretary". Council after some discussion agreed.

Motion to adopt 94-4 amendments made by R. Krick, seconded by M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. Mr.Kilker will forward a correct copy of this ordinance to the Borough office.

Renewal applications for handicap parking spaces received from C. Haley, and T. O'Boyle. The O'Boyle application had a check for \$50.00 instead of \$5.00. Motion to renew both handicapped parking spaces and refund O'Boyle \$45.00 made by M.B. Dougherty, seconded by R. Krick. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

J. Tinari arrived, 7:35 PM.

Introduction of Sewer Ordinance 97-1. Mr. Kilker read a synopsis to the Council and the public. Motion to adopt ordinance 97-1 made by R. Krick, seconded by J. Tinari. Question? R. Krick asked if the sewer authority had looked at this and was told by Mr. Kilker this version had their suggested corrections and additions. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Mr. Kilker reported at this time that he thought the Council needed to look into possibilities for the Ello properties. He suggested:

- 1. Contacting Habitat for Humanity and perhaps they would look at the buildings.
- Council send a letter to the Commissioners asking that the County demolition program be reinstated.
- 3. Solicit bids by ad to get cost estimates on demolition.

R. Krick said that when we solicited bids for the last demolition we had to spec the bids and that is a process in itself. C. Marquardt asked about approaching different demolition contractors privately to get estimates.

Motion to authorize the solicitor to informally get estimates from Kitsock and Y&M from Shenandoah made by R. Krick, seconded by E. Labie. Question? M.B. Dougherty asked about dealing the infestation problem in the buildings? Mr. Kilker said he would discuss that concern. Vote. All. Motion carried. R. Krick added that on the A Street project the County required ownership of the building before demolition could occur. Mr. Kilker said that we have a court order and that should be good enough.

Pa Dot required that changes be made to the easements needed for the Ogden Street Bridge project. Mr. Kilker said he will draw up the new easements and get them approved by PA DOT before getting signatures. He stated he is still working on the question of ownership of the Ranger's building. C. Marquardt asked who would get the people to sign the easements again? Mr. Kilker said he would take care of getting the needed signatures.

Opening on GAMA. The seat currently held by T. Dougherty is open. Mr. Dougherty said he would be happy to continue to serve on the Authority. Motion to reappoint Mr.

Thomas Dougherty to GAMA for a seven (7) year term made by J. Tinari, seconded by R. Krick. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Margaret M. Hennessy has been given the opportunity to have a ramp installed on her sidewalk, with grant money for T. O'Boyle. She is required to have approval from Council and the neighboring Church. The plans would leave a 3' 6" clearance on the pavement. Council after looking at the plans had no problem granting permission for the ramp's construction. R. Krick suggested that this be submitted to County Zoning for approval and that a building permit be acquired before construction.

- J. Hinkle is currently out sick. He is having foot surgery. This leaves no one to drive the dump truck. It was discovered that we can apply to have the weight rating on the dump truck lowered. If this is done then CDL's would no longer be required to drive the truck. Motion to send in Form MV-41 to have the weight lowered on the dump truck made by J. Tinari, seconded by R. Krick. Question? R. Krick asked what the truck weighs unloaded? C. Marquardt said that the truck was not weighed. R. Krick said the truck should be weighed loaded with ashes, the plow and spreader. J. Tinari amended his motion to say the truck would be weighed first. If is weighs is under 2601 the application would be sent to PADOT if it is over the rating would stay the same. Amended motion seconded by R. Krick. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.
- C. Marquardt asked if Albert Miller and Timothy Horan could be approved by Council to drive the dump truck in an emergency situation? M.B. Dougherty asked what wage rate they would be paid? C. Marquardt said the current minimum wage is \$4.75 per hour. J. Tinari made a motion to have T. Horan and A. Miller on standby to drive the dump truck if required. Motion seconded by R. Krick. Question? M.B. Dougherty asked if only one at a time would be called and at whose direction? C. Marquardt said only one at a time and it would be under the Street Committee Chair's direction. R. Krick asked about physicals. J. Tinari said that to hold a CDL you have to pass a physical. Vote. All. Motion carried.
- M.B. Dougherty asked what J. Hinkle's status is as of today? C. Marquardt said he still has vacation and sick time available. He wanted to go into Executive session before the end of the meeting to discuss this matter.
- C. Marquardt noted the danger on the Ogden Street Bridge. J. Hinkle priced orange construction fencing to block off the sidewalks. R. Krick said this would end up in the creek. E. Labie said that an attempt would have to be made to make it safe. The sidewalks should be blocked off for safety purposes. Motion made by J. Tinari, seconded by E. Labie to purchase a maximum of two rolls of orange construction fencing to block off the Ogden Street Bridge. Question? None. Vote. Two opposed, M.B. Dougherty and R. Krick. Motion carried.

BILLS

List of bills to be paid read by C. Marquardt. Motion to pay the bills as submitted made by J. Tinari, seconded by R. Krick. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. M.B. Dougherty asked if there was any way to determine personal calls and be reimbursed? Mr. Kilker said yes, if you can determine who made the calls you can be reimbursed. After some discussion this matter was left open.

CORRESPONDENCE

Schuylkill County Planning & Zoning - notice that Girardville is not on the CDBG list.

