Mayor report: Read by Mayor J. Kelly. Motion to accept as read made by J. Tinari, seconded by J. Haluska. Vote. All. Motion carried.

C. Marquardt reminded everyone that the Regional Police meeting is scheduled for January 15th at 7:00 PM. J. Kelly is going to contact the State Police about the Crime watch. When a meeting is set it will be advertised.

E. Ketusky asked from the floor if all scheduled hearings were attended? He was told, yes, it is on the report but was not read.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

PP&L - The cost of a street light is \$130.00 per year. There are no up front charges if a pole is available. R. Krick said there should be a policy in place to deal with requests for street lights. You cannot just install street lights every time one is requested. C. Marquardt said a letter could be sent asking for a review of the current lighting and any suggestions for changes or additions from PP&L. Motion to send a letter requesting a review of the Borough's current street lighting made by R. Krick, seconded M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

PSAB - Hepatitis B shots are set to begin. The location is the Hamburg Municipal building.

EMA Plan - J. Yackera made some changes and it is being submitted to Council for approval. M.B. Dougherty said that is looking it over she noticed some incomplete areas. There are phone numbers missing and some incorrect addresses. Also, she stated that being in Harrisburg on a daily basis she did not think it suitable that she be appointed communications officer. R. Krick noted that his name and several other people's names appeared and he was not approached about participating. He wondered if everyone whose name is listed was asked? With the controversy over people being named without being approached J. Tinari recommended that the Emergency Management Plan be tabled.

It was noted that beginning in April there will be a \$2.00 per card per month service charge on the current gas cards. R. Krick noted that the savings in gas will pay the \$10.00. Part of the savings is that we are now tax exempt at the pump.

CORRESPONDENCE

County Solid Waste Mgmt. - W. Bowen requested list of haulers and annual tonnage, and yard waste figures. This is to be used in preparing the 1997 grant paperwork. The new flyers for recycling have arrived. Girardville is under consideration as a permanent site for the location of the recycling dumpsters.

Bureau of Audits - Letter concerning the Program audits the Borough had performed. This is to be given to J. Yackera to check if more needs to be done.

Representative T. Holden - Letter is support of our application for aid from the USDA for the Ogden Street bridge.

Schuylkill County Planning - C. Ross forwarded a copy of the County's twelve (12) year program schedule. Any comments or recommendations should be made by, January 21, 1998.

Treasurer's office - Copy of the newest Tax Collector's manual.

Various training seminars available to anyone interested.

Underground Storage Tank Insurance Fund - Information for School Building concerning premiums. The Borough's showed no charges.

Department of Education - Letter of approval for program audit.

It was questioned from the floor if the Borough is stuck with the franchise agreement made with Service Electric? R. Krick said he believes we are tied into Service Electric. The Solicitor said he thought that the contract could be broken.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

School: R. Krick said that the gym is out of oil again. We need to check into automatic delivery. Due to the recent dance he suggested a policy of no activity except athletics be allowed without Council permission. Requests should be made in writing, in advance for approval. Motion that it be required a letter be submitted to Council for approval for use of gym for anything other that Athletics made by R. Krick, seconded J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

L. Petusky suggested changing the outside fixture at the front door. Council gave permission to check into this possibility.

Finance: C. Marquardt informed Council that a request had been made to increase D. Hess's vacation from one (1) week to two (2) weeks. M.B. Dougherty suggested that a policy be set. C. Marquardt suggested that after five (5) years two (2) weeks vacation. After some discussion motion was made by M.B. Dougherty, seconded by J. Haluska that for full time employees policy be:

Ninety (90) days = one (1) week vacation

five (5) years = two (2) weeks vacation

This to be recorded by calendar year. Question? J. Kelly asked about employees here longer? That matter was table. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Regional Police: no report.

Recreation: M.B. Dougherty declined her appointment as chair of the recreation committee for this session of Council. She informed C. Marquardt she will remain on the committee. C. Marquardt asked if anyone else wished to chair the recreation committee?

