Apparently we are entering 2014 with a deficit and we are looking for answers. E. Burns said that an Officer was backing into the garage when the extinguisher went off. He jumped out as fast as he could to do what he had to do. The fire

extinguisher was never taken to a professional. J. Catizone said it was a borough extinguisher that was put in the back of the car. I guess from moving around the pin came out. M.B. Dougherty said it was an accident. J. Catizone said from what he understood, yes, it was an accident.

### ROLL CALL

Charles Marquardt introduced Mr. Frank Shiffer, Schuylkill Community Action and Mr. Champ Holman, Deputy Secretary, DCED.

First Mr. Holman spoke, congratulating this council and thanking them on behalf of the Governor or Pennsylvania on continuing this project. You began several years ago with the help of Senator Rhoades to rid our communities of blight. The program began with knocking down a block of houses in the borough, replacing them with three new family homes. We have built several homes in this community as well as Shenandoah and Mahanoy City, Pottsville and continue in Girardville This is a program you can be proud of which helps your community. From the Departments point of view, after tonight, is to see if we can add approximately \$500,000 to one million dollars to the grant towards the program with the help of Schuylkill Community Action. Again I wanted to congratulate you and thank you for your participation in this program and to thank the borough residents for their support of this program. At this time he introduced Frank Shiffer.

Then Mr. Frank Shiffer spoke about the project in detail. There are attachments to the minutes regarding this project. They are detailed pictures and dimensions.

# 'WEST MAIN STREET, GIRARDVILLE' RENTAL DEVELOPMENT PROJECT

Throughout the years SCA has developed several community revitalization initiatives in partnership with the County of Schuylkill, the Schuylkill County Redevelopment Authority, and the Borough of Girardville to eliminate abandoned/

blighted structures while providing safe, decent, and affordable homeownership and rental opportunities.

SCA would like to continue investment on the main thoroughfare in the Borough of Girardville by continuing community revitalization efforts to eliminate blight. The 'West Main Street, Girardville' project is located in the center of town on Route 547 Main Street. Schuylkill Community Action began community revitalization efforts in the Borough in 2008 with the Schuylkill Community Revitalization Initiative (SCRI). Four vacant and deteriorated commercial buildings were acquired and razed. Three new constructions, single-family homes were built and sold to low-to-moderate income families. In 2009, Schuylkill Community Action participated in the Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) and acquired an additional three vacant and deteriorated commercial buildings. In their place, two new constructions, single-family homes and a three-unit, townhouse-style, rental building was constructed. In partnership with the Borough of Girardville and the County of Schuylkill in the SCRI and NSP programming, SCA acquired seven (7) blighted parcels; demolished seven (7) vacant and deteriorated commercial buildings; constructed and sold five (5) homeownership projects; and completed a new construction rental development project serving three (3) very-low income households. Schuylkill Community Action has administered and invested over \$1.7 million of public funding into the community revitalization programming in the Borough since 2008. Public funding to support the community revitalization initiatives included HOME, HRA, LGMRDP, HOPE 3 Rollover, NSP, CDBG, Act 137, and Program Income.

Approval of funding will enable the Borough of Girardville, County of Schuylkill, and Schuylkill Community Action to continue community revitalization efforts within the Borough. Approval of grant requests will support the reclamation of eight (8) blighted parcels through demolition of deteriorated commercial structures (2) and residential garages (2). Acquisition is complete for the project as the Borough of Girardville has acquired all eight (8) parcels. SCA is proposing the new construction of six (6) affordable townhouse-style rental units including two ground floor apartments that will benefit persons with a disability. Total Program costs are estimated at \$1.2 million.

The 'West Main Street' project will be highly leveraged with public, local and private monies. SCA submitted a Keystone Communities Program grant in the amount of \$500,000 on January 17, 2014. SCA is in the process of developing a federal *HOME* Program application to support the project. It is anticipated that submission of the Request for Proposal for *HOME* funding will be submitted shortly after this Public Meeting.

Schuylkill Community Action has fully committed \$106,736.58 of Program Income from a recent Local Government Municipal Resources and Development Grant (Contract #C000020757). SCA has been given approval by PA DCED and the Redevelopment Authority of the County of Schuylkill to retain and reinvest the Program Income in an effort to continue community revitalization and development of affordable housing projects. This Program Income was derived from the sale of several

homeownership projects that were primarily funded by the Local Government Municipal Resources and Development Grant.

The 'West Main Street' project has been approved for participation in the Schuylkill County Demolition Program. Primarily funded with Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds through the Schuylkill County entitlement, the County Demolition Program will provide seventy-five percent (75%) of the cost of demolition. The cost of demolition has been estimated at \$80,000 which computes to a \$60,000 investment of CDBG funds by the County of Schuylkill to complete the demolition activity.

The Borough of Girardville intends to apply for Affordable Housing Trust Funds (Act 137) to support the project. It is anticipated that the Borough will apply for \$40,000 in Act 137 funds during the 2014 funding round. The 2014 funding announcement will be made in July 2014.