M.B. Dougherty suggested the Borough approach the Commissioner about the money available for demolition. It will be necessary to find out who can and cannot apply for these funds. She believes first consideration should be given to communities not entitled to apply directly to the State for grant money. There is a meeting on February 19th and R. Krick said he would attend if able. M.B. Dougherty said she would contact Commissioner Knowles.

Entech - letter concerning changes needed for the easements.

Federal Surplus Supply - Notice of purchase \$15.38 applied for audit requirements.

DEP - request for information. This form was completed and forwarded.

Consumers PA Water Co. - several letters concerning the proposed water rate increase. After reading over these C. Marquardt asked if Council wanted to go on record opposing the rate increase? M.B. Dougherty contacted the PUC and has available forms that can be sent in by residents with reasons for opposition. E. Labie said that their rates are already ridiculous. He knows people who live in Las Vegas who pay less for water than we do here in Pennsylvania. This company is still acquiring small water companies and feels no obligation to the customers. Motion to go on record opposing the rate increase and sending a letter to the PUC made by M.B. Dougherty, seconded by E. Labie. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

M.B. Dougherty encouraged all residents to send letters to the PUC. C. Marquardt also noted questions that arose as a result of the recent water main breaks. There have been questions about proper notification and lack of water boil advisories. The water company will notify the Borough if there is someone in the office at the time. They call the Communications Center and Communication Center notifies the pagers. Notifying the customers is not their responsibility. C. Marquardt suggested writing a letter asking Consumers PA to address these concerns.

C. Marquardt noted that the paper work is filed on the chipper grant. The three other municipalities have sent checks to cover their part of the matching funds. This money will be used to make a downpayment on the chipper. Motion to send this money with our part of \$459.50 to Stephenson's Equipment and 10% downpayment made by J. Tinari, seconded by R. Krick. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Auditor General's Office - Thanking Council for answering question concerning filing of annual audit report.

W. Bowen - Recycling information. Notice that eventually the NSLA will in addition to a transfer station be a recycling station.

PSAB - Due to numerous complaints concerning skateboards, sample ordinances were requested. These were passed on the solicitor. Mr. Kilker was instructed to have an ordinance ready for consideration for next month's meeting.

Kreitzer Sanitation - Notice of rate increases. This is posted around town and in the office.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance: E. Labie, nothing to report at this time.

Regional Police: E. Labie noted the next meeting is next Thursday, here in Girardville.

Recreation: M.B. Dougherty reported that SCCA has made some changes in how you are notified of available programs. Evidently, each group will send a notice individually. We have received one and should be receiving more. Will look into getting more information on this program.

Streets: C. Marquardt noted the problems with sewer lines on both E. Main Street and E. Mahanoy Avenue. The Borough workers are still working on these problems. If E. Main Street has to be dug up we are looking into getting the necessary shoring material.

School Building: R. Krick said the only thing to report is that income from rentals is up from this time last year.

Police: Mayor Ketusky had nothing new to report. All matters of concern had been finished.

Complaints - there were complaints about the way the snow was plowed down in front of Immaculate Heart School. The pile was in the way of the buses and the children crossing the street. The Mayor suggested posting School Loading Zone signs. First the pile has to be removed. C. Marquardt said E. Burns will be removing the pile in the morning. Mayor Ketusky requested two signs and that the curb be painted yellow. The Solicitor suggested that before ticketing, warning notices be placed on cars. E. Labie suggested having the school send home notes reminding parents where the buses park and telling them not to block the access. Concerning the snow pile Mr. Kramer will have to make better arrangements to get rid of any snow he plows from in front of the Church. The mayor will draft a note for the school to send home.

OPEN MEETING

Meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Council President C. Marquardt. All present observed a moment of silence in memory of John Hinkle, Borough supervisor who passed away on March 14, 1997.

ROLL CALL

Members present: M.B. Dougherty, R. Krick, E. Labie, C. Marquardt, T. Shearn,

J. Yarckera. Mayor E. Ketusky, Solicitor J. Kilker.

Members late: J. Tinari

PUBLIC COMMENT

M. Merwine asked what was up with this "riot" situation? What gives people the right to smash property that belongs to someone else? The ramp that was smashed was given to the kids by Kevin White. She said that Officer Hummel took her son and threw him into the back of the police car. She also accused Hummel of using foul language. Most of this was directed at R. Krick. R. Krick then asked to be allowed to tell his side of the story. He said first can we agree that you cannot block access to a public building? Over at the A Street school building there was a group of kids skateboarding. They were asked to move so the children coming to play basketball could get into the building. No one stopped and one of them ran into me. Second, the plywood board was up against the fence that surrounds the front of the building. They were breaking Borough property. I picked up the board and threw it into the yard. At this point the discussion became a shouting match. C. Marquardt told M. Merwine she would be removed if R. Krick was not allowed to continue. R. Krick said that skateboards are not really the issue. The main issue is the property damage that results and the intimidation. There are pictures of the various locations where these kids hang out and skateboard. E. Wayne said that not all the kids are vandals. That was agreed but the damage occurs wherever they are hanging out. It was asked what is there for the kids to do in this town. There is a barroom on every corner but no place for the kids to hang out. R. Krick tried to impress upon the

residents that the Borough cannot give permission for construction of ramps due to the liability problems. C. Marquardt addressed complaints of the kids being chased all the time. He said that the kids are not chased from the parks. They are moved from the street corners when complaints of noise and littering are made. As far as the lumber and other stuff left in the park, it was removed by the Borough workers. All the things were scattered all over. We treated it as litter. The property is in the school yard. J. Kilker added that if the Borough sanctions ramps and allows skateboarding we are liable. The kids asked about money to build recreation facilities such as a skateboard park. J. Yackera explained that there is grant money but you can only use it for very specific projects. The competition for funding is fierce. Even our current playgrounds need to be updated. DCA sited numerous problems with the existing structures. We are in the application process for a grant to make improvements to the park.