R. Krick added that he would like to resign from the Street Committee. C. Marquardt tabled these requests until next meeting.

Streets: J. Tinari said that the handicapped parking spaces will be reviewed. Letters will be sent out as soon as possible.

Police: No report.

Recycling: C. Marquardt noted that the application for a trailer is currently in Harrisburg. C. Fritz recommended granting the application. Grants will be announced at a later date. J. Clayton asked about getting recycling containers for each household? She was told that because we do not use a recycling truck for pickup the containers are not practical.

OTHER BUSINESS

Blocked private sewer lines - Council is looking at a possible policy to help alleviate the problem of Borough workers spending time on lines blocked on private property. After discussion of the matter was tabled.

R. Krick suggested that the Finance committee meet to discuss short term investment of available funds in the General and Liquid Fuels accounts. Motion to review investment strategies and bring recommendations to Council within two months made by R. Krick, seconded J. Haluska. Question? M.B. Dougherty said the information should be available for review at the March meeting. Vote. All. Motion carried.

PUBLIC COMMENT

P. Kowalick, on behalf of Little League, asked who owned the property where the Little League field is located? Little League is looking into acquiring non-profit status and there are many questions that need to be answered. R. Krick told him that the Borough owns the bulk of the field. There are sections in use that belong to the various property owners along A Street. R. Krick suggested that the property could be deeded to the Little League Association with a condition that the property would revert back if it were no longer used by the Little League. The Rangers Hose Company building is held under a similar deed. Questions were raised about insurance coverage and where the responsibility falls. The Borough is responsible only if the activities are sanctioned. R. Krick suggested that Little League investigate insurance for non-players.

N. Flannery asked why when he called the police officer the officer did not show up? His complaint deals with cars being parked in such a way as to block access to garages. You cannot get the person to move the vehicles if no one answers the door. Mayor Kelly said he would check this matter with Officer Buriak and get back to Mr. Flannery.

E. Budraitis asked if Council could do anything about the building on East Mahanoy Avenue? C. Marquardt told her that a new health officer was just appointed this evening and that M. Brennan would contact her directly. Housing and Urban Development was contacted last year. They come when they can without any notice to local government. If they investigated last year no information was made available to us. Both C. Marquardt and the Mayor will check the complaint about 5 - 7 dogs in the house. R. Krick noted that you can begin action to condemn the building but the Borough does not have the resources to tear demolish.

Executive Session on personnel matters.

Reconvened. The matter is turned over to the Solicitor for action.

On the question asked about training for the Constable the solicitor informed F. McKeon that he does have to have the training and it is at his own expense. M.B. Dougherty said

she did not like to contradict but her information was that the training is only necessary if the Constable is going to serve papers. F. McKeon said he is not planning on serving papers and will pass on the training.

Motion to adjourn made by J. Tinari, seconded J. Haluska. Vote. All. Motion carried.

OPEN MEETING

Meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Council President C. Marquardt.

ROLL CALL

Members present: M.B. Dougherty, J. Haluska, R. Krick, C. Marquardt, J. Tinari, J. Yackera. Mayor J. Kelly, Solicitor J. Kilker.

PUBLIC COMMENT

J. Clayton asked what Council's take is concerning the police officer? J. Kilker said that Council is going to go into Executive session to discuss this matter and would make any announcements at that time.

M. Mervine informed Council that Officer T. Buriak had a vehicle towed from her property without prior notice as required by Borough ordinance. This vehicle was towed at 12:30 AM and when she noticed it was gone she reported it stolen. There are other vehicles in the same area, without licenses that are still sitting. Mervine told Council that if properly notified the car would have been moved. She asked that the vehicle be brought back as it was towed illegally. Mayor Kelly said that the car had no current license or inspection sticker. Also the vehicle was parked within the right of way in front of an abandoned house. Mervine said she had just purchased the car and had not yet had the title changed. R. Krick asked if B. Ellison, the registered owner, received notice? He was told by Mervine that no letters were received. Mayor Kelly said that Officer Buriak was acting on a complaint. C. Marquardt said that after the meeting the Police committee will check out this complaint.