The proposed 'West Main Street' project will provide great 'Impact' to the affected neighborhood and the municipality at-large. The current site of the proposed Girardville project has been a major blight on the main thoroughfare of the Borough for several years. The proposed Girardville project consists of eight (8) adjoining parcels (106-118 West Main Street) where a fire destroyed five (5) homes in February 2011. The Borough has completed acquisition of the eight (8) parcels and has been approved as a participant in the Schuylkill County Demolition Program whereby the remaining structures will be razed. The Borough will be transferring ownership of the parcels to SCA to develop a six-unit townhouse-style building for lower-income individual and families.

The 'West Main Street' project occurs on the coattails of several community revitalization efforts in the Borough of Girardville administered by Schuylkill Community Action and Upper Schuylkill, Inc. Girardville PRIDE (Partners for Revitalization with Interest in Downtown Expansion) was formally incorporated in 2004 and was a member of Upper Schuylkill, Inc., a PA State designated Regional Main Street Program. This grassroots organization structured itself according to the Four-Point Main Street Approach. Girardville PRIDE is a stellar example of a determined and adaptable community-based non-profit group fighting to organize and bring about active community advocacy efforts to positively affect change in its local community. Girardville PRIDE'S foremost priority was the creation of a healthy downtown. Some of the accomplishments of Girardville Pride were a facade improvement program; a business recruitment and retention program; and downtown beautification including trash receptacles, flower planters, and planting of trees within the sidewalks.








It has been vacant for over a year, was condemned by Council, the weeds are over six feet tall, the bug traps are full, there are dead cats and garbage on all four floors and the roof in leaking causing damage and the water was actually running. The house is up for taxes and you can fine them all you want, there is nothing going to be done by the owner. He said that something has to be done about the blight which is all over this town.

E. Burns said that Council will act on this matter. He did not know what it would be but it would be something. We would have to go through the steps with the Quality of Life. R. Miller will start of this tomorrow and that will allow us to clean up the yard.

On the same note, the property at 227 E Mahanoy Avenue is scheduled for demolition, with the County and the contractor will be in at some point.

C. Marquardt said that the County program is available but the Borough must pay 25% of the total cost of demolition. We have a list of properties in town and it grows every day.

R Krick, 1 West Main Street – Formerly complained about the house on the corner of Line Street and Preston Avenue that is about to collapse and it will probably go through my garage. My only recourse will be to go after the homeowner, it was recently transferred. R. Miller said he sent them a letter on June 26, 2014 and posted the building. There has been no response as of this date. M.B. Dougherty stated that she had some information, including criminal records from Mahanoy City Code Enforcement. They searched the Department of State. You may want to check with other municipalities when it comes to these corporations. R. Krick then said that the Borough's position is

C. Riedlinger also reported that the tax assessment hearings were held for the eight properties on West Main Street which we are to hold until such time as they can be turned over to Schuylkill Community Action. These properties are now tax exempt.

## PUBLIC COMMENT

J. Engle - 27 West Ogden Street - She noted that the neighbors appreciate the Mayor and Code Enforcement Officers coming down and checking out the houses on our street. They wanted to know the status and if they found any of the people. E. Burns said that there were a few cited and they are going through the court system. The one had a blocked sewer, which was taken care of.

Mary Beth Dougherty 355 West Main Street - in a follow up question asked about Cherbies property falling practically into the creek. C. Marquardt asked J. Wilson to respond. J. Wilson replied that with the waterways there DEP was involved and taking care of the paperwork. M.B. Dougherty asked who gave that information. E. Burns said that we met with DEP, he could not recall exactly when. They said that because it was a waterway, they were involved and we have not heard from them since. M.B. Dougherty said that she spoke with DEP on Monday and was told that the only involvement they would have would be to permit the Borough into the waterway to alleviate the problem. The only thing that they would do is to waive the permitting requirement if anything should fall into the water. But as far as them fixing it up or being involved, do not buffalo people into thinking that DEP is coming in to fix the problem. So you might want to add it to the list because it belongs to us and not to the State.

E. Labie asked who owns the property. She was told that it is a woman who lived in West Mahanoy Township. Now we will have to have J. Wilson file follow through with the citations and possibly notice G. Bender that we have another demolition project.

M.B. Dougherty asked why doesn't the Borough file against the landlord for all these properties who are violating the occupancy ordinance. J. Wilson said that he has caught a few. He was asked why citations are not filed when they are already in violation of the ordinance. It do not matter that the properties get inspected when they are caught. Why aren't we getting hardnosed with these properties? We have an ordinance in place, use it. These landlords do not care about the town and the town looks like crap. You need to



play hardball with these people. C. Marquardt asked J. Wilson to look into this and give us a report.

J. Kerrigan asked if the Borough was doing anything about 627 East Mahanoy Avenue. The garage in the back is about to collapse, the back of the house has already collapsed, it is dangerous. It has been reported, they have been up and nothing has been done. J. Wilson said that the owner is Deed R Us LLC that is in Nevada and that is the only information we can get. C. Marquardt said that we would look into this.