- M. Merwine asked what would be done about Officer Hummel? She was told to bring complaints to either the Mayor or the police committee. This became a shouting match over who was to blame in various incidents. C. Marquardt again warned M. Merwine she would be removed or the meeting shut down if the yelling continued. E. Wayne asked about a crime watch. She was told that even though people come forward and tell about things they have seen no one wants to testify. J. Kilker asked that everyone be careful because some of the discussion revolved around juveniles and police records which cannot be discussed as a matter of public record. Council does its' best but cannot please everyone. Unfortunately, this is nonproductive. We cannot change the past but can prepare for the future.
- M. Ritro asked what happened with the facade on the old bank building on West Main Street? Mayor Ketusky said that the owner has been notified. He asked if anyone had the piece that fell.
- R. Flannery asked what was going to be done about the kids hanging out on the tracks behind the monument? J. Yackera said the problem is by the time the cops get up there the kids are gone.
- J. Clayton asked about grant money for demolition. M.B. Dougherty said that we cannot apply directly for grant money. If your population is over 3.000 you can apply directly and not have to go through the county. We will apply for any money that becomes available.
- J. Catizone asked that someone approach the Girard Towers project to contain their garbage. The wind has trash blown all over Second and A Streets. Also, they are parking where they do not belong and causing a problem with pulling out onto Second street. C. Marquardt said he will go over and talk with someone on site.
- J. Catizone asked for permission to run a concession stand for the All Star game in the gym. R. Krick asked if it was going to be just in the classroom? J. Yackera asked if he had thought about using the stage? J. Catizone said the classroom would be the best

choice. General consensus of council was to allow food in the classroom in the school building for the All Star game.

T. Niedzwiecki asked what was going to be done about the William Street bridge. The kids that hang out there are leaving all their trash in her side yard and using foul language. She does not even want to let her children playing outside. J. Yackera said dealing with the complaints about congregating can be obscure. M.B. Dougherty said that is ridiculous to have to climb over kids to get into and out of the bank. C. Marquardt said that we are trying to work on this problem. Officer Hummel is asked to disperse the kids. No one gets arrested or charged. These kids have all been told repeatedly to clean up their mess, not damage property and not block access to buildings. It was stated that not all the kids are bad but the ones causing the problems are causing problems for everyone.

participate in a group purchase of road salt resulting in savings. Motion to participate in the group salt purchase made by J. Tinari seconded by T. Shearn. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Summer Youth Employment - C. Marquardt asked Council if after the problems last year we still wanted to participate? The forms must be in by April 4, 1997. He said we would stipulate older kids who could do more kinds of work. R. Krick made a motion that we send in the application seconded by J. Yackera. E. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Solicitor: Mr. Kilker said that he needed to know exactly what Council was looking for in a skate board ordinance. The samples he had to hand had a very wide spectrum of possibilities. He and Council went over the various options. R. Krick suggested minimum public access and M.B. Dougherty suggested banning skateboards for public streets. E. Labie suggested appointing a committee to go through this and give the solicitor some general ideas. It was decided to hold a Special work session on, March 26, 1997, at 7:00 PM. The kids involved and their parents could have some input into the matter.

Concerning the Ello property, Mr. Kilker said that we would have to have title to get any possible grant money for demolition. He also noted that informal questions on costs result in many questions he is unable to answer. The Borough would have to spec and advertise for bids for demolition. We ask for volunteers and no one wants to help.

It was asked when the meeting to discuss the skateboard ordinance is being held. C. Marquardt said it is scheduled for March 26th at 7:00 PM. Everyone is welcome to attend. He only asked that the kids pick one spokesperson and that they be willing to discuss one issue at a time. The kids asked about having ramps and leaving them in the park. Council told them anything is left at your own risk. The things need to be cleaned up and out of the way. Council assumes no responsibility for equipment left in the parks. J. Yackera said that the kids who play hockey built their own nets and asked permission to chain it to the fence. They were told the same thing. The kids said that they were tired of being blamed for everything that happens. R. Krick asked if it is only coincidence that since they have been hanging out at the school building that there is graffiti and damage. You were also blocking public access to the building.

It was asked how the different organizations get money from Council. E. Labie explained that when the budget is drawn up any organization is free to request reasonable funds in writing. J. Yakcera noted that these are organizations run by adults. Mayor Ketusky noted that they also keep books to satisfy audit requirements.

T. Niedwziecki asked permission to hang soccer sign up signs in the school gym. Council okayed this.

L. Merwine asked for copies of the loitering and curfew ordinances. He was told to see the secretary after the meeting.

C. Marquardt noted that he was looking over the prices on a new copy machine. He asked that the finance committee decide whether or not this is a possible purchase. R. Krick suggested checking into the delivery schedule in case the one in the office becomes unrepairable.