T. Niedzwiecki asked if any decision had been reached concerning a donation to the North Schuylkill Soccer Association? A request was submitted at budget time. C. Marquardt said that he would check. Niedzwiecki asked if it would be possible to use the gym for a fund raiser. The soccer parents want to play the WNEP-TV 16 Instabuckets in a

basketball game. R. Krick said that there is not a lot of seating in the gym. Niedzwiecki said that anything is better than nothing. Motion to allow North Schuylkill Soccer Association to use the gym for a fund-raiser basketball game made by J. Haluska, seconded J. Tinari. Question? R. Krick asked that they clean up afterwards. Vote. All. Motion carried.

- T. Niedzwiecki noted that there has been an increase in vandalism and garbage being dumped at the bank, arcade and the William Street bridge. Mayor Kelly said he would look into this with the Officer. He knows that the arcade is posted. M. Brennan said that does not stop the kids from tearing the siding off the building and ripping up the sidewalk. Also, skateboarding at the bank is again a daily thing. Mayor Kelly said he has some ideas to bring up and will go into this later in the meeting.
- M. Brennan asked who investigates situations concerning fire damaged properties, the fire chief or health officer? Mr. Kilker said that she, as health officer, can inquire and report findings to the Mayor. You can indicate to owners that they will be cited if the problem is not remedied.
- E. Budraitis asked about the property on East Mahanoy Avenue. M. Brennan said that the owner was contacted and the garbage should have all been removed. If there is another problem a letter will be sent.
- V. Ambrose asked if Council could request that the speed limit on Main Street be reduced. The current speed is 35 MPH but VASCAR allows for + 10 MPH meaning traffic can travel at 45 MPH before being cited for speeding. This is a danger especially with the number of children who live on Main Street. C. Marquardt said that Council will send a letter to PADOT requesting a speed limit survey.
- J. Clayton asked if there was any action on the PP&L street light survey? C. Marquardt said that we are still waiting for an answer from PP&L. No street requests will considered until the survey is done.

APPROVAL OF REPORTS

Minutes: Motion to accept both the regular meeting and special meeting minutes as submitted made by J. Tinari, seconded by J. Haluska. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report: Motion to accept the report as read made by J. Yackera, seconded by J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Tax Collector's report: Motion to accept as submitted and to pay the tax collector made by J. Yackera, seconded by J. Haluska. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Permit Officer's report: Motion to accept as submitted made by J. Yackera, seconded by J. Tinari. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Health Officer report: Read by C. Marquardt. Motion to accept as read made by J. Yackera, seconded by J. Tinari. Question? No

Mayor's Report: Read by Mayor Kelly. Motion to accept as read by made by J. Tinari, seconded J. Haluska. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried. The Mayor noted that the Regional Police meeting scheduled for, February 19, 1998, will be the last if there is no commitment. In conjunction with the Girl Scouts and the Sheriff's department, fingerprinting for Borough children will be held on, March 21, 1998, from 10:00 AM to 12:00 PM. Flyers will be posted.

Mayor Kelly said that he wants to set up a meeting with the kids in town to get some input. He wants to work with them to attempt to solve some of the problems. A date has been set for, March 31, 1998, at 6:00 PM for kids ages 8 through 16. This will be posted. T. Krick asked what kinds of ideas the Mayor has in mind? Several months ago there was a similar meeting with no results. Mayor Kelly said that he was not here then and is doing this in hopes of working out something. J. Clayton thought this was a good idea. She asked if perhaps something could be arranged to have some in to speak with the kids. Right now there is not a lot of confidence in the police officers. Mayor Kelly said he would consider that suggestion.

R. Krick asked if the Regional Police Committee is looking for a commitment now or after this scheduled meeting? C. Marquardt read the letter and thought that it really was not clear. Girardville has already gone on record as being interested in continuing with the study. Mahanoy City just voted to drop out and so have several other communities.