V. Karavage - West Main Street - complained about the Jones property in the 200 block of West Main Street. The roof is falling in, there are weeds and a tree growing on the sidewalk, the back yard is a jungle. He asked if anyone had look at the place. C. Marquardt said that the person on the deed is deceased and we are looking for a living relative. C. Riedlinger advised that the Borough could go to the Register of Wills and check if there is someone involved. He is just asking that you keep an eye on the property as it will be in the street before long.

J. Dunkle - owner of several rental properties -1 had made several complaints to code enforcement back in August and September 2013. Again last month I sent a letter to the Mayor, Code Enforcement and Council President and to this date, 14 months later, I have received no communications regarding enforcement. J. Wilson has told me there are dozens of complaints against these people; he has been there numerous times. There is more garbage and rubbish in the yard and now there is another abandoned vehicle that was added to the one already in the yard. I get told that you will shut my building down and kick my tenants out because there is a problem with outlets but my neighbor has trash in the yard and rodents running around and the only thing that happened in the last 2 months was to put a black tarp over it. I put \$15,000 into my property and am trying to keep up on them and I am getting nowhere. The property in question is 114 East Main Street. J. Wilson said he gave him a month. J. Dunkle said you gave him a month last year. How many warnings do these people get?

A. Gregis - West Main Street - came to the meeting because he has been hearing that the Borough doesn't have a pot to piss in and I was wondering if this means another tax increase. R. Miller said that at this point in time we are not sure the budget is not done yet. We went into the year \$23,000 in debt. Over the course of the year we have done some things that resulted in savings of about \$7000 on benefits and the telephone. In January we will see another \$13,000 savings on benefits. At the most, a tax increase will be only one mil. R. Krick asked what the projected deficit is going into January. R. Miller replied about \$20,000. We came into the year \$23,000 in debt. He then outlined expenses that were not budgeted or under budgeted. We started this year \$43,000 in debt. M.B. Dougherty asked why then did you spend additional money when you knew about being so far in debt. A new cop car, you gave an unbudgeted raise to M. Soucheck, no disrespect intended, of \$1.00 an hour back in the spring, went out and hired per diem employees that were not budgeted but if they are not budgeted you are paying two people. In all fairness, you did start out with a deficit. But, three of the five

people sitting on Council were members of last year's Council so how you can say you didn't know, I don't understand. She asked how much was this year's Tax Anticipation Note? She was told \$50,000. She asked how much was budgeted. She was told \$40,000. This resulted in your going \$10,000 in debt. I recall coming to the March meeting and saying that you were in trouble then. Why didn't you realize it? R. Miller said that we don't get the same information you get. M. B. Dougherty said it is in the treasurer's report. R. Miller asked whose idea it was to give health insurance to borough employees and their spouses. M.B. Dougherty said that it was to get people to work here because the salaries are not the greatest. Then the school building was discussed in back and forth detail.

Paul Kowalick gave a check from the AOH for the patch work that was done on the 300 block of West Oak Street. C. Marquardt noted that they offered to fill some of the potholes on Oak Street and Beech Street. Then he addresses the school building. R. Krick was a proponent of recreation. And he noted that it is a big expense. He outlined the improvements that were made to the gym. He talked about the fact that they are losing children. He outlined their expenditures. He knows that things are bad but GBA is doing their best to donate to the borough.

M Haley - 135 West Main Street- complained about B. Adams properties once again. Nothing is ever done. Also, the property on the other side of her home that had an oil leak was and is a problem. She stated that she had called DEP, the Borough did nothing. J. Wilson said that if everyone wants him to cite people he will.

Marquardt said that there will be a meeting next week to discuss all the properties everyone complained about. There were 14 citations sent out.

M.B. Dougherty asked if we bought heating oil and salt yet. She was told that we have salt on hand and will order it when then supply starts to go down. As for oil, the tanks are full now so we are waiting to see.

It was asked from the floor what the cubicles were for? C. Marquardt said that the one cubical is for J Wilson for code enforcement and the other one is undecided as of now.

Mr. Martin -East Main Street - asked what keeps us coming together as a community and cleaning some of these properties up. C. Marquardt said that we cannot go on properties. Anyone who wants to come forward and assist with code enforcement is more than welcome. It requires some training. A meeting can be posted.

E. Labie asked residents who are interested, PRIDE still exists but we could use new members. The meeting is the last Monday of the month.

D. O'Connell and M. O'Connell both said that it is obvious what properties need to be looked and why should they clean up other people's property when there is enough to do with their own. The problem is the slumlords. Fines need to be issued.



M. Zangari - C Street - said that perhaps the Borough could look into a cleanup similar to the one done by North Schuylkill High School. Every year students are asked to turn in volunteer sheets to graduate. There are a lot of kids who have no volunteer opportunities. The Borough could have an announcement made that they are having a cleanup day, with the date and time.

R. Kuzma noted that she has pride in town. She buys flowers and plants them in the park on Main Street and will continue to do so as long as her health is good.

There was then some discussion of LLC's and citing corporations which raised more questions than answers.