The Street committee has a list of recommendations for overseeing the Street department. They also are requesting a change in the Street department's hours. After reading over the list and the new hours of 7:00 AM to 3:00 PM and after some debate a motion was made by J. Tinari, seconded by T. Shearn to accept the changes. Question? When will this be effective? Monday. Vote. All. Motion carried.

At this time Mr. Kilker introduced for consideration an ordinance banning skateboarding in the Borough. He went over each of the sections having various ways of dealing with the problem. He also asked about the outcome of the meeting with the children and their parents. M.B. Dougherty told him that Council strongly suggested they use the tennis court at the East End Park or they were looking at a strict ban. R. Krick said that as of this time nothing much has changed. The kids are still hanging out and skateboarding wherever they please. Motion to have the solicitor advertise, for consideration at the May meeting, the ordinance as follows: Sections 1, 2, 3, 4, and 5. None of the alternative sections are to be used. Motion made by R. Krick, seconded by T. Shearn. Question? J. Kilker asked if Council wanted section 5, which gives a ninety (90) day trial period

included? R. Krick said that the motion included section 5. Vote. All. Motion carried. J. Kilker said he would add an introduction stating that this ordinance is being adopted due to complaints and safety concerns.

There were questions from the floor concerning liability. M.B. Dougherty said that even having a park is a liability. R. Krick said that as long as the ramps are not ours we are not liable. J. Kilker also noted that signs stating that skateboarding is prohibited must be posted.

J. Kilker said that concerning the Ello property he is going to speak with Vince and Melissa Brennan. Attorney O'Rourke from Schuylkill County is working on demolition funds. Ownership is a problem. The Brennans are considering hiring their own lawyer. He is going to encourage them to do this.

Concerning the Ogden Street bridge easements Mr. Kilker said that they went to the engineer and he will call and check on the status.

Biddy Basketball All-stars -- Thank you note for all the assistance and use of the gym. Enclosed was a donation of \$100.00 for the school building fund.

Representative E. Luyck -- Note concerning the two MIA flags given to the Borough. A thank you note was sent to his office. The flags are flying at the municipal building and the Vietnam memorial.

Commonwealth of PA Department of General Services -- Notification of receipt of participation contract for salt purchases.

Service Electric -- Letter informing Council of the intended rate increase and new channels.

PUC -- Letter acknowledging our complaint about the proposed rate increase by Consumers PA Water company. Also, forms for registering formal complaints to testify at the public hearing.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Finance: E. Labie said that the committee would have a meeting to look at copier costs. At the same time a review of the costs for repaving the basketball courts would be done. This meeting will be scheduled some time within the month.

Regional Police: Regular meeting next Thursday, April 17, 1997.

Streets: We received the chipper from Stephenson Equipment. The mechanic is coming to go over the operation and maintenance with all the communities next Wednesday. We have set up the schedule and are sending a copy of the final agreement to Chris Fritz as requested. C. Marquardt said that hopefully the trees will be done before having to send the machine to Mahanoy City. E. Labie asked how the chipper time will be divided? Marquardt said that each municipality will have it for two weeks at a time starting with us. The only question is where Gilberton will store the machine when they have it. HE asked about looking into putting a garage door under the gym for winter storage. R. Krick said he thought the cost estimate was around \$1800. We should have the estimates on file.

Recycling: C. Marquardt said that he could arrange for a white goods pickup by Mr. Knorr as in previous years and the cost would be \$200. R. Krick objected paying for this on the grounds that freon is worth about \$1,000 per 30 lbs. M.B. Dougherty asked what he does with all the stuff he collects? C. Marquardt said that he takes it to the various recycling outlets available. He will not collect wood or tires. This matter was tabled.

Curbside recycling resumes this month. The flyers will be posted. There is a display in the Council chambers and arrangements are being made to do an assembly at IHES.

Police: T. Shearn reported that there has been continued trouble with loitering. The mayor is looking into this and possible solutions. The Health officer has to stop and see the owner of the What not Shop. They have been leaving things out on Oak Street again

and furniture has ended up in the creek. It any residents have complaints please be sure to leave a message in the office or on the answering machine.

OTHER BUSINESS

C. Marquardt informed everyone that Council had interviewed four (4) people for the position of Street department supervisor. Out of the four the general recommendation was for Leonard Petusky. E. Labie made a motion to hire Leonard Petusky to fill the supervisor position. Motion seconded by T. Shearn. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. Council thanked Mr. Petusky for applying and told him to start on Monday, April 14, 1997.

C. Marquardt told Council that the woman hired to run the summer lunch program is not available. He and others have asked numerous people and there is no one interested in this job. Without someone to run the program the Borough will not be able to not participate this year. It was suggested that REDCO be contacted. C. Marquardt said that he will continue to look for someone, however, the paper work deadline is April 30, 1997.

Summer Youth Employment Program paperwork has been submitted and Council instructed the secretary to have them add L. Petusky's name to the list of supervisors.

Girard Towers -- C. Marquardt said they have approached about the problem with the garbage and uncovered dumpsters. There should not be any further problems. It was asked from the floor when the apartments will be rented? Our information is that as soon as construction is completed applications will be taken.