J. Yackera said that Mahanoy City cited cost overruns and cut in protections as their reasons for withdrawal. R. Krick said that each municipality has to access their own needs.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Code Of Conduct - Tabled.

Emergency Management Plan - J. Yackera contacted Art Kaplan and was told that any names on the plan were there permanently. If you wish your name removed submit a written request. This plan can be submitted for approval every two year with no changes. It can be accepted now as is and Council can still make any changes for the next two years. Motion to accept the EMA plan as submitted made by J. Yackera, seconded J. Tinari. Question? M.B. Dougherty asked if there were any changes? If she had known that a letter was required to have her name removed it would have been here tonight. She thought that any future practice should not be simply to remove anyone who died or moved but to notify all people and give them the chance to withdraw if they wish.

C. Marquardt said that the plan is in the office and available. If your name is in the plan and you wish to be removed just send a letter to the Council. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Sewer Policy - At the work session Council hammered out a policy which is on file. Policy will be that residents should try to open blocked lines themselves. If a plumber is contacted the expense is the residents. Borough workers will not go on private property unless the main sewer line is located within the boundaries. This policy is subject to change or addition. Motion to adopt the Sewer Policy as submitted made by J. Tinari, seconded J. Yackera. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

DCNR playground grant - Paperwork for advance payment received. This is optional and drawdown would only be for advertising and administrative costs incurred so far. Motion to submit for advance payment made by R. Krick, seconded J. Haluska. Ouestion? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

With the advance requested it will be necessary to open a separate account for any funds received for this project. Motion to allow the secretary to open an account for the DCNR grant funds made by R. Krick, seconded M.B. Dougherty. Question? None. Vote. All. Motion carried.

Ogden Street Bridge - Report from Entech read by C. Marquardt. Acceptance of both the Entech proposal and the funding from PADOT are tabled pending outcome of the grant application from the Rural Utility Services department of the US Department of Agriculture.

R. Krick said that he thinks it necessary that Council thank Representative Timothy Holden for his support in obtain RUS funding. C. Marquardt agreed and suggested sending letters to Holden, Rhoades and Lucyk.

NEW BUSINESS

At this point C. Marquardt turned the meeting over to Attorney Elwood to act as Council's council in the matter of setting Sgt. Michael Hummel's hearing date. Attorney J. Kilker left the Council table to act as prosecutor.

Mr. Kilker submitted a letter dated today listing the reasons for his request. Mr. Elwood asked Mr. Moyer if he had opportunity to review the letter? Mr. Moyer replied that he Mr. Kilker asked that Council consider his request to postpone or continue the employment hearing requested by Attorney Moyer on behalf of Sgt. Michael Hummel. Mr. Elwood asked if more time was needed to review this letter before proceeding? Mr. received a fax at 4:44 PM just before leaving his office to attend this meeting.

Mr. Kilker said that the hearing was originally set within the ten (10) days when a letter was received from Mr. Moyer asking for a reasonable continuance of the hearing. If this hearing is scheduled after the Magistrate's hearing there may be some of the alleged charges which are no sustained. Code does allow the hearing to be postponed for good cause. The D.A.'s office sent a letter stating they would prefer that we wait. Waiting until after the preliminary hearing might be beneficial to all. A transcript of the hearing can be made available to Council. Any charges not bound over will not have to be dealt with

Under the Tenure Act a letter was directed to Mr. Moyer stating that a public employer has the right to interview a public employee about questions related to his employment. Mr. Kilker said he has not had the opportunity to do this and would like to do so. This would give M. Hummel the chance to tell his side of the story to Mr. Kilker and Mayor Kellv.

Mr. Elwood asked if there is any legal authority that witnesses should not be asked to testify at separate proceedings? Mr. Kilker said no. Mr. Elwood asked do you have any legal authority that a hearing on his suspension should wait until after the preliminary hearing? Mr. Kilker said no. He cited the Tenure Act stating it may be postponed for good cause. Mr. Elwood noted that the letter cited security problems in having the hearing at the Municipal building. Mr. Kilker said that there is always a room available in the court house with the security of the metal detectors and other protections. Concern with getting the young witnesses in and out of the hearing with minimal contact could be better arranged at the Court House. Mr. Elwood asked if any members of Council had any questions for Mr. Kilker. There were none.