R. Krick said that he had a request from GAMA that the finance committee attend their next regular meeting. They have no money and apparently the attorney will no longer do any work without payment. It needs to be checked if there was a financial agreement of some sort with the original attorney. This is a problem that needs to be sorted out quickly.

Wm. Penn Fire Co. requests permission to route their parade through borough streets on June 14th at 7:00 PM. They also request help for traffic control from the police department and the fire police. Council granted permission. Mayor Ketusky said that he will make the necessary arrangements.

Audit for the Summer Lunch and COPSFAST has been completed, the results are available in the office.

Schuylkill Chamber of Commerce - R. Krick and E. Labie met with D. Donlin concerning the PP&L grant. It was decided to apply for money for the School building. The chamber submits the grant and if awarded they take \$800.00 administrative costs.

DEP - Receipt of the okay for the chipper grant received by Harrisburg.

Commonwealth of PA - 1997 Liquid fuels allocation received.

L. Catizone - Letter read by C. Marquardt. L. Catizone is concerned because Biddy Basketball does not have a charter, has not held elections and there are questions concerning the finances and accountability. C. Marquardt said that his understanding was that elections are being held at the next meeting. D. Heiser, president, said that financial reports are made at each meeting. Elections were delayed because he forgot to send notices so that everyone with a vote would know to attend. He said that the current officers were appointed by Council for insurance purposes. M.B. COMMITTEE REPORTS

Regional Police: E. Labie said the next meeting is May 15th at 7:00 PM. He asked that Council make plans to attend the June meeting. The preliminary report, projected costs of \$1.5 million dollars for the 10 participating municipalities, was just made avaliable. Information and recommendations from the state will be available in June. The decision will then be Council's whether or not to participate in the program. It will cost us more per hour but will result in 24 hour protection. There will be public hearings before any decisions are made. J. Clayton asked who decides? E. Labie told her that Council has the final decision. They need to attend the meetings in order to make an informed decision. Currently we pay \$14.00 per hour of protection. Projected costs will be \$28.00 per hour. Which is better, lower costs or more protection?

Finance: Repaying the courts is up for discussion. Labie suggested having a meeting to discuss the details, what is to be done, borough workers, volunteers, bid specs, etc. This should be done soon. Possibly at the Special Meeting to be scheduled.

Recreation: Request to use the Borough Hall and B Street on May 31 st for G.A.R.C.'s Bike rodeo. Council granted permission.

Streets: J. Tinari asked for an executive session for a personnel matter. C. Marquardt noted that things are getting done. Since L. Petusky was hired there has been a lot of work done at Borough hall, the sewer problem on E. Main Street has been solved, the W. BUSINESS

- C. Marquardt introduced Resolution 97-2, to apply for County Liquid Fuel Aid. Motion to adopt 97-2 made by J. Tinari, seconded by R. Krick. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.
- C. Marquardt introduced Resolution 97-3, to appoint Margaret Fisher the Summer Lunch Coordinator. This is necessary for banking purposes. Motion to adopt 97-3 made by J. Tinari, seconded by E. Labie. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.
- C. Marquardt told Council that there are two bids to open for the SFSP. Gill's of Mahanoy City and Tassone's of Pottsville. The other bidder decided to withdraw because of the travel distance involved. Council read over and discussed both bids. Motion to

accept the bid from Gilcrest Corporation of Mahanoy City made by J. Tinari, seconded by E. Labie. Question? None. Vote M.B. Dougherty voted NO. The remainder of Council voted YES. Motion carried. Mr. Gill is to be notified of Council accepting his bid.

C. Marquardt said that A. Beneshunas accepted his letter. There was a meeting with him and he is aware that this was issued in the way of a reprimand. The Street Department is going over policy and should have something for the next Council meeting.

E. Labie noted that the Brownies are planning to plant flowers out front on May 24th. They are doing this as a service project and wanted to know if someone from Council needed to be here.

E. Labie said that the Regional Police committee is planning another trip to York County on Tuesday, June 16th. Anyone interested in attending can call L. Bennick in Mahanoy City. We are meeting in Frackville at 4:30 PM to form a car pool. The purpose is to attend one of the regular meeting of their board and see how things actually work. The final report is due in June or July. All the local Councils will review, decide if they will participate and form a board. The next step would be to figure costs and how share the costs. Usually three year contracts are set up with the officers to be involved. He encouraged anyone who could to attend this meeting.

The basketball courts will require 12,000 square feet. The proper sand mix with macadam that will give the smoothest finish will be necessary. The specs can be drawn up and submitted for bids. E. Labie has information already and will get this typed up on letter head with any changes. He will measure for exact dimensions. Council has to figure out what part will be done with volunteers and borough employees. The edging should come off easily but this needs to be looked into by the Street Department. Some places are already loose but some places may be harder to remove. The poles for the baskets need to be set in place before the macadam is laid. This will involve digging holes and setting the bottom sections in concrete. R. Krick was looking through the books to see what type of poles are available. The best poles were galvanized with separate bottom sections and supports built into the curved top. E. Labie said he would draw up a sketch to put with the bid and he should have all this information available for the next Council meeting.

J. Tinari left the meeting at this time, 7:30 PM

E. Labie noted a paving contractor should be done within 1 - 2 days. People will have to stay off the area for a time. He suggested that the Borough workers take some time to check if removal of the curbing will prove difficult. He will make some calls and get estimates on the cost of the proper mix.

E. Ketusky noted that there is a LTAP Roads Scholar Program meeting in Mahanoy City next month. Local municipalities are invited to send a representative from their Street Department. Also, there will be a working lunch to discuss joint purchases and equipment

sharing. Anyone interested needs to RSVP by June 16th. This information is on the desk in the Municipal Office. E. Labie said it is a good idea to look into joint ventures.

R. Krick asked that an executive session concerning the police department be held before the end of the meeting.

Police: M.B. Dougherty was approached about the problem of kids loitering around and leaving garbage at the Methodist Church on Main and Line Streets. Mayor Ketusky said he would have the police keep an extra eye on the corner and move them along. Mayor Ketusky reported that the second Crime watch meeting was not as well attended as the first. Trooper Albert informed those present that it is necessary to have one person in charge and also a secretary and treasurer. Another meeting will be scheduled and posted.

The mayor informed Council that he received a note informing him of the need to cut police hours due to budget constraints. M. Ambrose informed Council that she gave him this information in the process of working up budget numbers. Upon closer inspection, the COPSFAST money was not calculated and there is sufficient funds to continue the part time hours as scheduled. M.B. Dougherty asked about the roll over figure for the year as part of possibly adding hours to the police schedule. There has been a lot of trouble recently with break-ins and car theft. E. Labie said that balancing the budget depends on the rollover figure and you do not want to be short going into a new year. R. Krick asked if there was any discussion by the police committee to increase the police budget? E. Labie suggested that all members of Council attend the budget meetings and see if there is any way to move money into the police portion of the payroll.

M.B. Dougherty said she just threw this out and did not expect any hard answers tonight. The Mayor thought that an additional 20 hours per week should fill the scheduling gaps.

Solicitor: Mr. Kilker noted that as everyone present is aware it would be more effective to have law enforcement rather than legal action.

He received a letter from J. Yagielniskie's attorney asking for permission to once again have dogs. If Council does not agree they will file for a second hearing. It would probably be 2 - 3 months for a hearing to be scheduled. Council agreed that there have been no recent complaints from the neighbors but that is due to the fact that there are no dogs on the premises. The current court decision is a temporary injunction. M.B. Dougherty said that in her opinion there should be no discussion. When they file go for the permanent injunction. J. Kilker said that he would also petition that previous testimony be incorporated.

In the M. Ello matter the petition has been changed to contempt.

OTHER BUSINESS

R. Krick noted that he received correspondence concerning the Police pension fund. It seems there is paper work not yet completed for the year. Deadline for the submission is October 15, 1997. Because T. Shearn is the CAO for the fund he placed the mail in his box. C. Marquardt said that he would get in touch with T. Shearn and tell him about this mail.

R. Krick asked the status of the EMA plan. J. Yackera was supposed to have an updated version for approval for submission to the County. C. Marquardt said that J. Yackera was working on this and he would check the progress.

R. Krick asked what powers committees have in making decisions? There was an incident where a borough worker quit and the Street committee decided to rehire him. Shouldn't this decision have been Council's? J. Kilker said all matters should come before Council. No committee has the authority to hire or fire without Council permission. There has to be authority delegated to mete out discipline as needed, i.e., insulting behavior or refusing to follow work orders. That power can be given to the supervisor and in the case of the police the Mayor. Serious actions can warrant a special meeting but temporary measurers can be taken prior to review. Policy should be set to cover those types of circumstances.

PUBLIC COMMENT

J. Clayton asked if there were any answers concerning her complaint about the police officer? Mayor Ketusky said that having just received it this morning it was being checked out. She noted that at the very least he should be cited for littering. Mayor Ketusky informed Council this is a personnel matter and will be taken up with both the officer and if necessary with the police committee.

T. Krick asked if the two members absent had notified Council of the reasons?

C. Marquardt said the T. Shearn is working but he does not know why J. Yackera is not present. From the floor residents said that there should be reasonable excuses given for absences.

J. Clayton asked if anyone knows what the State is doing on West Mahanoy Avenue. They were working during the day and when quitting time came they left a mess.

C. Marquardt said he would contact PADOT tomorrow morning and find out what they are doing. PADOT simply comes, does their work and leave. There is no notice given the local communities.

Motion to adjourn made by J. Tinari, seconded by R. Krick. Vote. All.

Marquardt said the Mr. Joseph Wayne put the letter out for distribution. E. Burns said that the members of the Authority are doing their best to get the project underway and do not warrant any type of criticism. He admitted being the only one who might make money due to the fact that sitting on the Authority or not he will be hired to dig laterals. M.B. Dougherty asked how many easements remained unsigned? E. Burns said he thought there were two. One involves Reading for the land for the plant. He also noted that he wished more people would attend the meetings. R. Krick said there will be plenty of attendance after the first bills are sent. R. Krick noted for the record that the current members of the Authority are doing an outstanding job. The previous boards did nothing to move the project along.

Relating to the above letter, T. Krick asked where the democrats on Council stand in the matter of Regional Police? J. Yackera replied that the matter has not yet come to a vote and where he stands will be noted when the time comes.