Mr. Moyer gave copies of related correspondence to Mr. Elwood

- Suspension notice from Mayor Kelly to M. Hummel dated February 6, 1998.
- 2. Letter from J. Kilker setting the hearing within the ten (10) days dated February 13, 1998.
- Letter to Mr. Kilker dated, February 13, 1998, indicating that a public hearing would be required.
- 4. Letter to Mr. Kilker questioning the date of March 16, 1998. This is the date in dispute. Mr. Kilker says that no one from him office contacted anyone about this date being open for the rescheduled hearing.

In all fairness the request to continue the hearing scheduled for, February 23, 1998, was to the benefit of both parties. It was requested that the continuance be reasonable not an indefinite postponement. We are now ready to proceed. The ages of the witness should not be a factor as it will not change any time soon. As to the security problems there is no objection to going to the court house. Wants the hearing promptly.

Mr. Elwood said that he takes that Mr. Elwood would not be agreeable to having the transcripts of the preliminary hearing being given to the Council in lieu of testimony.

Mr. Moyer questioned the legality of this action.

Mr. Elwood asked Mr. Moyer if he had any legal authority that when the initial hearing is continued at your request that you may demand a hearing within ten (10) days of whichever date you choose? Mr. Moyer said no.

R. Krick asked if Mr. Moyer were the prosecutor would he be in favor of having this hearing before the preliminary hearing? Mr. Moyer answered that the truth will set us free. Witnesses can tell a story several times if they are telling the truth.

Hummel speak with both himself and the Mayor. Will subpoena him if necessary. Mr. Moyer said that his client will be at the hearing. He will not submit to an interview with the Borough solicitor and Mayor due to criminal charges pending against him. Anything he said could be used against him. Yackera said that as Chairman of the Police committee he has no police powers. If J. Yagielinski has problems or complaints he can go to the State Police or the local magistrate and file charges.

Meeting opened with the Pledge of Allegiance led by Council President C. Marquardt. Meeting started late due to having to wait to obtain a quorum.

J. Yagielniskie asked for and received permission to record any matters that concerned him directly.

Floor given to Mr. Mike Fiorillo from Curran Law Firm, representing Ideal Construction Company. Also present was Mr. E. Shoner as an environmental consultant. Mr. Fiorillo's presentation concerned the proposed demolition landfill in Union Township. DEP application has been filed for this landfill. The proposal is to back fill with material on site, fill the pit with demolition debris and when the pit is filled to cover with material from the site. Union Township will receive \$1.00 per ton and a proposal will go before the County that they will receive \$1.00 per ton royalty. This site is to have an inspector, employed by Union Township to check each load before it is pushed into the pit. Sheriff Francis McAndrew, Raven Run, asked for and was given permission to direct questions to Mr. Fiorillo. There were questions from the floor about the impact such a landfill would have not only on Girardville but on the surrounding communities. The amount of daily truck traffic was put at 95 trucks. There were questions about the local route to be taken and the ability of the existing roads to sustain this amount of heavy traffic. Assurance of a specific route for this traffic was questioned. There is no legal remedy to restrict properly licensed vehicles from traveling whatever route they choose. Questions about the proximity to local watersheds were also raised. Mr. Fiorillo had no specific answers to questions concerning distances from the pit to watersheds. Brought up were, Roaring Creek, Shenandoah area, Ringtown areas. Questions about ground water pollution

specifically for Ringtown were also not addressed. On the whole residents present were not pleased with the answers Mr. Fiorillo supplied to the questions asked. J. Clayton noted that the gentleman came here expecting no resistance. M. Yesalavage asked who would be responsible for any resulting pollution? R. Krick asked who is the "owner". Girard Estate will contend they have no responsibility. E. Shoner noted that the operator would be responsible. Mr. Fiorillo noted that if anyone had other questions that he would be available. Mr. McAndrew informed Council that a group has been organized to fight this landfill. It was requested that Council go on record as opposing this landfill. Council decided not to vote on the matter tonight. This would be taken under consideration at the next work session.