- J. Clayton asked about the Ogden Street bridge project. She noted there are numerous rumors floating about missing funds and tax increases in relation to the bridge. C. Marquardt asked if she was will to wait for the upcoming report.
- J. Tinari arrived. 7:05 PM.

C. Marquardt introduced D. Cuff, Entech Engineering, and turned the floor over for the opening of bids and a report on the status of the Ogden Street bridge. D. Cuff noted that the deadline for receipt of bids was 1:00 PM today. Baseline Contracting had submitted a bid packet but requested it be returned before the deadline. They discovered an error in their figures. That bid was returned. Bids received, no particular order:

It was noted that each had received Addendums #1 and #2 and that 10% bonds were included. D. Cuff recommended that the bids be tabled until all could be reviewed by the engineer's and solicitor's offices for completeness. Motion to table acceptance of a bid made by J. Yackera, seconded J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

D. Cuff reported that the design phase of the bridge was paid through an 80/20 agreement with PADOT. The Borough has borne 20% of the costs of the design and engineering fees. There is a similar contract that carries through construction. Again the Borough is expected to pay 20% of the costs. The usual agreement is that the Borough would pay all costs up front and be reimbursed by PADOT. Girardville's agreement allows for submittal of invoices for reimbursement. Entech has waited for turnaround for payment. Application for funding is available to the Rural Utility Service through the USDA. This is a federal agency that helps finance projects. Estimated costs were \$80,000. Funding requests will be submitted and because this is a smaller amount than the projects usually funded turnaround could be in this fiscal year. Money could be in the form of outright grants or low interest loans depending upon financial needs. All is subject to review. Paperwork is in hand and needs Council action to be submitted. Bid documents contain schedules and weather permitting a March start is projected. R. Krick asked about the inspection fee. D. Cuff said this is set by PADOT at \$3,500 and is done by the engineering firm. Motion to proceed with the preapplication process with RUS made by J. Yackera, seconded J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. R. Krick noted that there are no guarantees that funding will be available. Down the road other sources may have to be found. M.B. Dougherty asked why the wait until now to discover the Borough must fund 20% of the cost of the bridge? R. Krick noted that in 1994 a letter was sent asking for full funding, which was obviously turned down. It seems that everyone believed the bridge was fully funded. M.B. Dougherty said that people have to be aware that without a grant we are in trouble. Not going ahead with construction is not

All the necessary equipment has been purchased and is currently being stored. The second phase is the replacement of the existing play area. DCNR awarded us a grant for that portion of the project. The contract for that \$20,000 grant has just been

voted to be signed. Bidding will be done as soon as allowed by DCNR with expected construction in the spring of 1998. The third projected phase is the replacement of the pavilion. Residents are aware of the condition of the pavilion. The roof trusses are in very bad shape. It is not lack of maintenance but age contributing to the condition. L. Petusky, Supervisor, noted that vandalism is a problem and having a building without accessible trusses would be a major improvement. Because residents have expressed concern with the condition of the pavilion its replacement was chosen as the next project. Prodesign Plus was hired last meeting to draw up plans for submission. It was asked from the floor what type and size the new pavilion would be? The plan calls for a steel beam shelter of a similar size. Concerns of vandalism were raised. Council explained that a steel frame was chosen over a wooden structure to help eliminate problems with carving and painting vandalism. We will be loosing the COPSFAST grant in June 1998 and will have to find places to cut spending. Another unexpected cost is the bridge. Money will have to be budgeted in the event the grant application falls through. There is also a problem with funding demolition due to the possibility of a project on West Main Street. A special meeting was set for Monday, November 24, 1997 at 7:00 PM to plan and approve for advertising a budget. C. Marquardt noted that the meeting should also be for general purposes is case something else comes up in the meantime. Secretary was instructed to advertise as such.

Motion to adopt the 1998 budget as advertised. E. Labie told Council that this budget is very close. Appropriations are \$210,192 and expenditures are \$210,185. It will be up to the new council and the Mayor to watch spending next year. You should plan for a 10% carryover to avoid a tax anticipation note. Income estimating is a three (3) year average and you have no real idea of what will come in. Money was appropriated for a copy machine. He did not recommend running out the beginning of the year and purchasing a new one. Wait until the old one needs servicing. This budget has no tax increase due to the expected fees related to the sewerage treatment plant. He suggested that ways to save money be investigated. One big ticked item is health insurance. He suggested that alternative be checked. It is everybody's responsibility to watch spending.

J. Yackera stated that he had a comment about the budget that he would like to read. This concerns the Street committee and I would like to read a prepared statement. "When John Hinkle passed away several months ago, Lenny Petusky was hired as our new Borough supervisor. In the several months since he has assumed this position he has done an outstanding job of organizing and motivating our Borough street department. In light of how effective our street department has become I believe it is high time that this Council give them the wage increase that they not only earned but deserve. Presently Mr. Petusky earns \$7.00 an hour as the Borough supervisor. Mr. Beneshunas, who has been with the Borough twenty plus years earns \$6.86 an hour and Dean Hess who has been with the Borough six plus years earns \$5.63. How any one can live on these wages is beyond me. It was recommended to the finance committee that the Borough street department be given \$1.00 an hour increase across the board. The finance committee chair E. Labie drew up the budget and stated that the Borough would be hard pressed to give the street department a \$1.00 an hour increase. After completing the budget there was only \$7.00 left in surplus. In rebuttal of the above statement I would like to comment that Mary Ambrose our Secretary/Treasurer who is currently working 20 hours a week (at this point he asked if he was allowed to say what her wages are. He was informed by the secretary that it is public information) at a rate of \$7.50 an hour was recommended in the budget for an increase of hours to 30, a wage increase of \$0.32 to \$7.82 and a full medical benefit package worth \$4966.20. This equates to a raise of \$3.47 an hour at the 30 hour work week rate. Mr. Marquardt recommended the increase of hours to 30 because he could not see giving benefits to a part time employee working 20 hours a week. My opinion is this Borough should not be giving benefits to employees unless they are full time. I would recommend that Mrs. Ambrose's benefit package be dropped from the budget, with the \$4900 savings the Borough can give the Street department the raise they deserve at a cost of \$3910.40 and Mrs. Ambrose could receive a larger wage increase with the remainder or however Council wishes to do with the surplus. I would also like to close by telling Mr. Petusky and Mr. Hess who represent out Borough street department in the back of the room that if the budget passes tonight I will do everything I can to reopen the budget in January with the new Council and give you guys the raise you deserve. Thank you." (This text was taken verbatim off the tape recording of the meeting. A copy was not submitted for the record.)

C. Marquardt thanked J. Yackera for his statement. M.B. Dougherty asked why if he felt this way he voted for the tentative budget? J. Yackera answered that was his own wish. It was noted that J. Yackera arrived late for the budget meeting. R. Krick said that you were not there for any of the discussion concerning Mary. You missed the discussion that involved possibly sharing with the Sewer Authority. R. Krick said he could not speak for the Sewer Authority but they will be needing someone and probably quickly. There are no guarantees about sharing our Secretary with them but the possibility exists. These will be shared costs. How can you come out with a blanket statement without even being there? M.B. Dougherty noted the increase in hours was not suggested by C. Marquardt. It was noted that at the budget meeting M. Ambrose expressed no expectations of a benefits package and was more than willing to compromise. E. Labie said to J. Yackera that you came on Council four years ago when I did and we had a Secretary and Treasurer, both were part time and both got full benefits. Mary waived her benefits for four years because she had no need for them and saved this Borough thousands of dollars. R. Krick said that for the record M. Ambrose was offered the benefits when she was hired and waived them because she did not need them. At this point there was debate over attendance or lack thereof at meetings, both regular and otherwise. J. Yackera said he does not answer to the Council but to the voters and they reelected him. Both M.B Dougherty and R. Krick criticized the Democratic majority for having E. Labie do most of the budget work and then coming here and criticizing the budget that was submitted for adoption. J. Yackera said he was not criticizing E. Labie. He only has a problem with one part of the budget. E. Labie noted that the raise amounts submitted at the budget meeting were not \$1.00 across the board but \$1.50 to Dean, \$1.00 to Lenny and \$0.50 to Obbles. Wage increases this year are 5% not the customary 4%. R. Krick said that if you do not like the budget then vote against it. Debate insued over the issue of L. Petusky's raise. Motion to adopt the 1998 budget as submitted made by E. Labie. No second. E. Labie reminded Council that a budget has to be passed this year.

Mr. Kilker said the budget could be passed and amended. It should be discussed and modified in an orderly way. Council can either call a special meeting or be passed tonight. These questions should be openly discussed in a meeting.

E. Labie told Mr. Kilker that this budget is gone over one line at a time. It has been discussed at three (3) meetings before tonight. For the last four (4) years this is how the budget has been discussed.

After some debate the motion to pass the budget was seconded by J. Tinari. C. Marquardt asked for questions. None. Roll call vote followed:

By a four to two margin the tentative budget was defeated.

Marquardt said the finance committee will sit down again. R. Krick said he would like a copy of any amendments before the meeting. A Finance committee meeting will be scheduled and posted.

Motion to set the reorganization meeting for, Monday, January 5, 1998, at 7:00 PM and to advertise same made by J. Yackera, seconded J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Motion to set regular Council meetings for 1998 on the second Thursday of each month with the work sessions the preceding Tuesday and advertise same made by J. Yackera, seconded J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Motion to allow the Secretary/Treasurer to be paid as part of regular bi-weekly payroll effective January 1998 made by J. Yackera, seconded J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Motion to allow Prodesign Plus to advertise the bids for the East End Playground project made by J. Yackera, seconded J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

C. Marquardt thanked E. Ketusky, T. Shearn and E. Labie for their work on the Council. He appreciated working with all of them.

R. Krick also thanked Councilman E. Labie. He noted that he did not always agree with everything Ed may have said or done but that Ed always did what he thought was right which was very refreshing.

- T. Krick addressed a question to J. Yackera. She asked that now he had been reelected was he going to show up at meetings. J. Yackera responded by saying maybe, when I'm available.
- T. Krick then asked the solicitor is Council pay could be tied to attendance at meetings? Mr. Kilker said he was not sure but would check. R. Krick said he did not think so. M.B.

Dougherty said that the only mention in Borough code concerns being removed after missing two meetings.

Motion to adjourn made by J. Yackera, seconded J. Tinari. Vote. All. Motion carried.