PUBLIC COMMENT

M. Yesalavage asked if the are paying Union Township can't the Borough be paid? R. Krick said that only the host municipality and the County will benefit financially from this landfill. If you are sitting in Union Township it is easy to sell out for \$750,000. The impact from this will be felt more on this side than in Union Township.

M. Ritro asked for a ruling on "No Parking" signs placed on garage doors. My neighbor has one up but if I put one up he screams. J. Kilker said that if garage doors are posted then no one can park in front. J. Yagielniske said that most of the residents on the block have No Parking signs on the garage doors. J. Yagielniskie noted that even without signs you should not block a garage. This raised the question about access with gates to a carport. C. Marquardt said he would check this matter. If you wish to build a carport you need a county and borough permit.

J. Smolock asked what happened to his request for a street light in front of his home on East Main Street. C. Marquardt informed him that the motion to install a street light never got off the floor. J. Smolock said he has a problem with people driving on his front lawn and has had to put telephone poles on the ground. This is a safety issue. C. Hummel case be specific but that Council wait the outcome of the criminal case before requiring the solicitor to submit anything in writing. J. Kilker noted that the court date would probably be sometime in November. R. Krick asked if an appeal concerning the firing has been filed? J. Kilker said nothing was filed to his knowledge.

Agenda - J. Kilker suggested that Council have a procedure for getting things on the agenda in advance. There have been occasions when questions are asked which with a little preparation could be answered immediately. Sometimes residents may feel they are being put off but some questions require research before an answer can be given. There could be a time limit for the floor and an allowance for rebuttal. This would allow exceptions for emergency matters. R. Krick noted that the floor should be open at every meeting and anyone who has anything to say should have the opportunity. You should not have to be on the agenda to speak at a public meeting.

Documents - It was suggested that Council look at setting up procedures for access public documents. There were two examples given as to how other municipalities handle requests. Cost and convenience should be taken into consideration. J. Kilker proposed that council set up procedure for requests. It is reasonable to take a few days to have certain records available. It should not be necessary to drop important Borough business to handle information requests immediately. This matter was tabled for review at the next work session.

The Borough should only expend money for an engineer if required to file for funding. We should go after the property owners. C. Marquardt said there was an article recently in the Standard Speaker concerning the County's application for demolitition funding. R. Krick said that it does not matter because we still have to match half. J. Yackera said that Council should consider sending the Code Enforcement Officer for schooling. J. Kilker said that the old Strong building has hugh cracks and looks like it could cave in at any time. R. Krick said take pictures and show the Commissioners. Even if the County is holding any property for taxes they do not own it. It is held only in lien for back taxes.

Yackera noted this would eliminate a lot of liability. It is worth looking into. He said that he would set up a meeting with Butler Township and see if they are interested.

Council went into Executive Session at this time.

Council reconvened.

Council discussed the matter of D. Elision's shed and the possibility of making the back section of the 100 block of West Ogden Street a public alley. The solicitor explained to Council the options they had in dealing with this situation. Upon recommendation of the solicitor motion to admit transcript of the testimony of the public hearing as part of the official record made by J. Yackera, seconded J. Tinari. Question? J. Kilker noted that the map submitted should be added and the incorrectly spelled names should be corrected. He will take care of contacting the stenographer and have the necessary changes made. Vote. All. Motion carried. This is made a part of official record which will allow Council to act on this at a later date. R. Krick noted that more exact measurements should be taken of the area to determine how wide and how long any proposed alley should be taken of that any street adopted using the 21 year usage, the dimensions would be based upon what was used as access. Kilker told Council that what was sent to Mike Arden was a copy of the original plan, a copy of Attny. Watkin's letter and a copy of the additional plan.
